





The Declaration of rotary in Business and Profession was adopted by the Rotary International Council on legislation in 1989 to Provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for the Object of Rotary.

- 4. Be fair to my employers, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship.
- Recognized the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society.
- Offer my vocational talents to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in the community.
- Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
- Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
