History of Rotary Club of Davao

Just a year and a half after the Municipality of Davao achieved city status, a significant milestone emerged: the Rotary Club of Davao, the pioneering Rotary Club in Mindanao, received its charter on October 24, 1938. With 24 charter members who were prominent professionals and businessmen from diverse backgrounds – Filipinos, Americans, Spanish, Japanese, and Chinese – the club embodied a fusion of cultures and expertise that mirrored the nascent city of Davao. Notably, the inaugural Vice-President of the club was none other than Santiago Artiaga, Davao City's first mayor, while the Charter President was American entrepreneur Fitz Reed. Remarkably, RC Davao became the second club within District 3860, following the Rotary Club of Cebu, both sponsored by RC Manila.

From its inception in 1938 until 1942, the Rotary Club of Davao flourished in both membership and service, mirroring the city's gradual growth. Yet, the outbreak of World War II in 1942 necessitated a hiatus of about three years as the club's energies shifted towards the pressing needs of war and survival, relegating Rotary activities to the background. The club emerged from the ashes of conflict in 1946, led by President Leon Garcia, Sr., determined to reclaim its role in the community. From that point onward, the club's trajectory remained undeterred, fostering growth, impactful endeavors, and local influence.

As RC Davao asserted its presence in the city, the club, in collaboration with its officers and members, responded to the city's burgeoning population by establishing additional Rotary Clubs, a trend that persisted over the years. With its steadfast growth, RC Davao earned the moniker "Mother Club," a testament to its status as the pioneering Rotary Club in the city, especially as the number of clubs increased. Throughout the years, even in the face of external and internal challenges, RC Davao retained the distinction of having the largest membership, encompassing both regular and senior active members. Remarkably, it was the first club to possess its own clubhouse and a daycare center, both situated on Camus Street.

Over its extensive history, the club convened meetings at various esteemed venues such as Apo View Hotel, Terraza Milesa, and Hotel Maguindanao. Changes in location often stemmed from members' culinary preferences, the incumbent president's inclinations, or the comfort and accessibility needed by aging participants. The club once held the distinction of having the highest average member age, a source of pride but also one that led to the gradual loss of members due to aging or unfortunate passing.



History of Rotary Club of Davao

A turning point occurred in 1993, during President Bobby Soriano's tenure, as the club made the decision to establish a permanent home for its Thursday luncheon meetings. Under the guidance of architect member Sonny Labao, the clubhouse underwent a transformation, resulting in a more spacious meeting hall and upgraded facilities. This pivotal move brought continuity and stability to the club's gatherings, fostering a sense of unity and belonging among members.

Undoubtedly, the club encountered its share of challenges and controversies, including professional and business disputes among members. However, these experiences ultimately served to refine individuals and strengthen the club's cohesion. The Rotary Club of Davao was also fortunate to welcome diplomats from Indonesia, Malaysia, Japan, and other nations into its membership, alongside expatriate active members from countries including Germany, the United States, the Netherlands, India, and Australia. This diverse composition transformed the Rotary Club of Davao into a vibrant international melting pot, united by shared Rotary ideals.

In 2023, the Rotary Club of Davao made history by electing its first female president, May Divino, marking a significant departure from its earlier male-dominated history. Over the years, this club has consistently demonstrated unwavering passion and dedication, contributing significantly to the community and perpetuating a rich legacy of service, commitment, and global camaraderie. Moreover, the club has welcomed more female and younger members, and it even has members from different nationalities such as Austrians, Sri Lankans, and Koreans.

The Rotary Club of Davao's 85th Charter Anniversary celebration is essential for reflecting on the club's remarkable journey, highlighting its immense contributions to the community, and marking this event as a significant and historic milestone in their ongoing mission of service and fellowship. It's also a tribute to the past presidents who have helped the club stand strong even after 85 years. Additionally, it recognizes the club's current partners, including sister clubs, LGUs, and NGOs.

In celebrating the Rotary Club of Davao's 85th Charter Anniversary, we honor not just its past achievements but also look forward to a future filled with even greater opportunities to make a positive impact on our community and the world.

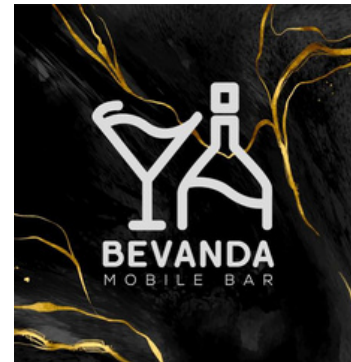

Born and raised in Bukidnon, he graduated from the Philippine Military Academy in 1986 and embarked on a remarkable journey. He initially served as a member of the 1st Scout Ranger Regiment, earning military merit medal and military commendation medal for his role in suppressing a local communist rebellion.

His journey continued as he pursued a legal education at Ateneo de Davao University, all while serving as a spokesperson for the Davao Region Police Office in 1998. After being assigned with the PNP Criminal Investigation and Detection Group in Quezon City in 2002, he transferred to José Rizal University where he completed his Bachelor of Laws in 2004 and was admitted to the Philippine Bar in May 2005. He was also the provincial police chief of Bukidnon from 2005 to 2007.

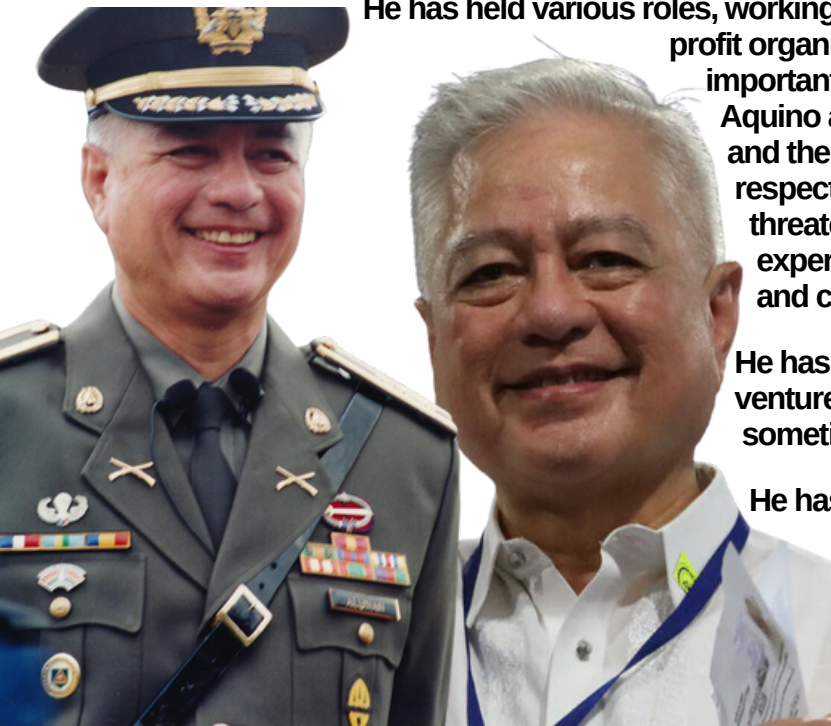
He made significant contributions during his tenure at the Calabarzon Region Police Office in Calamba, Laguna. His legal skills and leadership abilities were instrumental in reducing backlog cases among police personnel. He continued to ascend the ranks, earning accolades and promotions along the way.

In 2017, he was appointed as Chief of the Directorial Staff of the Philippine National Police, in 2018 he became the Deputy Chief for Operations, and in 2019 he became the officer-in-charge of the Philippine National Police. In 2020, President Rodrigo Duterte officially appointed him as the 23rd Chief of PNP. His responsibilities included overseeing security for the 2019 Philippine general election and the implementation of the 2019 Bangsamoro autonomy plebiscite. Notably, he held important government positions under two presidents, Cory Aquino and Fidel Ramos, leading the Department of Tourism and the Department of Interior and Local Government, respectively. Throughout his life, he has faced life-threatening situations on land, in the air, and at sea. These experiences have shaped his approach to risk reduction and crisis management.

He has also been dedicated to promoting peace and even ventured into rebel territory to advocate for peace, sometimes even entering dangerous zones.

He has tackled crime and corruption using legal means has collaborated to counter foreign terrorists to save lives. He believes that addressing poverty is contingent on establishing peace and order as a foundation for sustainable development. He fought against the dictatorship to seek justice for its and to defend freedom when it was threatened.

Over time, he has delved into geopolitical issues, emphasizing the importance of interdependence and nation-building.

His mission is to serve, make a meaningful impact in people's lives, and give back to society. This commitment has come at a great personal cost, with significant time away from his family and modest government compensation. He left government service financially poorer than when he started and felt that his peers were better off upon returning to the private sector. Today, he is dedicated to giving back, sharing the lessons he has learned, investing in education, and assisting disaster victims, at-risk youth, and impoverished communities. His service is driven by his values, and he approaches it with dedication, regardless of the hours involved.

He is also connected to the military community through his affiliation with the PMA Class of 1974, PNP-Special Action Force, and the Special Forces Regiment (Airborne) and First Scout Ranger Regiment of the Philippine Army. He holds the rank of Colonel in the Armed Forces and has commanded two Army Infantry Reserve Divisions. National security, encompassing human and ecological security, civil defense, and national defense, holds a special place in his heart.

According to him, "Our duty calls us to defend our nation, but we also welcome the support of our economic partners and security allies as we work together to build a peaceful, prosperous, and progressive nation where no one is left behind. We must demand results rather than being defeated by our past failures.
