‘Success is collective,’ says recipient of Rotary’s 2026 Sylvia Whitlock Leadership Award

Egyptian Rotarian has elevated female leaders, promoted microloans, and helped build an 800-student school

Mayan Raslan, the 2026 recipient of Rotary’s Sylvia Whitlock Leadership Award, embodies the belief that true success is never achieved alone but shared with others. A member of the Rotary Club of Cairo Royal, Egypt, she has consistently dedicated her career to empowering individuals—particularly women—to rise into leadership roles and reach their full potential.

Inspired early on by her mother’s work in social service, Raslan developed a deep commitment to community impact. She went on to earn a Ph.D. in Management and Administration from Cairo University and has since contributed her expertise to numerous nongovernmental organizations, government institutions, and financial bodies. Within Rotary, where she has been a member since 1999, she has taken on various leadership roles, always advocating for inclusivity and opportunity.

Her influence was especially evident during her tenure as District 2451 governor (2016–2017), where she actively promoted women’s participation. Through targeted initiatives, she helped significantly increase female membership and established a women’s empowerment committee that remains active today. This committee has implemented programs such as microloans, vocational and leadership training, and job preparation support, all aimed at creating sustainable, long-term change.

Raslan also emphasizes that meaningful service must go beyond short-term solutions. She ensures that every project she supports integrates structural improvements, particularly in uplifting women within communities. Her leadership was clearly demonstrated in a collaborative, multiyear effort to build a school in Fayoum, which now serves more than 800 students and stands as a testament to the power of collective action.

For Raslan, leadership is about creating opportunities for others to lead. As she affirms, “Leaders create leaders,” reinforcing her belief that success is always a shared and collective journey.

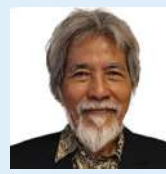

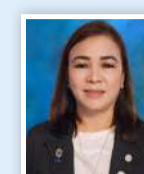
