

IV. INCREASE OUR ABIILTY TO ADAPT

A. Build a culture of research, innovation, and willingness to take risks

- Submit club monthly reports containing your meeting (regular, board, committee, ACOM), activity (service project or with other organizations), Attendance Report, and other required information in the District 3860 website every 15th of the month;
- Reviewed and updated the Club By-laws and submit, including the Club Constitution and Club History, to the District Secretary or the Chiefs of Staff by August 30, 2023;
