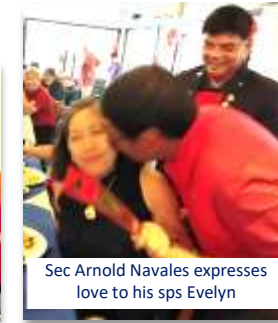

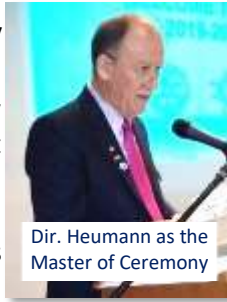

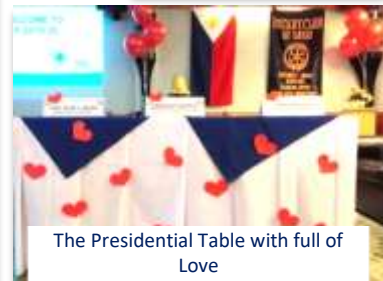

EPIDEMIC

Epidemic is a catastrophic phenomenon brought about by an uncontrolled spread of infection across a whole country or region. This widespread infection of people can rapidly spread and can affect hundreds and even thousands of people in a certain area over a short period of time.

This is what is happening in China right now.

Due to the sudden outbreak of viral infection caused by a new breed of virus called the Nova Corona Virus in the City of Wuhan in China, the source of which is still undetermined, the infection was able to rapidly spread all across the City of Wuhan and the surrounding provinces.

This is a very virulent type of respiratory virus that is transmitted from person to person both by droplet infection thru coughing or sneezing and by physical contact Like touching or kissing. The virus attacks the respiratory mucosa breaking down its barrier and allowing the entry of secondary bacterial infection leading to severe pneumonia, respiratory failure and even sepsis.

Due to the virulence of the virus and the ease with which it could be transmitted and acquired, hundreds of thousands of people in the highly populated industrial city of Wuhan were rapidly infected and hundreds started dying on a daily basis.

This has also threatened to spread all across china and all the other countries as well. If this happens, then we would soon have a Pandemic!

Thus China was forced to quarantine, not just Wuhan, but the whole country itself, closing its borders from the entry and exit of people, reminiscent of its isolationist past.

Other countries immediately followed suit, disallowing the entry of Chinese nationals coming directly from China, by land, by sea and by plane.

The whole world is in a state of heightened alert, as everyone's eyes are on China, and with bated breath, monitoring the progress of the epidemic and how they are controlling it.

In the History of the world, epidemics have been noted to occur sporadically. The earliest in recorded History and notably one of the worst was the Bubonic Plague that occurred in Europe during the middle ages. They called it the Black Death. It caused the death of about 40 million people all across Europe. This was caused by a then unknown bacteria called the Pasteurella Pestis, spread through the bite of fleas that thrived in the cold climate of Europe and transported across countries by rats that boarded their sea faring ships.

In 1918, during the First World War, a Pandemic caused by a virulent Influenza virus that started from China, spread across a large part of Asia, the US and Europe. Called the Spanish Flu Pandemic as it became quite widespread in Spain, it caused the death of more than 50 million people. Much more lives lost than due to the on-going 1st World war.

In this present threat by the New Corona Virus, we can only be vigilant, as we strictly adhere to good preventive and hygienic practices, applying protective measures and hope and pray that our government leaders are able to grasp the potential gravity of the situation and get their acts together in ensuring that this epidemic does not gain a foothold on our shores.

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL NEWS AND UPDATES

International delegation of Rotary leaders visits Pakistan in support of polio eradication

Meetings with Prime Minister Imran Khan, Minister of Health Zafar Mirza and other Pakistani leaders centered around the country's renewed effort to eliminate polio

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan. (February 6, 2020) – A delegation of Rotary International leaders from around the world traveled to Pakistan this week to meet with government leaders including Prime Minister Imran Khan, Minister of Health Dr. Zafar Mirza, Army Chief of Staff General Qamar Javed Bajwa and Dr. Rana Safdar, head of Pakistan's Polio National Emergency Operations Centre.

The Rotary delegation included Holger Knaack, Rotary International President 2020-21; K.R. "Ravi" Ravindran, Trustee Chair of the Rotary Foundation 2020-21; and Michael K. McGovern, Chair of Rotary's International PolioPlus Committee. The group was accompanied by incoming Rotary Foundation Trustee Aziz Memon, who leads efforts for Rotary's Pakistan PolioPlus program.

The government leaders praised Rotary for its prominent role in polio eradication and for providing vital financial support to Pakistan and other polio-threatened countries. Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion dollars and countless volunteer hours to ending polio.

Rotary is the organization credited with initiating the global effort to eradicate polio. When Rotary formed the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) in 1988, there were more than 350,000 cases of polio annually around the world. Today, due to the efforts of Rotary, its partners and world governments, the incidence of polio has plummeted by more than 99.9 percent.

In this week's meetings, the Prime Minister acknowledged recent challenges in the effort to rid Pakistan of polio, and confirmed that Pakistan considers polio eradication among its highest priorities. The Government of Pakistan has already taken a series of highly effective organizational steps to manage the polio vaccination program and provide much-needed resources to ensure the resurgence of polio in Pakistan is put to an end. General Bajwa assured the Rotary delegation of the unwavering support and cooperation of both the Army and the civil forces to ensure that every child in every community throughout Pakistan is reached with the lifesaving polio vaccine.

Dr. Zafar Mirza, Minister of Health of Pakistan confirmed the country's improved efforts to eradicate polio, noting that during the last round of national polio immunizations, approximately 40 million children were vaccinated.

Mr. Holger Knaack expressed his satisfaction with the visit and efforts by the Government of Pakistan to eliminate polio, stating, "We are grateful to have had the opportunity to meet with key leaders in Pakistan to learn about renewed efforts to eradicate the disease once and for all. We're confident that with the support of the government and the Army, that Pakistan will get the job done."

Mr. KR "Ravi" Ravindran agreed, stating, "Polio eradication is a massive effort that will require all elements of society to band together and work towards our ultimate goal of ensuring no child ever again is paralyzed by polio."

During their visit, the Rotary delegation met with local Rotary leaders from Pakistan, which is home to more than 230 Rotary clubs and nearly 3400 Rotary members. They engaged with some of the major donors of the GPEI, and visited the National Emergency Operations Centre, where a high-tech data collection system monitored progress in real time.

While only Afghanistan and Pakistan continue to report cases of wild poliovirus, the remaining challenges to global eradication—such as difficulty reaching children amid insecurity and conflict and weak health systems—have proven to be the most difficult. In order to meet these roadblocks head on and ensure the continuation of program efforts, funding and support from donors and world governments is imperative.

Happy 115th birthday, fellow Rotarians and members of the family of Rotary!

Much has changed in the world since 1905. Then, the global population was roughly 1.7 billion. Today, it is 7.7 billion. There were 5 telephones per 100 people in the United States 115 years ago. In 2020, it is estimated that 96 percent of the U.S. population has a cellphone — and both China and India have more than a billion cellphones in use.

In the 115 years since Rotary was founded, seemingly everything has changed except Rotary values. We began, and remain, committed to fellowship, integrity, diversity, service, and leadership. While our Service Above Self motto dates to 1911, the ethos behind those words had already been ingrained by Rotary's founders.

As the pace of change worldwide continues to accelerate, the need for Rotary service is greater than ever. It's one thing to read about service projects, quite another to see them in action and to see the grateful faces of people who have benefited from them. Rotary projects change lives and connect the world. And over the past year, I have seen some amazing Rotary projects in action.

Gay and I visited Japan's Fukushima prefecture last year. Few places in the world have had to deal with the kind of devastation that visited Fukushima in March 2011, when a tsunami touched off by an earthquake led to disaster at a nuclear power plant. But the story of Fukushima today is not one of destruction; it is one of hope and renewal. Rotary grants have helped improve access to medical and mental health care for victims of the disaster and reduced the isolation of these communities by sharing the experiences of people from other parts of the world who have also recovered from disasters. Our grants have also helped to foster self-motivation and encourage sustainable long-term community recovery across the region.

In Shanghai, I learned about the Careers in Care program. This helps migrant workers fill the need for skilled professionals in elder care facilities. After taking a course, trainees receive certification to boost their employment prospects, while the care industry benefits from an expanded talent pool. Rotary projects like this are successful because they address a local need, and they have the potential to attract local government funding to sustain their impact.

And in Guatemala, Gay and I went to Sumpango. Global grants there provide mechanical cows to produce soy milk; an improved water distribution system; water filters; clean compost latrines; family gardens; support for income generation; and training in WASH and literacy programs. The food items sold there not only provide nutrition to women and children, but also create a source of income for local women. In every area of focus, and in every part of the world, Rotary projects are improving lives and helping communities adapt in a time of rapid change. As we celebrate another great year for Rotary, let us rededicate ourselves to strengthening the connections that make our service so impactful. We will make lives better as Rotary Connects the World.

8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

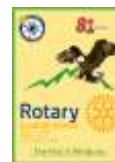


DECLARATION OF ROTARIANS IN BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS

The Declaration of rotary in Business and Profession was adopted by the Rotary International Council on legislation in 1989 to Provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for the Object of Rotary.

As a Rotarian engaged in business or profession, I am expected to:

1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve.
2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country and to the moral standards of my community.
3. Do all in my power to dignity my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation.
4. Be fair to my employers, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship.
5. Recognized the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talents to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in the community.
7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
