Rotary Club hosts Dr. Chaabo; speaks about unheard Palestinian victims of war

Speaking Wednesday at the Rotary Club of China Lake luncheon was Dr. Hani Chaabo; local physician and medical director of Well-being at Ridgecrest Regional Hospital. Dr. Chaabo came to speak about the often-unseen plight of Palestinian civilians during the resurgent conflict between Hamas and the Israeli government. “Because Americans have a perspective, which is valid and beautiful actually, but also sometimes that perspective doesn’t include our perspective,” Chaabo said, speaking about how the United States tends to be pro-Israel, and wanting to show the Arab side of the war. The presentation included the history of the region; such as Britain’s 1917 Balfour Declaration supporting the formation of a Jewish state, the proper creation of Israel in 1948, and the aftermath of the Six-Day War.

Chaabo wanted to make the point that, contrary to Western views, the region has not always been a Jewish state. His graphs show that Jewish control of the region, including the ancient kingdom of Judah and modern Israel, has only been about 450 years, around 11% of the past 4,000. The combined duration of the region’s Christian and Muslim kingdoms and empires were still less than the period of non-Abrahamic colonization; from the empires of Egypt, Babylon, Persia, and Rome.

According to Chaabo, prior to the formation of the state of Israel, the Muslim and Jewish population of the area lived together comfortably. Both religions experienced discrimination from regional Christians. An important point that Chaabo wanted to make is that the war is actually about extremists in Hamas against fellow extremists in the Israeli government. Roughly 30% of both populations support and desire these destructive conflicts, dehumanizing and wanting to exterminate the other. The remaining 70% of Palestinians are brutalized and chased off their lands while the 70% of Israelis can only watch from the sidelines as it happens; Israelis who attempt to protect their neighbors, or complete strangers on principal, get attacked as well. According to Chaabo, both Palestinian and Israeli children are educated with propaganda that villianizes the other side, creating more extremists in the future. In particular Palestinian children deal with a lifetime of continued trauma - losing family and friends, living in poverty, being attacked personally, or witnessing ongoing bombings and warfare — that naturally leads to an-easily provoked desire to victimize in turn.

His presentation included chilling footage of old, veteran Israeli soldiers reminiscing about anti-Palestinian atrocities they committed during previous wars; laughing about kills they’ve made or casually discussing old friends dragging women off to rape them. Other material presented was a collection of recent quotes from the Israeli government; heads of state calling Palestinians “animals” and calling for them to be brutalized and killed. Other slides showed cartoons made by Palestinians about the horrors they’ve experienced; witnessing a man carrying the pieces of his dead son in a garbage bag, or a grieving mother, cradling her dead son, surrounded by the Western media demanding that she condemn Hamas’ actions against Israel. Chaabo wants Americans to compare modern Israel, and its treatment of Palestinians, to Apartheid South Africa. Included was footage of former-President Jimmy Carter making said comparison. Another slide demonstrated that both countries used similar laws and policies against their populace; including racial classification, mass displacement, and granting token independence.

After his presentation, Chaabo answered some questions. When asked what the ideal post-peace nations of Palestine or Israel would look like, he said, “In my mind equality is important, whether that’s in one state altogether or two states that are neighboring states that can have mutual collaboration.” The final question that Chaabo took was if felt that the United States and international community should be responsible for holding both the leadership of Hamas and Israel accountable, to which he replied, “I would love to see Netanyahu in jail. I would love to see the head of Hamas in jail. But also to provide avenues where people can have reconciliation, can listen to each other, can hear each other. Because when we hear each other we understand each other. And that’s the first step to reconciliation.”
