The serene port city of Surigao was not immune to the global surge in mental health challenges. In recent months, distressing reports of mental health issues surfaced, stirring concern and a call to action. However, amid these difficulties, the answer to the clarion call emerged in the form of the Rotary Club of Central Surigao, led by its Hope Creating President, Mr. Ramon Gotinga, and the Rotaract and Interact Clubs of Central Surigao. Answering the fervent call from Rotary International President, they transvered on a hope creating journey to address mental health concerns in the community in the bountiful city of Surigao

The asphalt-lined and cobble stone roads of Surigao murmued with whispers of anxiety, despair, undeniably, shaming the once primeval scape of a once bountiful and joyous city of colors and adventures. It, thus, paved the way towards the elements of depression, substance abuse, and stress: it became a prevalent occurence, extricably, hinting at an underlying crisis in mental health These distress signals well-being. echoed throughout every part of the city, inevitably, it was noticed by Mr. Ramon Gotinga and his dedicated team at the Rotary Club of Central

Surigao and from its underwing organizations: the Rotaract and Interact Club of Central Surigao. They understood that the time had come for a concerted effort to shine a light on mental health issues plaguing their beloved city.

With a hope creating spirit and a commitment to service above self, Mr. Ramon Gotinga, alongside the passionate members of the Rotaract and Interact Clubs and with the support of his fellow Centralians of the Rotary Club of Central Surigao, took up the mantle to address mental health related issues. Recognizing the urgency of the situation, they forged a partnership with the Drug and Treatment Rehabilitation - Caraga and set their sights on organizing a groundbreaking Mental Health Symposium all over the schools of Surigao, commencing at Saint Paul - Surigao

Hope Creating President, Mr. Ramon Gotinga shared his sentiments towards his constituents and members of the community: "We cannot turn a blind eye to the silent struggles of our community members. It's our duty, as Rotarians and concerned citizens, to foster an environment where mental health is given the priority it deserves."



It commenced as a deliberative conversation between the Rotary Club of Central Surigao and the Rotaract Club of Central Surigao, sparked by Mr. Gotinga's unwavering commitment to Rotary's global cause. He rallied the Rotary Club and all of its vices, harnessing its momentum of working together with the Rotaract and Interact Clubs of Central Surigao, after seeing the urgent need to de-stigmatize mental health issues. The clubs labored in harmony to organize an event that would have a lasting impact on the community through the combination of their skills and interests as the symposium's plans came to existence.

Participants, organizers, and members of the Supreme Secondary Learners Government bustled with anticipation, making sure every detail was primed to nurture a safe and supportive environment. As the symposium day dawned, Citizen Army Training "regiments" of Saint Paul Surigao surrounded the area proudly standing by leui proclamations of the event's mission: "Empowering Minds: Breaking Barriers."

A sense of hope permeated the Saint Paul University gymnasium as students and C.A.T. personnel, flocked. Mr. Gotinga, alongside his Rotaractors ushered in the symposium with an ecstatic appeal for solidarity, adorned not with a spirit of hope. Exemplary speakers from the Drug and Treatment Rehabilitation Center - Caraga dispelled misconceptions and promoted understanding as they explored the complicated subject of mental health throughout the day. The symposium blossomed into a knowledge-sharing ecosystem, weaving an array of insights and common experiences from the masses. The organizations' evident cooperation reflected a strong commitment to breaking the taboo around mental health issues. The symposium was not the end, but rather the beginning of something continuous. Empowered with new understandings and strengthened partnerships, the Rotary family and its collaborators are dedicated to extending this momentum into continuing community projects, establishing a culture that values empathy and encouragement.
