Heavenly Father,

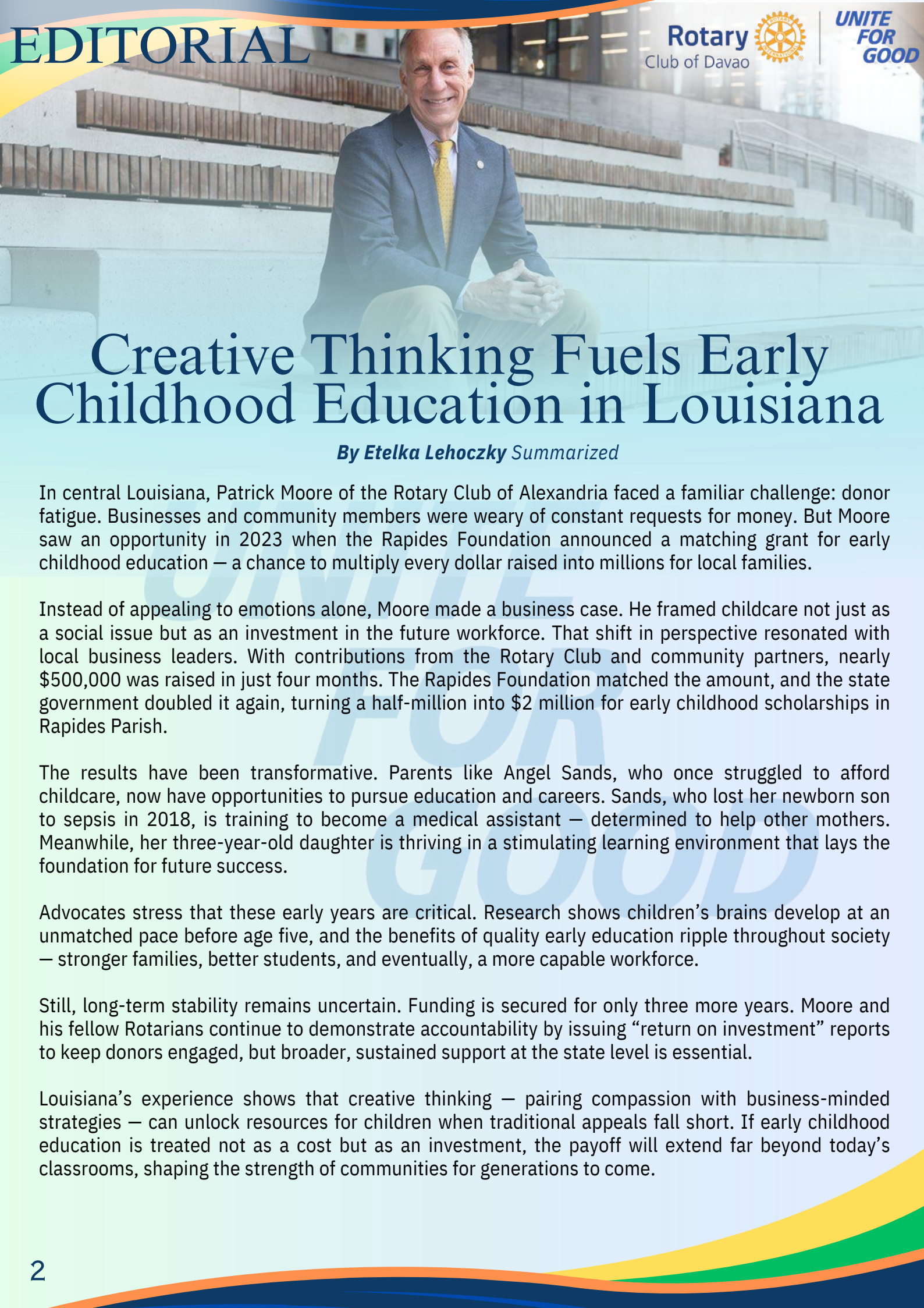

Creative Thinking Fuels Early Childhood Education in Louisiana

In central Louisiana, Patrick Moore of the Rotary Club of Alexandria faced a familiar challenge: donor fatigue. Businesses and community members were weary of constant requests for money. But Moore saw an opportunity in 2023 when the Rapides Foundation announced a matching grant for early childhood education — a chance to multiply every dollar raised into millions for local families.

Instead of appealing to emotions alone, Moore made a business case. He framed childcare not just as a social issue but as an investment in the future workforce. That shift in perspective resonated with local business leaders. With contributions from the Rotary Club and community partners, nearly \$500,000 was raised in just four months. The Rapides Foundation matched the amount, and the state government doubled it again, turning a half-million into \$2 million for early childhood scholarships in Rapides Parish.

The results have been transformative. Parents like Angel Sands, who once struggled to afford childcare, now have opportunities to pursue education and careers. Sands, who lost her newborn son to sepsis in 2018, is training to become a medical assistant — determined to help other mothers. Meanwhile, her three-year-old daughter is thriving in a stimulating learning environment that lays the foundation for future success.

Advocates stress that these early years are critical. Research shows children's brains develop at an unmatched pace before age five, and the benefits of quality early education ripple throughout society — stronger families, better students, and eventually, a more capable workforce.

Still, long-term stability remains uncertain. Funding is secured for only three more years. Moore and his fellow Rotarians continue to demonstrate accountability by issuing "return on investment" reports to keep donors engaged, but broader, sustained support at the state level is essential.

Louisiana's experience shows that creative thinking — pairing compassion with business-minded strategies — can unlock resources for children when traditional appeals fall short. If early childhood education is treated not as a cost but as an investment, the payoff will extend far beyond today's classrooms, shaping the strength of communities for generations to come.
