The History of Rotary Club of Davao

Barely one and half years after the Municipality of Davao became a chartered city, the Rotary Club of Davao, the first Rotary Club on the island of Mindanao, was likewise granted its charter on October 24, 1938. It had its charter members, 24 of Davao's leading professionals and businessmen, local leaders made up of Filipinos, Americans, Spanish, Japanese, and Chinese, a mix of culture and skills, making up the infant city that was Davao no less than the first mayor of Davao City, Santiago Artiaga was the Club's Charter Vice-President. An American businessman, Fitz Reed, was the Club's Charter President. RC Davao was the second club to be formed in District 3860, second only to the Rotary Club of Cebu, which, like Davao, was also sponsored by RC Manila.

From 1938 up to 1942, the Club grew in membership and in service, hand in hand with the gradual growth of the city. After 1942, however, when the country was plunged into the Second World War, the club had to lie dormant for about three years, as a more important city for its member, that of fighting and surviving the war, had to take center stage for a while.

In 1946, from the ashes of the devastating war, the club again resurrected, with the President Leony Garcia, Sr. taking the helm of leadership. Since then, the club's growth, activity, and influence proceeded unhampered, smooth, and palpable in the community until the present.

Inspired by the strong presence of RC Davao in the city, with the assistance of RC Davao officers and members, and with the rapid increase in the population of Davao City, the need to establish more Rotary Clubs in the four corners of the city was eventually established, and more, as the years progressed. The status of the RC Davao as the first Rotary Club in the city became more pronounced with the increase in the number of clubs, as it came to be referred to as the "Mother Club."

Throughout all the years of its existence, weathering all crises, both external and internal, RC Davao has remained the club with the biggest number of members, both regular and even for the senior active. It is also the first club to have its own clubhouse, as well as a daycare center, both of which are located in Camus Street.

In its many years of existence, the club used to conduct its meetings in some of the city's fine hotels and restaurants, like the Apo View Hotel, for several years, then





transferred to Terraza Milesa, again for a while, then later on Hotel Maguindanao, just to name a few. The change of venue was usually dictated by some members' desire to taste different cuisine, the incumbent president's bias, and sometimes, for comfort and easy accessibility... especially for some participating members of the club, who were starting to become old. Time was, when the club also had the distinction of having the oldest average age of members. This was the distinction the club was certainly proud to have. This was the distinction that also caused the gradual loss of several of the members, not due to dropping out but due to debility and even demise.

It was in 1993, during the presidency of Bobby Soriano, when the officers of the club finally decided that it was time to stop wandering around for our Thursday luncheon meetings and finally come home to our clubhouse. Tapping the expertise of an architect member, Sonny Labao, the clubhouse was rearranged to give a way to a bigger meeting hall, the board room was dismantled, the schoolrooms were modified, the whole old-looking building was renovated and refurnished, and finally, our own meeting place, in our very own clubhouse. We have been conducting our weekly meetings and other meetings there since the time of President Apin Isabel, who succeeded President Bobby up to now.

The club's existence has not been without problems and controversies, however, profession and business, as well as differences with their fellow members have sometimes caused many of the membership.

Even our officers, both past and current, have been involved in a few "misunderstandings". Overall, however, as Rotarians, most of us came out of these situations, as wiser and better individuals, and the club emerged stronger and more cohesive than before.

The club was also fortunate to invite into membership Davao's new members of its diplomatic community diplomats from Indonesia, Malaysia, and even Japan. Together with the expatriate active members from Germany, the US as well as Holland, India, Australia, and other countries. The Rotary Club of Davao has become a virtual international melting pot of nationalities and cultures, all actively pursuing the name Rotary goals with the same Rotary Spiritualism anywhere in the world. And while the leadership changes every year, the same zeal and dedication remain, strong as ever, marching on in a continuing history of service, commitment, and international camaraderie.

Already, we are seeing the results of these advances in technology in our daily lives. Cellular phones, computers, and other gadgets have taken over many of our usual routines and soon may be taking over much of our work as well. Even medical diagnosis can now be done by computers. In the not-too-distant future, we shall be riding on flying cars to get to work, driverless and programmed by intelligent computers. We shall also find ourselves daily interacting with talking, functioning robots. I dread to think of the day that we shall soon be recruiting robots into membership into Rotary.

We should all be prepared for these radical and revolutionary changes in our lives and it will all happen within our lifetime. We need to be prepared to accept them and adapt to them.
