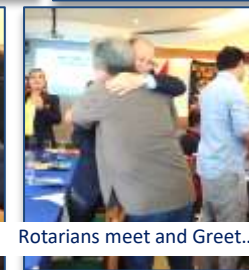

'Saving our Planet'

We are all aware of the seriousness of global warming and the urgent need to reduce our carbon emissions to survive. Trees are most effective in doing that. Last year in one of our bulletins we proposed that Rotarians should plant more trees. Some weeks ago PP Ed Bulecer informed us that a partner Club in Manila would like to get involved with us in a tree planting project and in recent luncheon meetings, our dear President Dads Mahipus also referred to the urgent need for Rotary to increase its involvement in tree planting. So perhaps it's time to go for it. Below is a summary proposal for consideration.

Implementing partners: Obu-Manuvu indigenous cultural communities (ICCs)

Project location: Obu-Manuvu Ancestral Domain (AD) in the uplands of Davao City

Justification and rationale: The Obu-Manuvu Indigenous People (IP) have a Certificate of Ancestral Domain Title (CADT) for a large mountainous area of around 36,700 ha's in Davao City uplands. It is home to 15 ICCs with a total population of 22,386 (2018). The AD also includes the important watersheds of the Talomo and Tamugan Rivers of Davao City. Around 15,000 ha's in the AD are classified as environmental critical areas requiring urgent reforestation and protection for reasons of carbon capture, maintaining biodiversity and last but not least safeguarding our potable water sources. To wit also, RCD already has an agreement with Obu-Manuvu ICCs to support educational and sustainable agricultural development. Another important justification to join hands with the Obu-Manuvu in respect of reforestation is that one of our partner organisations, the EGIP Foundation (EGIPF) is currently implementing reforestation cum tree maintenance programs with the Obu-Manuvu IP. Since 2012 about 30 ha's been reforested. Unfortunately progress is slow, mainly due to financial constraints.

Implementation modalities: It is suggested that we join the ongoing EGIPF supported planting cum tree maintenance programme. EGIPF is willing to facilitate our Rotary reforestation efforts and can organise regular field visits for members to plant trees, monitor progress and report to RCD. The on-going reforestation programme is based on the principle of payment for environmental services during a 4 year period. Thereafter City & DENR accredited indigenous forest guards will make sure the trees can continue to grow undisturbed.

RCD Contribution: The investment cost per tree during the 4-year period is 250 PhP; 120 PhP for planting (seedling, hole digging, fertilizing, nurturing and watering and replacing mortalities); 80 PhP (20 peso/tree/year) for maintenance (cleaning, ringweeding, mulching and watering according to need); supervision, facilitation, monitoring and reporting by EGIPF during the 4-year period, 50 PhP per tree. In 1 ha approx. 600 trees can be planted. My dear fellow Rotarians, here is an excellent opportunity to further support our IPs and at the same time do our share in 'saving our planet'. If members agree, the next step would be to call a Board meeting to approve the project and determine the level of RCD's financial contribution.

Rotary International Convention

Singapore Set to Host Rotary International Convention 2024, its Largest Association Congress to Date.



Singapore has won the provisional bid to host the Rotary International Convention in 2024, which is set to be the largest association congress ever hosted by the Republic. More than 25,000 Rotary members from around the world are expected to converge on Singapore to connect, engage and share insights on how to create positive, lasting change in their communities. The annual Rotary convention, held in different cities around the world, was last held in Singapore in 1999 and was attended by approximately 19,000 participants.

The winning provisional bid was led by Rotary regional leader Mr Chew Ghim Bok, and supported by Rotary clubs from Singapore and around the Asia Pacific region. In addition to the STB, various public agencies and business event industry stakeholders also contributed to the successful bid.

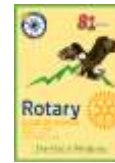

We are also pleased to offer our guests multiple opportunities to discover our City in the Garden, and to experience the best that the region has to offer."

"As a leading global business and knowledge hub, Singapore is an excellent venue for one of our annual conventions," said Rotary International President Ian H.S. Riseley. "Given our international scope and commitment to cultural diversity, our conventions are often described as a 'mini-United Nations' where our global network of volunteers connect to address lasting solutions to local and global humanitarian challenges."

Rotary members throughout the world take action to make communities better. They contribute their time, energy and passion to carry out impactful and sustainable projects in the areas of peace and conflict resolution, disease prevention and treatment, water and sanitation, maternal and child health, basic education and literacy, and economic and community development.

As part of Singapore's bid to host a convention that makes a lasting difference, the Rotary Clubs of Singapore plan to champion a legacy project striving towards sanitation progress and hygiene awareness by 2025.

The Rotary International Convention 2024 will run for five days, and include workshops, forums, breakout sessions, entertainment and other meetings. The Convention will be held at the Singapore EXPO Convention and Exhibition Centre.



RI PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Happy 115th birthday, fellow Rotarians and members of the family of Rotary!

Much has changed in the world since 1905. Then, the global population was roughly 1.7 billion. Today, it is 7.7 billion. There were 5 telephones per 100 people in the United States 115 years ago. In 2020, it is estimated that 96 percent of the U.S. population has a cellphone — and both China and India have more than a billion cellphones in use.

In the 115 years since Rotary was founded, seemingly everything has changed except Rotary values. We began, and remain, committed to fellowship, integrity, diversity, service, and leadership. While our Service Above Self motto dates to 1911, the ethos behind those words had already been ingrained by Rotary's founders.

As the pace of change worldwide continues to accelerate, the need for Rotary service is greater than ever. It's one thing to read about service projects, quite another to see them in action and to see the grateful faces of people who have benefited from them. Rotary projects change lives and connect the world. And over the past year, I have seen some amazing Rotary projects in action.

Gay and I visited Japan's Fukushima prefecture last year. Few places in the world have had to deal with the kind of devastation that visited Fukushima in March 2011, when a tsunami touched off by an earthquake led to disaster at a nuclear power plant. But the story of Fukushima today is not one of destruction; it is one of hope and renewal. Rotary grants have helped improve access to medical and mental health care for victims of the disaster and reduced the isolation of these communities by sharing the experiences of people from other parts of the world who have also recovered from disasters. Our grants have also helped to foster self-motivation and encourage sustainable long-term community recovery across the region.

In Shanghai, I learned about the Careers in Care program. This helps migrant workers fill the need for skilled professionals in elder care facilities. After taking a course, trainees receive certification to boost their employment prospects, while the care industry benefits from an expanded talent pool. Rotary projects like this are successful because they address a local need, and they have the potential to attract local government funding to sustain their impact.

And in Guatemala, Gay and I went to Sumpango. Global grants there provide mechanical cows to produce soy milk; an improved water distribution system; water filters; clean compost latrines; family gardens; support for income generation; and training in WASH and literacy programs. The food items sold there not only provide nutrition to women and children, but also create a source of income for local women. In every area of focus, and in every part of the world, Rotary projects are improving lives and helping communities adapt in a time of rapid change. As we celebrate another great year for Rotary, let us rededicate ourselves to strengthening the connections that make our service so impactful. We will make lives better as Rotary Connects the World.

8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

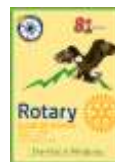


DECLARATION OF ROTARIANS IN BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS

The Declaration of rotary in Business and Profession was adopted by the Rotary International Council on legislation in 1989 to Provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for the Object of Rotary.

As a Rotarian engaged in business or profession, I am expected to:

1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve.
2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country and to the moral standards of my community.
3. Do all in my power to dignity my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation.
4. Be fair to my employers, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship.
5. Recognized the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talents to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in the community.
7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
