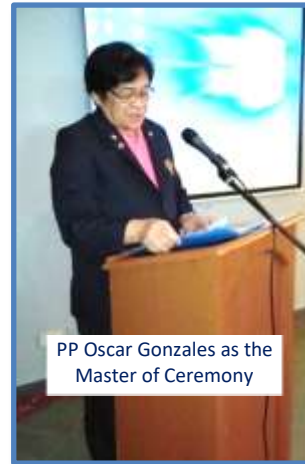

Future Planning

Many Governments and Societies all over the world have been able to attain considerable progress and success because of long range planning by their leaders and planners, spanning not just months or years but sometimes even decades.

This usually requires creativity and imagination, patience, sacrifice and humility, knowing that the results of one's efforts today may only be best appreciated years later, with the credit finally going to the final implementer of the program.

Major Cities in the US and Europe like New York, Washington and Paris were so meticulously and painstakingly planned, way back by their founders and forefathers so that, even now, more than a hundred years later, these cities still remain very functional, comfortable and liveable, even with the increase in population, traffic and modern technology. In other cities like Sydney, in Australia, populations were properly relocated as the city was rebuilt, revised and refitted, to create an ideal, functional city to accommodate more basic services like Hospitals, Schools, Transport facilities, Businesses and Government Services.

It is unfortunate that here in our country, even with the fully functioning and empowered city planning and zoning offices in local and national government, and with lawmakers tripping over each other trying to outdo each other in creating laws and ordinances, purportedly for the common good, much is still left to be desired. Whatever laws or ordinances passed for proper city planning have been disorganized and haphazard at best,

Traffic in Manila and other major cities are continuously getting worse every year and there seems to be no solution in sight. Flood control remains a fantasy and the source of potable water is gradually being threatened. Even our supply of rice and other basic commodities now have to be sourced from other countries.

The devastated city of Marawi would have given us a chance to create a prototype of how an ideal city could be planned and created but until now, even with billions in budget available, two years later, still remains in shambles, with no clear plan in sight.

If only our leaders could put as much thought and effort in planning the future welfare of our cities and communities as they are putting in their plans for the 2022 elections, we may just get to enjoy some short or long term relief from our problems, somehow.

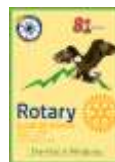
Dear fellow Rotarians,

ROTARY PROVIDES MILLIONS IN POLIO FUNDING AS WILD POLIOVIRUS TYPE 3 IS ERADICATED

US\$50 million will impact over 38 million children as the program reaches two key milestones: wild poliovirus type 3 eradication and Africa reaching three years with no wild poliovirus transmission

EVANSTON, Ill. (October 30, 2019) — Rotary is giving US\$50 million in grants to support the global effort to end polio. The funding will provide surveillance, technical assistance, and operational support for immunization activities, and will reach up to 38.4 million children with polio immunizations. The funding comes on the heels of the announcement that wild poliovirus type 3 (WPV3) has been eradicated globally.

WPV3 is just the third human disease-causing pathogen to be eradicated in history, and the announcement means that there is just one remaining strain of wild polio left that continues to affect children. Rotary and its Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) partners reached another major milestone in August, when Nigeria reached three years without a case of wild poliovirus, thus opening the door for the entire African region to be certified wild polio-free sometime in 2020.

"Both of these milestones are critical steps towards the ultimate goal of a polio-free world," said **Michael K. McGovern, chair of Rotary's International PolioPlus Committee**. "The eradication of wild poliovirus type 3 and Nigeria's good news demonstrate tremendous progress, but there is still much work to be done as we address the increase in cases in Pakistan and Afghanistan. In the face of challenges, reaching these historic benchmarks shows us that polio eradication is possible, and it's important that we harness this momentum to secure the funding and political support needed to end polio for good."

Grants announced today will support ongoing eradication efforts in Nigeria as well as other African countries. Grants will also be directed to efforts in Afghanistan and Pakistan. Funding will be distributed as follows:

- Somalia, \$4.6 million
- mOPV2 Stockpile, \$10.3 million

8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

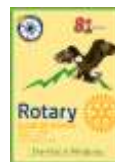


DECLARATION OF ROTARIANS IN BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS

The Declaration of rotary in Business and Profession was adopted by the Rotary International Council on legislation in 1989 to Provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for the Object of Rotary.

As a Rotarian engaged in business or profession, I am expected to:

1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve.
2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country and to the moral standards of my community.
3. Do all in my power to dignity my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation.
4. Be fair to my employers, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship.
5. Recognized the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talents to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in the community.
7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
