The world is gradually but surely, becoming populated by a population of aging people. It started with a succession of two world wars wherein many of the able bodied and young people were fielded into battle, eventually resulting in the loss of lives of more than a million mostly young people from both sides of the conflict, leaving their respective countries with mostly older surviving non-combatants.

Then came a series of plagues and famine, affecting mostly, the less developed countries, causing the death of the more vulnerable, the children. With the rapid advances in Science, particularly Medical Science, the life span of many men and women, especially in the more advanced countries, were considerably increased, allowing a large number of their population to live well into their ninety's. Coupled with a successful campaign on birth control and the rapid deployment of women into the executive and working class, taking them away from housewife and motherhood roles, the regular addition of children into the population markedly slowed down, disproportionately to the increasing number of elderly individuals who were now living much longer. Thus, especially in first world countries, one can find more elderly individuals and less and less people below the age of fifty. Within the next decade or so, this will start to pose an economic and social problem to these countries as there will be more people that are less productive but who will need more care and services, which will of course be more demanding on society's time, effort and cost.

In the Philippines, this is not yet an impending problem as we are still quite a prolific people and hundreds of children are still being born everyday across the archipelago. What we would be having in the near future instead is a population explosion, which could also prove to be an economic and social problem to the country. But if we could successfully harness this increasing population into a highly skilled workforce, our problem may just become the solution to the problem of the aging population of our aging neighbor countries.

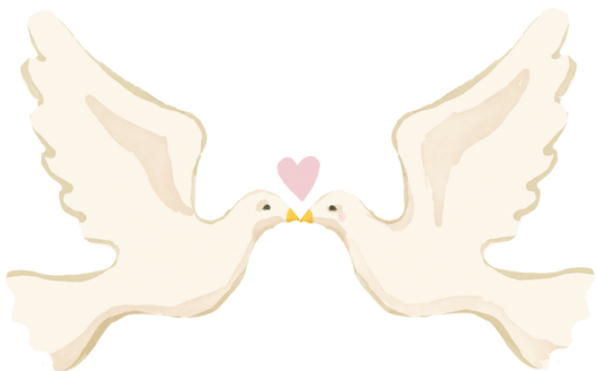

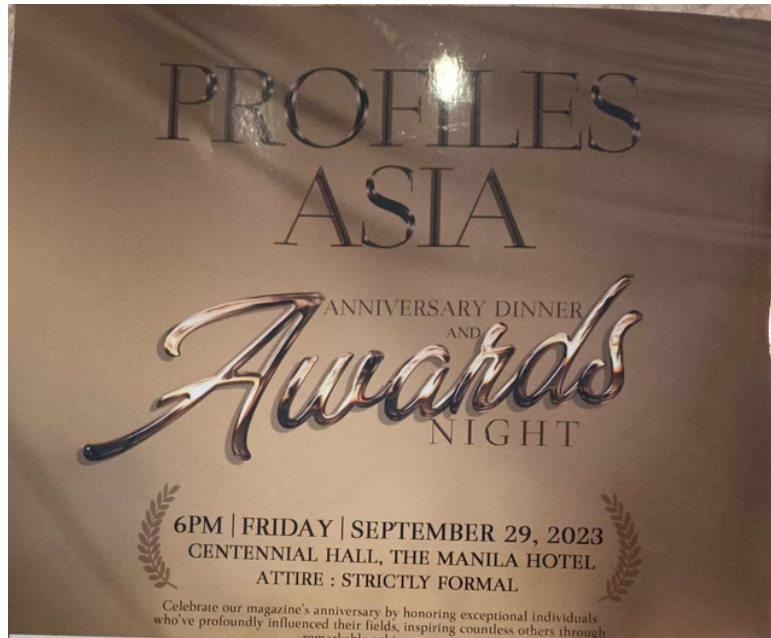
Theme: **BARBENHEIMER**

Pep-c earned his degree in Business Administration from Xavier University and began his career in the banking industry at Far East Bank. After several years, he married Gemma Tumaming, also a banker, in 1992. The couple relocated to Davao to manage the Velez Hizon family business in Davao and Cagayan de Oro. They have a son named Jiolo, who graduated from Ateneo de Manila and pursued a law degree.

Inheriting properties from his family, Pep-c took charge of their management and sought to make a positive difference in the area. He developed commercial properties for leasing and forged strategic partnerships to enhance the value of the estates. One notable partnership was with Phoenix Properties, resulting in the development of two prominent properties: Arrezo, a sprawling Italian-inspired development, and elegant townhouses designed by the renowned Filipino architect Manosa, located in Barangay Pampanga, Davao.

He actively participated in the Rotary Club of Davao and spearheaded projects focused on education, youth development, and environmental protection. 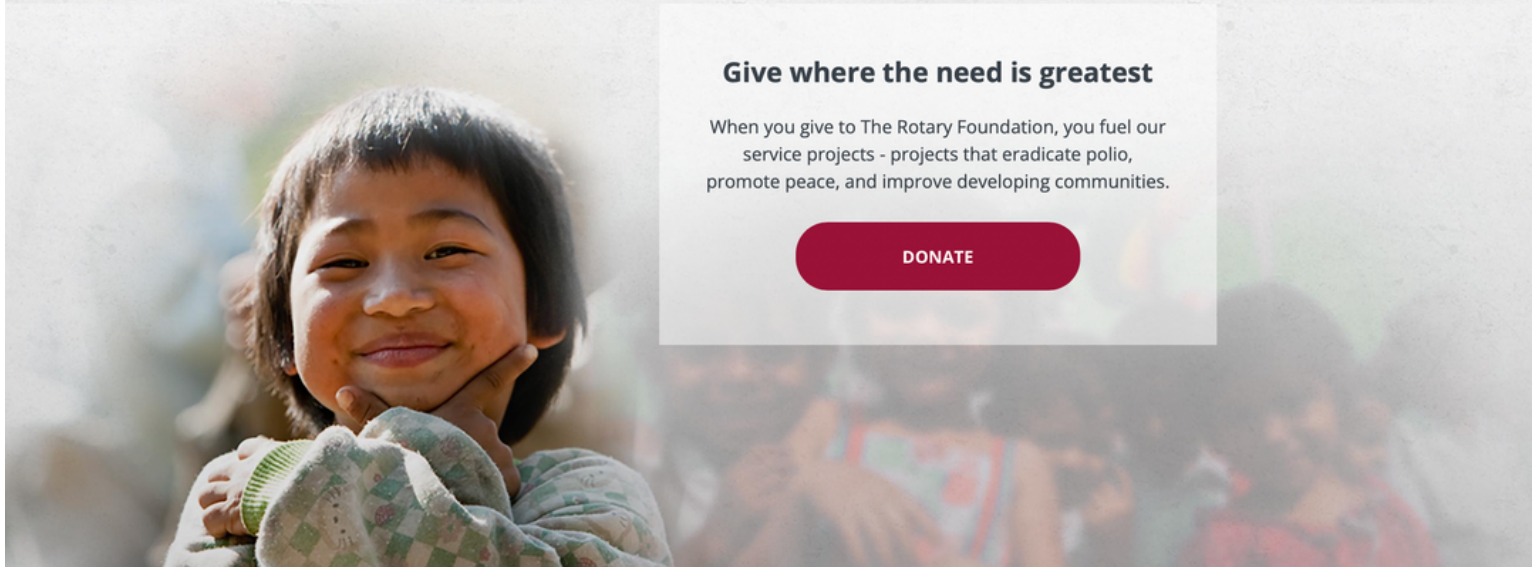

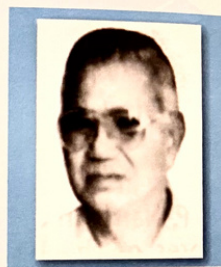
