

TO IMPROVE LIVES.

Today, 19 million people who would otherwise be paralyzed by polio are walking, and 1.5 million people who would otherwise have died are alive.

TO INVEST IN THE FUTURE.

If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year. A polio-free world will be a healthier world for children everywhere.

TO IMPROVE CHILD HEALTH.

Polio surveillance networks and vaccination campaigns also monitor children for other health problems, like vitamin deficiency and measles, so we can address them sooner.

4 TO LOWER HEALTH CARE COSTS.

The global effort to eradicate polio has already saved more than \$27 billion in health care costs since 1988, and expects to save \$14 billion more by 2050.

TO MAKE HISTORY.


Polio eradication will be one of history's greatest public health achievements, with polio following smallpox to become only the second human disease eradicated from the world.

RCDD'S HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS RY 1993-1994 to RY 2020-2021

PDS/PP Marina Bello-Ruivivar Club Historian

Chartered on February 23, 1993, RCDD started as an all-women service club with 27 lady executives of varied professions and vocations, led by Charter President Evelyn A. Magno, who became the first Lady District Governor in RY 2005-2006. The whole Rotary world was then celebrating the 88th Foundation Anniversary of Rotary International, when RCDD became the 29,258th Rotary club all over the world, and the 79th club in District 3860.

Only on its first year, RCDD was already blazing the trail and raising the bar for Rotary clubs in the District, winning awards and recognitions year after year, either as Most Outstanding Club, President, Secretary, Club Bulletin, and/or other Service Awards, with the following as the most significant:

RY 1993-94: the only club in the District to get the RI Presidential Citation for a "Balanced Club Achievement Award". An awardee as the "Most Outstanding Club, President, Secretary and club bulletin" in the District for category III (New clubs). Club President: CP Evelyn A. Magno.

RY 1998-1999: winning a grand slam of all District major awards: "Most Outstanding Club, President, Secretary, and Club Bulletin (The Professionals)". Club President: Linda C. Tesoro.

RY 2011-2012: recognized as a one hundred (100%) percent Paul Harris Fellow Club. Club President: Enerie B. Aquino.

RY 2016-2017: the RI Rotarian Spouse Service Award was awarded to RCDD Spouse Archie Francisco F. Gamboa, spouse of then club President Rozanne C. Gamboa. He was the only awardee from the Philippines during the year, and one among the 50 awardees all over the world. RCDD is a Rotary International Significant Achievement Awardee. Club President: Rozanne C. Gamboa.

RY 2018-2019: PP Rozanne C. Gamboa and Spouse Archie F. Gamboa were recognized as the lone District awardees for "Rotarian Couple Polio Plus Achiever" and RCDD as a "Polio Fund Club Achiever". Club President: Josefa P. Ortiz.

LANDMARKS PROJECTS:

- Center for Hope a Multi-purpose building which houses the Day Care Center, Medical-Dental, Pre-Natal and Health Center, and the workshop for Skills Training, serving the families in Barangays Centro and Vicente Duterte, Agdao District.
- 2. Children's Mini-Library and Reading Center at People's Park, Davao City.
- 3. Shelter for Abused Women and Children at the PNP Police Regional Office XI, Camp Mericido, Catitipan, Davao City.
- 4. Hospital beds and facilities at the PNP-PRO XI Hospital, Camp Mericido, Catitipan, Davao City.
- 5. Comfort rooms and Handwashing Stations at various public elementary and secondary schools in Davao City.
- 6. Wheelchair donations to patients in remote barangays in Davao City.

- 7. Annual Tri-Medical Mission: Medical-Dental, Pre-natal and Eye Health Care.
- 8. Annual Pink October: Breast Cancer Awareness, Health Forum, Breast Screening, Mammogram and Zumba Health Fitness.
- 9. Rotary School of Hope classrooms for the children in Conflict with the Law and Street children at the DCPO compound.
- Alternative Learning System (ALS) for children in Conflict with the Law and out-of-School Youth in Davao City. (Solar Learning)

RCDD became a mixed club in RY 2018-2019, when it inducted the first two gentlemen: PNP Chief Archie Francisco F. Gamboa and Businessman Paulino B. Ko. As of RY **2020-2021**, RCDD has 30 members. The club meets every Wednesday at the Grand Men Seng Hotel, A. Pichon Street, and its virtual meetings via Zoom.
