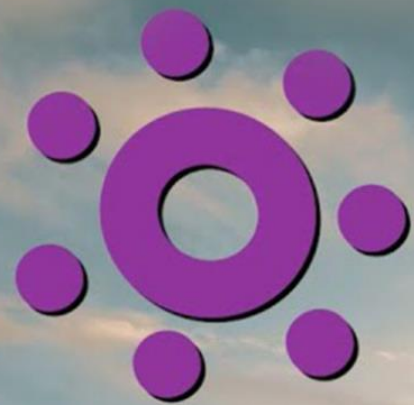

HISTORY

of the Rotary Club of Central Butuan

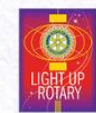
