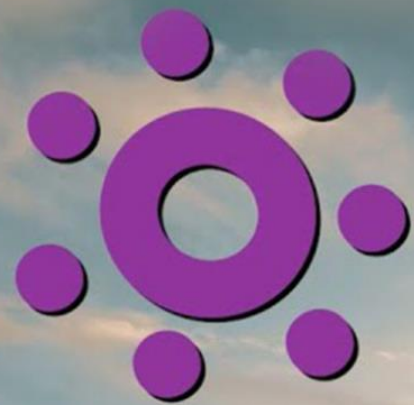

HISTORY

of the Rotary Club of Central Butuan

Our existence as a new club is rather swift but long in preparation, expeditious but not impulsive. Lawan-lawan, Las Nieves, Agusan del Norte, 2022



Access to clean water is essential. Much efforts and resources have been exhausted by the local government of Agusan del Norte to ensure that clean water is available for its people, but the accessibility of this precious resource seems to be impossible for the people of Sitio 22, Brgy. Lawan-Lawan, Las Nieves, Agusan del Norte. The subject Sitio is among the communities of Agusan del Norte where one can find mothers and children hustle their way every day for clean drinking water from a distant source area which is more than a kilometer away from their households. The Rotary has been committed to one of its Areas of Focus System which is to provide water, sanitation, and hygiene to deserving communities. After series of discussions, analysis, and feasibility study, the Rotary Club of Central Butuan, headed by Imaginative President Ton Madayag - through the initiative of Rotarian Jame Hermosada and the expertise of PE Engr. Ryan Pulleros and Rotarian Engr. Noel Ajoc - had put together a water supply project that will provide daily water to over 110 families. The "Agos ng Pag-asa: A Water System Project" was finally turned over in partnership with Travellers Insurance Company and Timber City Eagles Club, with the help of the Rotaractors and spouses. It has been a meaningful day as all of the people had celebrated this success of establishing safe and accessible water for the said community. As the Sitio Chairman emphasized in his speech "Dugay na namo ni gi ampo" truly, this project of is an answered prayer for the people in Sitio 22 and will surely create a lasting impact to their lives.

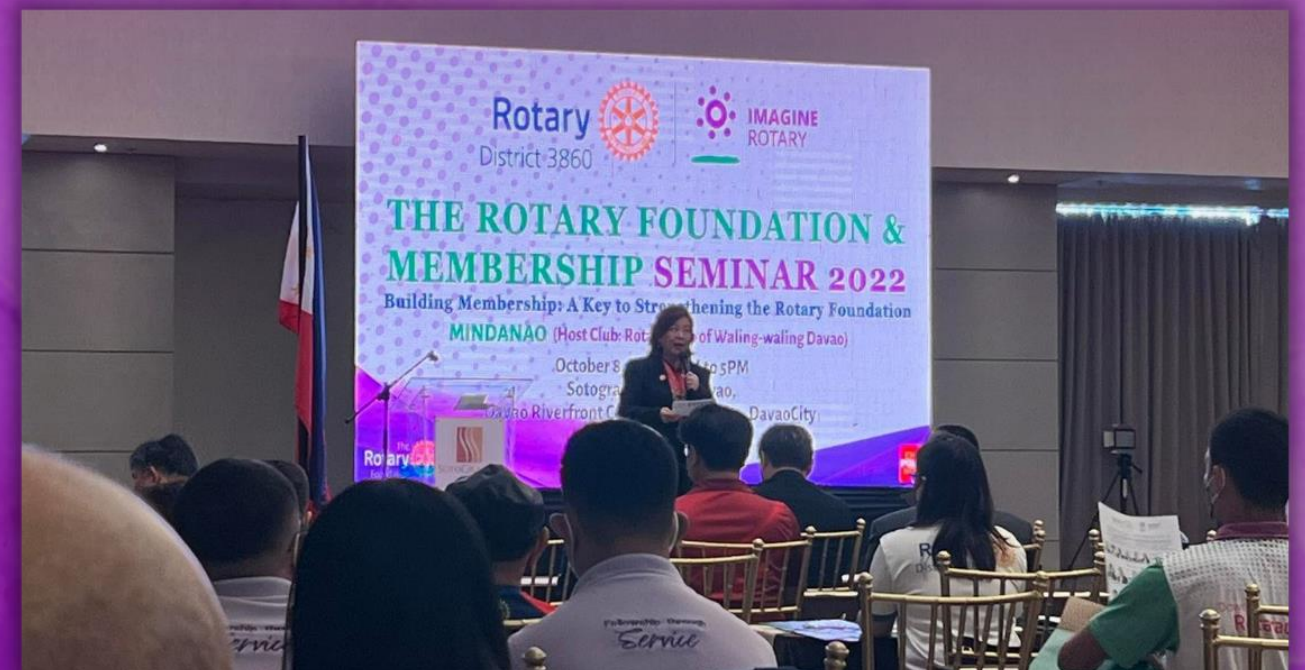

Signing of Club Sisterhood Agreement with Rotary Club of Makati Poblacion

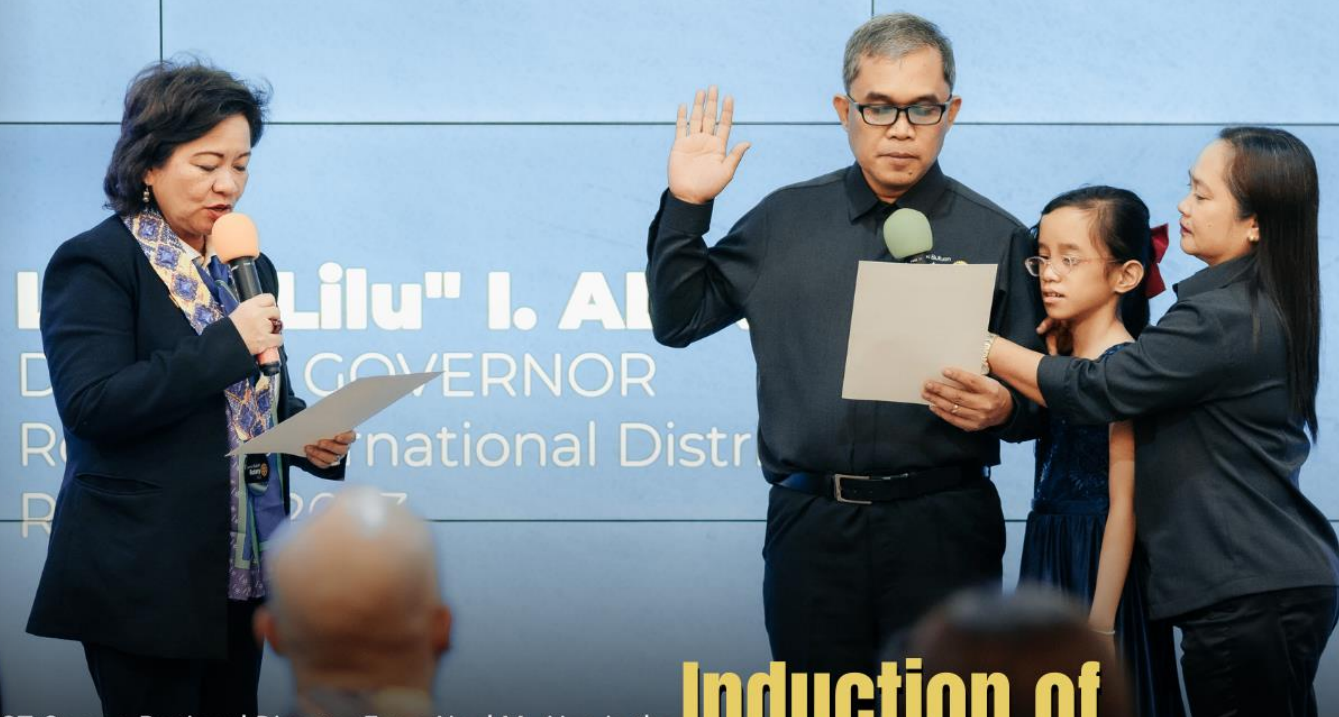

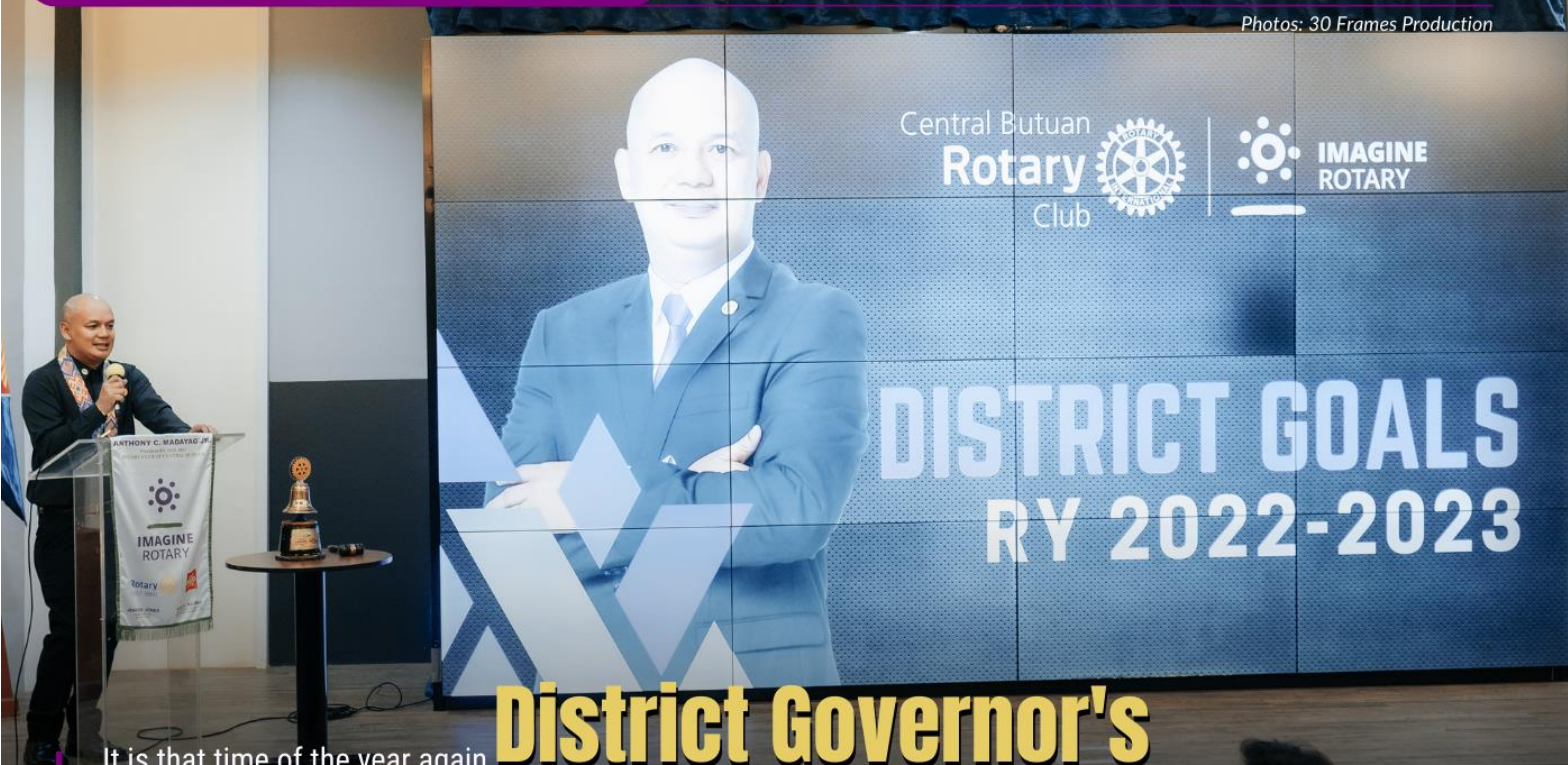
Induction of New Member

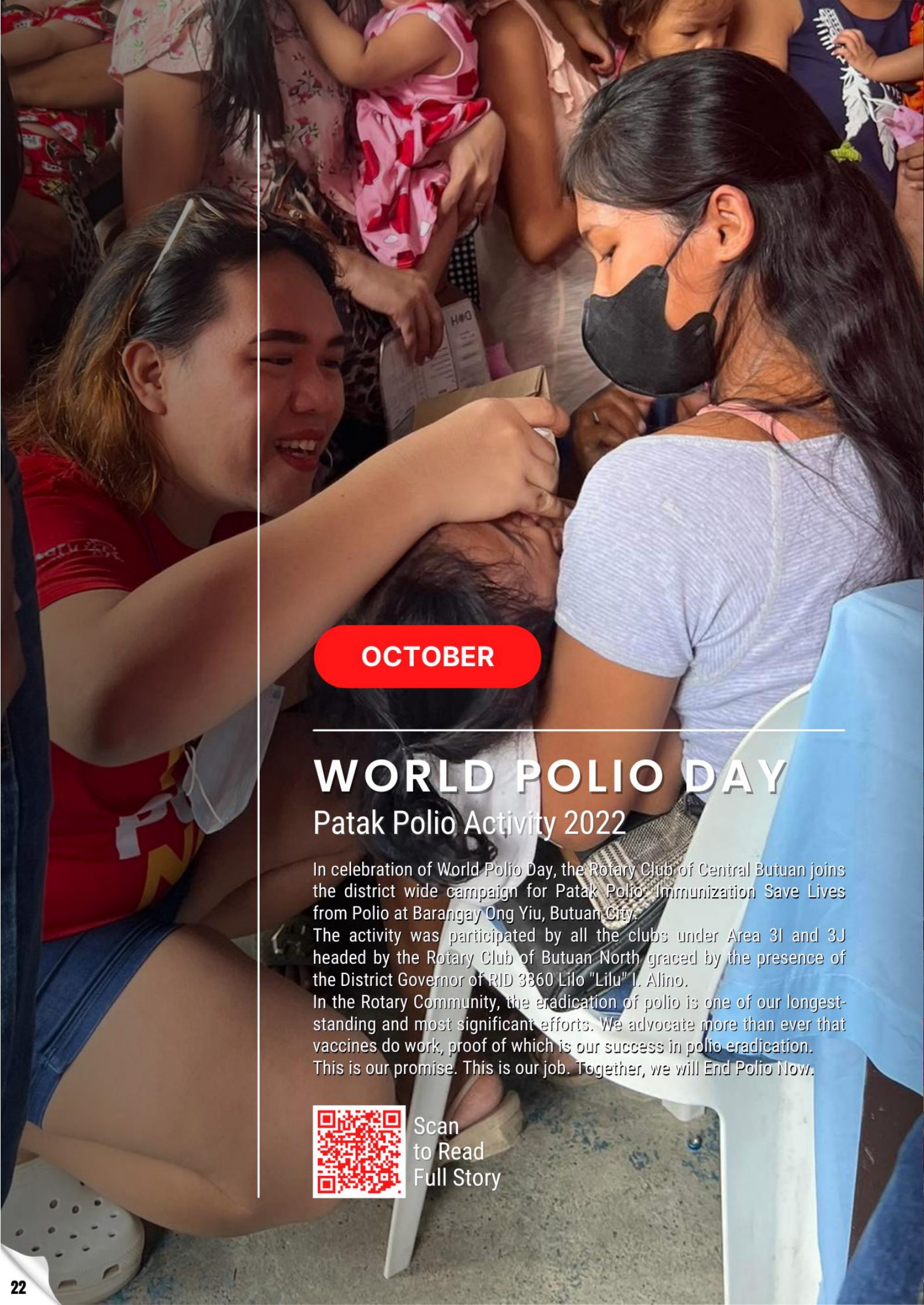

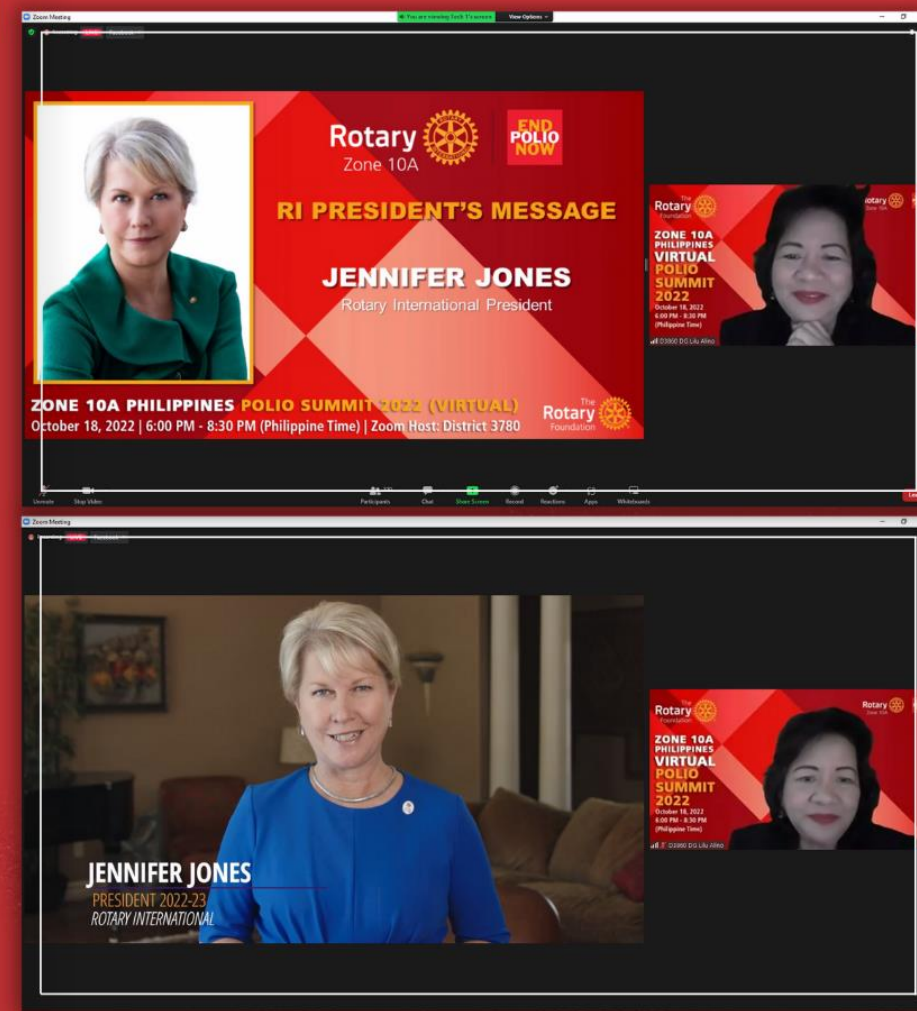

We are strengthening our ability to make an impact in communities around the world. This is a way for Rotarians across the world to come together to **fight polio**.

Since **ROTARY** launched its **PolioPlus Campaign** in **1985**, **99%** of **polio cases dropped** worldwide. In **2000**, **Philippines** was declared **POLIO FREE**, but polio immunization is being sustained in all health centers across the country. Today, **less than 1,500 cases** concentrated in these endemic countries, **Pakistan** and **Afghanistan**.

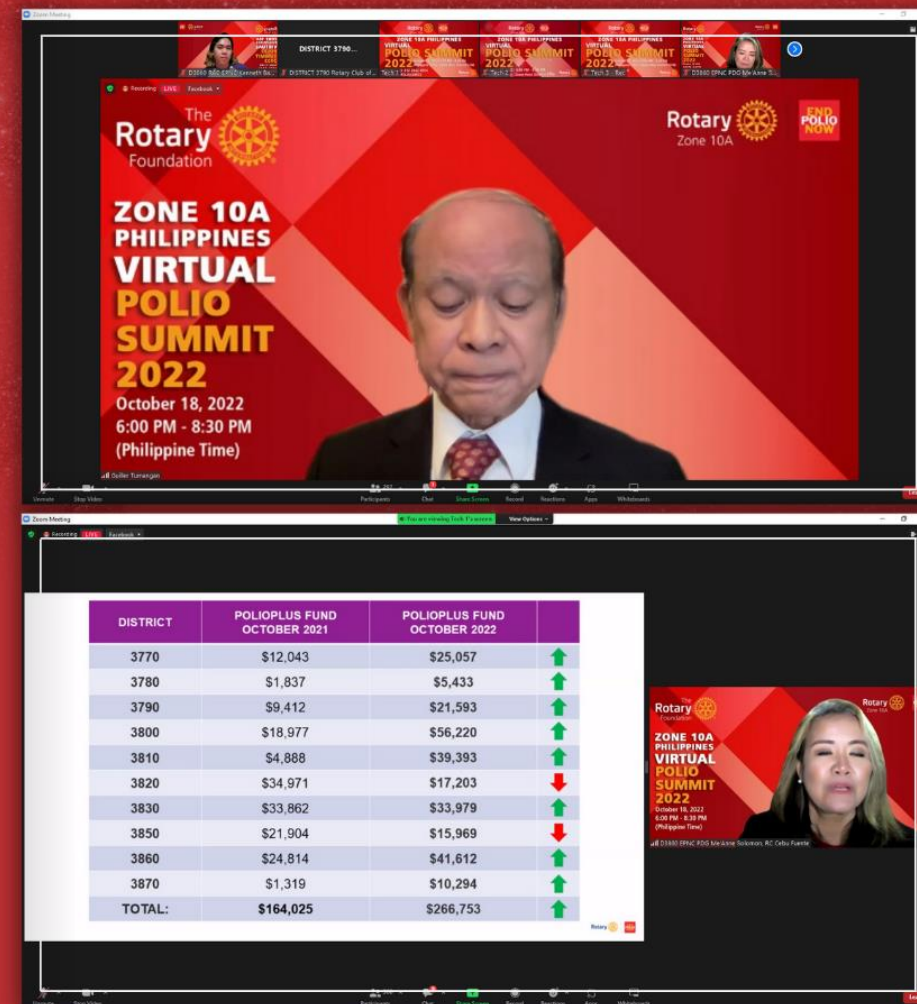
