## History of Rotary

oday, Rotary is well known throughout the world for its dedication to service and international goodwill. Changing the world through service, however, was hardly uppermost in the mind of Paul Harris when he founded the organization in 1905. Harris, a lawyer in Chicago, Illinois, USA, had been raised in a rural village in Vermont. He envisioned a new kind of club for professionals that would kindle the fellowship and friendly spirit he had known in his youth.

On the evening of 23 February 1905, Paul Harris invited three friends to a meeting. Silvester Schiele, a coal dealer, Hiram Shorey, a merchant tailor, and Gustavus Loehr, a mining engineer, gathered with Harris in Loehr's business office in Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. They discussed Harris' idea that business leaders and professionals would have regular acquaintances. The club met weekly; membership was limited to one representative from each business and profession. Though the men didn't use the term Rotary that night; that gathering was commonly regarded as the first Rotary Club meeting.

As they continued to convene, members began rotating their meetings among their places of business, hence the name Rotary. After enlisting a fifth member, printer Harry Ruggles with the group, then it was formally organized as the Rotary Club of Chicago. The original club emblem, a wagon wheel design, was the precursor of the familiar cogwheel emblem now used by Rotarians worldwide.

By the end of 1905, the club's roster showed a membership of 30 with Schiele as President and Ruggles as Treasurer. Paul Harris declined office in the new club and didn't become its President until two years later. Club membership grew, making it difficult to gather in offices, so the members shifted their meetings to hotels and restaurants, where many Rotary club meetings are hold today.

These early "Rotarians" realized that fellowship and mutual self-interest were not enough to keep a club of busy professionals meeting each week. Reaching out to improve the lives of the less fortunate proved to be an even more powerful motivation. The Rotary commitment to service began in 1907, when the Rotary Club of Chicago donated horse to a preacher. A few weeks later, the club constructed Chicago's first public lavatory. With these inaugural projects, Rotary became the world's first club organization.

Rotary's popularity began to spread throughout the USA. The second Rotary Club was chartered in 1908 in San Francisco, California, with a third club formed in Oakland, California. Others soon followed in Seattle, Washington; Los Angeles, California; and New York, New York. When the National Association of Rotary Clubs held its first convention in 1910, Harris was elected President.

At the following year's convention, speakers used the phrases "Service, Not Self" and "He Profits Most Who Service Best," which became the organization's mottos. "Service, Not Self," was later changed to "Service Above Self," and has since been adopted a Rotary's primary motto.

## The Birth of the Rotary Club of Dadiangas

In 1974, the Rotary Club of General Santos City was confronted with a problem on how its members could make up their absences. Since there was no other club within General Santos City and the nearest Rotary Clubs were in Marbel, South Cotabato and in Digos, Davao del Sur. The members of the RC Gensan found it difficult to make up especially when the roads going to other places were rough and rugged; dusty when dried and muddy when wet. There were no paved roads yet. That, the Board of Directors together with its Club President Jess Veneracion decided to organize a new Rotary Club in the city – the Rotary Club of Dadiangas.

For this noble purpose, RC Gensan loaned two of its senior members to form as the core for the new club – Rtn Frank Zuzon and Rtn Joe Lansang. They accepted the challenge with pride and honor. The whole month of January 1975 was devoted to recruit new members and comprehensive rotary information were given to all prospective Rotarians. After several fellowship meetings conducted, RC Dadiangas was formally organized with twenty three (23) charter members. Rtn Frank Zuzon was elected Charter President with Vic Tajanlangit as Club Secretary. PDG Johnny Asencio and PP Joe Lansang were elected as members of the Board of Directors.

On May 7, 1975, RC Dadiangas was officially admitted as regular member of Rotary International and was conferred the provisional status as duly organized club. The Rotary Club of Dadiangas was finally chartered on September 08, 1975.

## **EDITORIAL WHAT MATTERS?**

There are clichés that may not be true. Let me give you some of them.

"Practice makes perfect." Not necessarily

true.

Practice makes permanent. This is true. Ask any golfer. If you have a defective golf swing and you practice it constantly then you will be permanently defective.

Experience is the best teacher. Not necessarily true.

Only evaluated experience teaches best. Many people continue doing the same mistakes not because they are lacking in experiencing but simply because they never evaluated their experiences.

Experience is not the same as education.

There are many educated people without experiences and they make poor teachers and instructors. And then again there are many experienced people without education and they are prevented from rising to higher levels of performance.

I have heard people say, "I do not have to finish school. I will get a job for isn't it that experience is more important than the education?"

Once in a while comes an undereducated person who hits the jackpot. Earns a lot of money due to his or her business acumen yet none of these people would ever encourage their children NOT to have good education.

What is the difference then between education and experience?

One wag says: Education is what you get from reading the small print. Experience is what you get from not reading it.

Experiences alone do not make one an expert.

There is a difference between experience and expertise. Simply repeating the same task over and over is no guarantee you will get better.

The repeated practice should be directed toward the improvement of your performance. And when the repeated performance is done correctly, prolonged, it produces a library of specialized knowledge. This is what makes a person an expert. His mind is a wide and deep storage of patterns he may use when the situation calls for it. Just like a chess grandmaster he or she sees four or even five moves ahead. You and I can be an expert. If we seriously want to be one

Each and everyday offers opportunity for us to gain new experience. Our skills are developed from such but only if we extract meaning from each one. This is why lazy people will never become experts. They go for the routine and they love making shortcuts.

Lazy people's favorite cliché of course is "The end justifies the means." And the moment they achieve their tiny goals, they rest.

Not so the people of drive and passion. They challenge the status quo. They long for new learning. They seek more education and they do different things. Not a moment is wasted. Not a single experience ignored. Every encounter is evaluated and then the meaning from which is extracted.

Overtime this person becomes an expert. He becomes a sage on stage. He now has a wide and deep storage of specialized knowledge and experiences and people marvel at his wisdom. And then the world brands him as an "Expert."

So now that you have education, now that you have experience and now that you have become an expert what comes next?

Here is the most important of them all.

What matters is we need to build our character.

Many people were able to climb up the ladder of their success because of their expertise but fall down hard because of their lack of character. We should not fall into this trap. For after all, God is not concerned with our success as He is with our CHARACTER.

I love to travel! I even enjoy the mundane process of getting from here to there. But last year, my wife, Gay, and I had one of those experiences that would strain the optimism of even the most cheerful traveler. We found ourselves with six hours to wait, at an airport where we were not scheduled to be, on a day we had not planned still to be traveling, having woken up that morning at a hotel unknown to us the night before. It was one of those days.

As we waited at John F. Kennedy International Airport in New York City, Gay and I took a walk to people watch. We

went from one end of the terminal to the other and back, looking at every gate, every destination, every group of people waiting for their flights.

Each gate was its own island of humanity. When we walked down the center of the concourse, we were in New York, moving along with everyone in one river. But when you veered off into those seats, you left that current and landed on an island. You were already in Delhi or Paris or Tel Aviv.

As we started our walk, I thought: "All these different people, all these different countries, all in one place. This is like Rotary!" But as we walked past gate after gate, I realized something. It was not like Rotary at all. Because everyone in that river was heading for an island. And every island stayed an island. The people heading to Taipei might be talking to one another, but they were not talking to the people heading to Cairo or Lagos.

Contrast that with Rotary. Rotary allows us to connect with one another, in deep and meaningful ways, across our differences. It connects us with people we would never otherwise have met, who are more like us than we ever could have known. It connects us with our communities, to professional opportunities, and to the people who need our help.

Connection is what makes the experience of Rotary so very different from walking along that concourse at JFK Airport. In Rotary, none of us is an island. All of us are in Rotary together, whoever we are, wherever we are from, whatever language we speak or traditions we follow. We are all connected to one another — part of our communities and members not only of our clubs, but also of the global community to which we all belong.

This connection is what lies at the heart of the Rotary experience. It is what brings us to Rotary. It is why we stay. Please join your fellow Rotarians on this journey as Rotary Connects the World.
