A mission to help the world go green

In 2005, midway through a twoyear assignment with the <u>Peace</u> <u>Corps</u>, Kristin Wegner Guilfoyle returned home to Illinois to attend a friend's wedding. That's when fate came striding down the aisle. At the reception, Wegner Guilfoyle was seated at a table with a judge who was a member of the Rotary Club of Joliet. Wegner Guilfoyle told the judge about her work with

biosand water filters in the Dominican Republic. The next week, at the judge's invitation, she spoke to the Joliet club — and, after she returned to her Peace Corps posting, club members provided her with financial and practical support, as well as some invaluable guidance about the direction of her life.

"It was completely serendipitous," says Wegner Guilfoyle, looking back at the chance seating arrangements at the wedding. "To be honest, I didn't know where I fit in when I started with the Peace Corps. Rotary helped me see how to use some of my different skills in applicable ways to make a difference."

Eighteen years after that fortunate encounter at her friend's wedding, and with the knowledge gained from her Peace Corps experience, a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship, and her own Rotary service, Wegner Guilfoyle has a clearly defined mission: to help the world go green. That impulse was there from the beginning.

"Part of my childhood was learning about the environment," she says. "We always did stuff outdoors, and I would go to environmental education camp. And I remember writing a letter to the local newspaper about pollution." At Purdue University, she began pursuing a degree in civil engineering, but the classes she took, and the emotional impact of the 9/11 attacks, changed her course. "The more I studied and learned," she says, "the more I wanted to work on peace and sustainability and create a positive change in the world."

I. INCREASE OUR IMPACT

A. Eradicate polio and leverage the legacy

- Club contributes a minimum of \$200 or \$10 per member to the PolioPlus program whichever is higher.
- Campaign for New Polio Plus Society Member with at least (1) one member commits to contribute \$100 to the PolioPlus Fund every year.

B. Focus our Programs and Offerings

- Achieve the \$100 per capita club contributions to the Annual Program Fund (APF) and Every
- Rotarian Every Year (EREY).
- Achieve having at least one (1) NEW Major Donor or Major Gift Giving.
- Achieve having at least one (1) NEW TRF Benefactor by contributing \$1,000 to the Endowment Fund (District or Club).
- Achieve having at least one (1) NEW Paul Harris Society Member with a contribution of at least \$1,000 to Annual Fund or PolioPlus fund or combined (PHS Members commit to contribute \$1,000 every year).
- Achieve that Club President and TRF Chair become a Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) or next level PHF.
- Participate in Rotary Foundation Programs by availing of the Grant Program of the Rotary Foundation (District Grant or Global Grant). The District Grant Project must be sustainable.
- Achieve the RI challenge of Count Down To End Polio Initiative recognizing clubs with a contribution of \$1,500 or more to the PolioPlus Fund (Individual giving or Club's total giving).
- Special Citation/Recognition for establishing a new endowment fund, Individual or Club (minimum of \$25,000).

C. Improve our ability to achieve and measure impact

- Undertake at least one (1) project in each of the Seven Areas of Focus.
- Require at least a minimum of five (5) members participate in a service project.
- Establish a partnership with a Rotary Club, government or non-government organization/s participating in a service project.
- Participate in the Rotary New Year with Children: Today's Children, Rotary's Future on July 1, 2023 covering varied Areas of Focus.
- Participate in the Bloodletting: Dugo Mo, Buhay Ko on July 15, 2023 covering the Disease Prevention and Treatment Area of Focus.
