



#### **Politically Induced Failure of Prevention**

"An ounce of prevention is better than a pound of cure". Like the Golden Rule, this is one of the more common adages we used to hear when we were younger, and this holds very true even now.

More than ten years ago, largely through the efforts of Rotary International in partnership with many health groups and organizations worldwide, government and private, a massive worldwide immunization program was undertaken. It was one of Rotary's shining moments, as every Rotary club everywhere and particularly here in the Philippines and specifically in Davao, literally took to the streets, to promote and give the oral polio vaccine to all the kids in the different communities, in what was seen as a sterling example of real International cooperation. It was so successful that in just a few short years, Polio, once a scourge of many third world countries, including the Philippines, was virtually wiped out and the WHO declared our country as polio free. The pitiful sight of limping polio stricken children disappeared, finally. Polio immunization, as well as immunization against other preventable illnesses, especially of children, became an accepted regular practice.

Then came the dengvaxia controversy, and the disinformation, scare, panic and hysteria that followed.

The prudent practice of immunization against dengue fever was used as a political tool by some unscrupulous and uninformed government officials in a vain attempt to discredit the previous administration, with a taint of malice, political ambition and a large dose of ignorance and irresponsibility. They started the ridiculous claim that the dengvaxia vaccine was killing the children it was supposed to protect against dengue. This created nationwide fear, panic and hysteria to the extent that even other vaccinations against measles and polio were also shunned, dreaded and avoided.

What followed was that in just a few months, there was a resurgence of dengue, much more than the previous year, measles re-appeared in epidemic proportions and the long lost polio is making a comeback.

Just like in the dark history of mankind, are we again killing our children?

## RI PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Mark Daniel Maloney, President 2019-20

#### October 2019

Rotary's long-term, sustained battle against polio has defined our organization for decades. We have a right to be proud of all that we have accomplished through the years.

Our progress is real and noteworthy. In 1988, polio was endemic in 125 countries, with more than 350,000 new cases a year worldwide. Since then, Rotary and our Global Polio Eradication Initiative partners have reduced the incidence of polio by more than 99.9 percent, vaccinated more than 2.5 billion children against the virus, and prevented 18 million cases of paralysis. Over the years, Rotary has helped country after country move into the polio-free column. This includes India, which some considered impossible not long ago. Of the three types of poliovirus, type 2 has been eradicated and type 3 could soon be certified as eradicated. Nigeria has not reported a case of wild poliovirus in nearly three years. If this trend holds, we will be down to just one type of wild poliovirus in only one section of the world, Afghanistan and Pakistan.

There are major challenges in that region. But it is crucial that we remain optimistic. Look at all that we have accomplished so far. This is no time to get discouraged or to think that the task is impossible. We will end polio forever, but only if we remain steadfast and vigilant. World Polio Day is a time for Rotarians from all over the globe to come together, recognize the progress we have made in our fight against polio, and plan the action we must take to end polio forever. The key word is action, because we still have important work to do.

This year, we want to see as many Rotary clubs as possible holding World Polio Day events around the world. Need some ideas? How about organizing a viewing party for friends and club members to watch Rotary's Online Global Update? You could also dedicate a club meeting to World Polio Day or create a fundraising event. Remember, every dollar raised is matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

Once you have created an event, register it at endpolio.org/register-your-event. Then promote it using the World Polio Day toolkit, available at endpolio.org/world-polio-day.

Mark your calendar to tune in to Rotary's World Polio Day Online Global Update on 24 October. This year we will stream our program on Facebook in multiple time zones around the world. Visit the Rotary International Facebook page to RSVP to your region's program. And do not forget to follow the event on social media and share it with your network.

When we reach our goal, polio will become only the second human disease eradicated on the planet, and Rotary will receive international acclaim. But what matters most is the children who will never again have to face this terrible, disabling virus. Rotary must continue to connect the world in the effort toward polio eradication. It is up to us. Let us finish the job.



## One Day. One Focus: Ending Polio 24 October 2019

- Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavour or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians;
- Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.



# DECLARATION OF ROTARIANS IN BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS

The Declaration of rotary in Business and Profession was adopted by the Rotary International Council on legislation in 1989 to Provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for the Object of Rotary.

As a Rotarian engaged in business or profession, I am expected to:

- 1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve.
- 2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country and to the moral standards of my community.
- 3. Do all in my power to dignity my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation.
- 4. Be fair to my employers, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship.
- 5. Recognized the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society.
- 6. Offer my vocational talents to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in the community.
- 7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
- 8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
