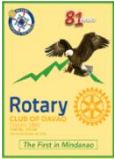

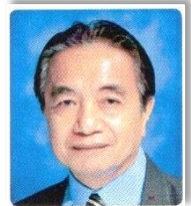
It was indeed an inspiring day as several visitors came and witnessed the said occasion.

THE PASSIVE PINOY

Whatever happened to the Vigilant Filipino?

I used to be proud of the historical fact that we were the first country in Asia to rise up in arms and successfully defeat a powerful colonizer like Spain and attain our Independence after years of colonization.

Then during the Second World War, the Filipino proudly and valiantly fought and resisted the onslaught of the powerful Imperial Japanese army, in spite of our inferior military strength and at the cost of thousands of lives, but eventually helped in the fall of marauding Japan.

Then of course, there was the EDSA Revolution. Bloodless, weaponless, but a revolution nonetheless. Effective enough to drive away a dictator and his cohorts and put our country back on the path to democracy.

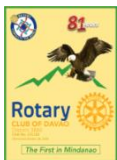
This was preceded by years of protest actions and street demonstrations by patriotic Filipino youth, who marched on the streets, at the risk of life, limb and liberty, to protest martial law and the tyrannical edicts of then President Marcos. This was the First Quarter Storm.

A powerful neighboring country is slowly but aggressively encroaching on our seas and our patrimony and we appear to remain unaffected. Our government officials are acting like they are above the law and wantonly distorting and abusing it according to their whims and benefits and we allow it, with nary a whimper nor hardly an expression of protest.

I look at the protest actions valiantly carried out by the residents in Hongkong against an unfair decree and I am jealous. I look at what is happening in my country and I am saddened. Thus, with reluctance and trepidation I am forced to ask.. is the patriotic, proud and vigilant Filipino, a thing of the past?

ROTARY CODE OF CONDUCT

As a Rotarian, I will

3. Conduct all of my personal, business, and professional affairs ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example to others;
4. Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings;
5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society;
6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavour or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians;
8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.



DECLARATION OF ROTARIANS IN BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS

The Declaration of rotary in Business and Profession was adopted by the Rotary International Council on legislation in 1989 to Provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for the Object of Rotary.

As a Rotarian engaged in business or profession, I am expected to:

1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve.
2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country and to the moral standards of my community.
3. Do all in my power to dignity my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation.
4. Be fair to my employers, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship.
5. Recognized the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talents to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in the community.
7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
