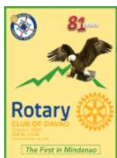


Rotary Connects the World

Rotary Connects the World is RI President Mark Maloney's Theme for the Rotary Year 2019-2020. President Maloney believes that connecting with the World is at the heart of the Rotary experience. Through Rotary we connect with each other, in deep and meaningful ways, across our differences. It connects us to people we would never otherwise have met, who are more like us than we ever could have known. It connects us to our communities, to professional opportunities, and to the people who need our help. To enhance Rotary connectivity President Maloney would like to see that all clubs grow/expand their services and impact of their projects in pursuit of a common goal to serve humanity, peace and sustainable development. For that, above all he emphasizes that we should expand our membership. The more active members, the more connections with Rotary and hence the greater the chance to expand our services.

President Maloney also urges clubs to change the existing Club culture whereby so much responsibility and hard work is done mainly by the Officers, especially the President, in terms of resource mobilisation and unwavering efforts to enhance Club performance and status, sometimes at the cost of family life. This should not be according to President Maloney. He urges leaders to offer alternative meeting experiences and service opportunities to make it easier for busy professionals and people with many family obligations to serve in leadership roles. Rotary should not compete with the family, but rather complement it. We should be realistic in our expectations, considerate in our scheduling and involve not only the Club Leaders but all members 'in the work at hand'. President Maloney's request to increase membership with active members is certainly also our Club's priority this year in which all existing active members can participate. It will be a challenge no doubt but also extremely rewarding for our Club while at the same time it is instrumental in respect of doing our share in contributing to the Presidential Theme.

The President further emphasises Rotary's relationship with the United Nations (UN) as well. In 2020, the UN will celebrate its 75th anniversary and its mission of promoting peace. Rotary shares the UN's continuing commitment to a healthier, more peaceful, and more sustainable world. Rotary can offer something no other organisation can match: an existing infrastructure that allows people from all over the world to connect in a spirit of service and peace and take meaningful action toward that goal. Presently there are 33,000 Rotary Clubs in 165 out of 195 countries with 1.22 million members. Indeed we have a very extensive network with enormous opportunities to connect people across the Globe. This Rotary year RI is hosting a series of presidential conferences around the world, focusing on Rotary's relationship with the UN and its sustainable development goals that many Rotary service projects support. Let RCD continue to grab that opportunity and contribute to more humanity, peace and sustainable development in 2019-2020.

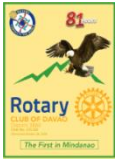

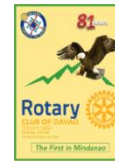

RI PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Mark Daniel Maloney, President 2019-20

Rotary's long-term, sustained battle against polio has defined our organization for decades. We have a right to be proud of all that we have accomplished through the years.

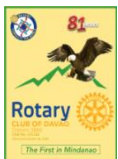
Our progress is real and noteworthy. In 1988, polio was endemic in 125 countries, with more than 350,000 new cases a year worldwide. Since then, Rotary and our Global Polio Eradication Initiative partners have reduced the incidence of polio by more than 99.9 percent, vaccinated more than 2.5 billion children against the virus, and prevented 18 million cases of paralysis. Over the years, Rotary has helped country after country move into the polio-free column. This includes India, which some considered impossible not long ago. Of the three types of poliovirus, type 2 has been eradicated and type 3 could soon be certified as eradicated. Nigeria has not reported a case of wild poliovirus in nearly three years. If this trend holds, we will be down to just one type of wild poliovirus in only one section of the world, Afghanistan and Pakistan.

There are major challenges in that region. But it is crucial that we remain optimistic. Look at all that we have accomplished so far. This is no time to get discouraged or to think that the task is impossible. We will end polio forever, but only if we remain steadfast and vigilant. World Polio Day is a time for Rotarians from all over the globe to come together, recognize the progress we have made in our fight against polio, and plan the action we must take to end polio forever. The key word is action, because we still have important work to do.

This year, we want to see as many Rotary clubs as possible holding World Polio Day events around the world. Need some ideas? How about organizing a viewing party for friends and club members to watch Rotary's Online Global Update? You could also dedicate a club meeting to World Polio Day or create a fundraising event. Remember, every dollar raised is matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Once you have created an event, register it at endpolio.org/register-your-event. Then promote it using the World Polio Day toolkit, available at endpolio.org/world-polio-day.

Mark your calendar to tune in to Rotary's World Polio Day Online Global Update on 24 October. This year we will stream our program on Facebook in multiple time zones around the world. Visit the Rotary International Facebook page to RSVP to your region's program. And do not forget to follow the event on social media and share it with your network.

When we reach our goal, polio will become only the second human disease eradicated on the planet, and Rotary will receive international acclaim. But what matters most is the children who will never again have to face this terrible, disabling virus. Rotary must continue to connect the world in the effort toward polio eradication. It is up to us. Let us finish the job.

8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

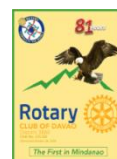


DECLARATION OF ROTARIANS IN BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS

The Declaration of rotary in Business and Profession was adopted by the Rotary International Council on legislation in 1989 to Provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for the Object of Rotary.

As a Rotarian engaged in business or profession, I am expected to:

1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve.
2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country and to the moral standards of my community.
3. Do all in my power to dignity my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation.
4. Be fair to my employers, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship.
5. Recognized the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talents to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in the community.
7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
