The program will offer a range of vocational and skills training courses facilitated by TESDA-certified instructors. These courses will focus on in-demand trades and industries, enabling participants to acquire new skills, enhance their employability, and pursue entrepreneurial ventures. Through this collaboration, Rotary and TESDA aim to create lasting economic impact in Cabadbaran City and surrounding areas.

The Livelihood Economic Development Program will initially target vulnerable groups, including out-of-school youth, unemployed individuals, and those in need of livelihood support. Graduates of the training programs will receive TESDA-accredited certificates, which they can use to pursue employment or start their own businesses.
