In India, Rotary members help to draw young players to the game and its gifts

India's extraordinary passion for chess is reshaping education, opportunity, and community life across the country. On any given weekend, hundreds of children can be found gathering for fiercely competitive tournaments in cities like Chennai, carrying chessboards instead of beach towels, inspired by national heroes such as world champion Gukesh Dommaraju. From bustling metropolises to remote villages, chess in India now commands an enthusiasm comparable to professional basketball in the United States or Premier League football in England, with many families viewing it as a gateway to academic success and global recognition.

This modern chess boom is being quietly strengthened by Rotary clubs throughout India, which sponsor tournaments, collaborate with academies, and help widen access to the game. Their efforts support a growing ecosystem of elite training centers, frequent competitions, and pathways for talented players from disadvantaged backgrounds. Coaches and educators increasingly see chess as a tool not only for producing champions, but for sharpening memory, discipline, and critical thinking — benefits reinforced by research showing measurable academic gains among students who receive chess training.

The game's impact is illustrated through deeply personal stories. Chess has lifted players out of poverty, helped children focus and excel in school, and given young prodigies the confidence to compete on international stages. In Kerala's village of Marottichal, chess even helped replace a past marked by alcoholism and gambling with a shared culture of strategy and learning. For players with physical or mental disabilities, chess offers a rare level playing field, fostering confidence, independence, and purpose.

As India rises as a global chess power with a growing number of grandmasters and record-breaking young players, chess continues to prove its broader value. Beyond trophies and titles, the game teaches patience, resilience, and the importance of thinking ahead — lessons that extend far beyond the board and shape lives, families, and communities.
