Gordon R. McNally, a member of the Rotary Club of South Queensferry, Lothian, Scotland, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International for 2023-24.

McNally, a graduate of dental surgery at the University of Dundee, owned and operated his own dental practice in Edinburgh. He was the chair of the East of Scotland branch of the British Paedodontic Society and has held various academic positions. He has also served as a Presbytery elder, chair of Queensferry Parish

Congregational Board, and commissioner to the church's general assembly.



A Rotary member since 1984, McNally has been president and vice president of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland. He has also served Rotary International as a director and as member or chair of several committees. He is currently an adviser to the 2022 Houston Convention Committee and chair of the Operations Review Committee.

McNally and his wife, Heather, are Major Donors and Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation. They are also members of the Bequest Society.

With better engagement, McNally says, "We will grow Rotary both by way of membership and in our ability to provide meaningful service."

HOPE-CREATING DISTRICT GOVERNOR

Our Hope-Creating Governor joined the Rotary Club of Downtown Davao in 2001 which was then an all-female club. As she grew in Rotary, she occupied various key positions in the Club. After 15 years of membership, reluctantly, she became an All-Star president in RY 2016-17.

During her presidency, her Club was awarded the Most Outstanding Club in the district among the 99 clubs in the district. The Club also received three Rotary International Citation Awards. First, was with their service project called "Shelter for Battered Women." Second, its Rotaract Club got an award for its exemplary performance and third, her husband Archie, received an RI Service Award, recognizing him as one the 50 Most outstanding Spouse in the world. After her presidency, she started to hold various District positions. She was appointed by Great Team Governor Art Tan as an Assistant Governor of Area 2C handling 5 clubs and at the same time was the Mindanao Chair for Pink October, the breast Cancer Awareness Program.

For the Inspiring Team lead by Gov Bing Garcia she retained the position as the Pink October Chair in Mindanao and in that same year she became a member of the gala committee of The One Philippines, an International Humanitarian Award Body chaired by Past RI Director Raffy Garcia. One of the awardees came from our District who was endorsed by RC Dadiangas, Dr Roel Cagape. The spouses are also members of the Board of Trustees in our District 3860 Disaster Management, Inc. As the DGN then, she had important District responsibilities such as the District Coordinators for the Rotary Presidential Conference 2021 Manila and Empowering Girls Initiative. She also had duties as the District's Endowment and Major Gifts Sub-Committee Chair.

Believing on the advocacy of The Rotary Foundation, DGE Twinkle and spouse Archie are members of the newly Chartered Polio Plus Society, are Endowment Benefactors and Bequest Society. Moreover, the spouses are Arch Klumph Society Trustee Circle members.

Bai Hundra Cassandra Dominique N. Advincula or known more for her nickname ***Sweet/Sweetheart*** among friends and family was born on February 15, 1989 at Makati, Metro Manila to Atty. Victorio Uy Advincula Jr.(+) and Dr. Chona Dulla Narvasa-Advincula, MPA, REB. She is the eldest daughter among four (4) siblings namely: Don Victorio IV, REB, REA, CTT; Bai Hundra Athena Cassanova, RMT; and Victorio V. She studied at the Ateneo de Davao University from her primary education level to tertiary education level and earned her degree in Bachelor of Science in Management Accounting. As she aspired to follow the footsteps of her grandfather and father,

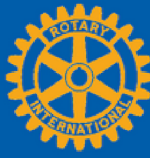
Sweet pursued to study Law while at the same time worked as the Chief-of-Staff to the former Davao City Councilor Atty. Victorio Uy Advincula Jr. She earned her Bachelor of Laws or Juris Doctor at the University of Mindanao and passed the Philippine Bar Examinations on the same year. She also pursued an Executive Education at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy and Government of the National University of Singapore.

As a legal advocate, she and her legal team has been providing free legal assistance to indigents particularly to those from the Third District of Davao City. She and her legal team has provided Free Legal Advice to more than 2,000 individuals and counting and Free Notarization to more than 9,000 individuals and still counting. Sometime in 2018, she was invited by then Mayor and now Vice President Sara Z. Duterte to run under Hugpong Ng Pagbabago as a candidate for City Councilor for the Third Congressional District of Davao City. She won a seat in the 2019 elections and in the succeeding 2022 elections. She is now serving her Second Term as City Councilor.

She is also active in various non civic organizations. Sometime in 2019, she was invited by Past President Evelyn Congson to be a member of the Rotary Club of Davao 2000. In the next years, she became the club Vice-President and then club President-Elect. In line with the Rotary Area of Focus of Peaceful Building and Conflict Prevention and through the support of the members of RC Davao 2000, she led a Cement Donation Project for the Construction of a Concrete Pathway for the teachers, students, Ata-Manobo community of Sitio Sumpitan going to Macatabo Elementary School at Brgy. Tawantawan, Baguio District. This was done in partnership with the Revitalized Police sa Barangay.

As a Rotarian, she applies the principles of Rotary in both her personal and professional life. Adhering to the Rotarian way of "Service Above Self", as she personally believes that service to men is the highest form of worship to God.

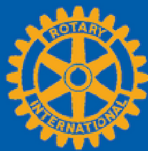
THE FOUR-WAY TEST

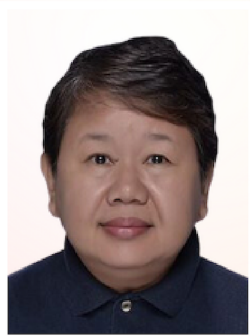

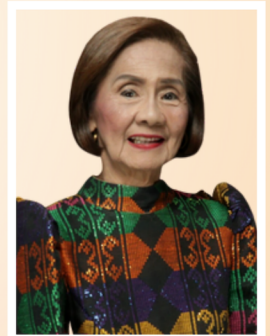
