## EMPOWERING GIRLS

A 2021-22 Presidential Initiative




### The Empowering Girls Initiative

Through the Empowering Girls Initiative, Rotary members worldwide can enhance girls' safety, health, education, and well-being.

### Education and skills

- The United Nations says 60 million girls worldwide have no access to basic education.
- Of the 960 million people who are illiterate worldwide, two-thirds are women.
- In many regions, schools do not meet the safety, hygiene, or sanitation needs of girls.
- Globally, 1 in 4 girls ages 15-19 are neither employed nor in school, compared with 1 in 10 boys.



### The legacy of empowering girls

The Empowering Girls initiative should be the start of Rotary making a lasting impact on a generation of girls.

We can make a difference in girls' lives by:

- Advocating for the public and private sectors to support girls
- Raising awareness of girls' needs in our communities, our social networks, and our partnerships — as we've done with our polio-eradication work

### Why empower girls?

- It makes families healthier.
- Educated girls have better-educated children and earn higher wages, helping get their families out of poverty.
- Women participating in the labor market at the same rate as men would add up to \$28 trillion to the annual global gross domestic product in 2025, shares the World Economic Forum.
- Every girl should be in charge of her own future. We have an obligation to protect girls' rights and promote their well-being.



### A preference for sons

- A preference for sons can lead to sex selection through abortion, infanticide, and other means.
- The world population is believed to lack an estimated 140 million women because of parents' preference for sons.
- Since the 1990s, in some regions, up to 25% more males have been born than females.
- In more than 5 of 6 countries with available data, girls ages 10-14 are more likely than boys of the same age to spend 21 or more hours per week on household chores.



### Violence against girls

- Of all human trafficking victims, 51% are women and 20% are girls.
- 1 in 20 girls ages 15-19, about 13 million globally, have been subjected to forced sex.
- Every year, an estimated 60 million girls are sexually assaulted on their way to school or at school.
- Nearly 4 in 10 adolescent girls think wife-beating is justified in some circumstances.



### Health and nutrition

- In the past two decades, only minimal progress has been made in reducing the number of girls ages 5-19 who are moderately or severely underweight.
- In South Asia, where virtually no progress has been made since 1995, 1 in 5 girls is moderately or severely underweight.
- The proportion of girls ages 5-19 who are overweight has nearly doubled since 1995, from 9% to 17%.

### WHAT CAN ROTARY DO?

Rotary clubs and districts can participate by creating and implementing projects that enhance the quality of life for girls and improves girls' chances of enjoying safe, healthy, and productive lives. They can also modify existing projects to include components that focus on empowering girls.

- What challenges do girls face in our community?
- How can our club work with communities to find solutions to these challenges?
- What cultural norms in our area might keep girls from attending school?
- Which local organizations can we work with on projects that empower girls?
- How can we raise awareness of the need to empower girls within our communities and among our partners?
- Does our club empower women to take leadership roles?

# ROTARY CLUB OF DOWNTOWN DAVAO

WOMEN MAKE ROTARY BETTER  
RY 1993-1994 to RY 2021-2022

The Rotary Club of Downtown Davao (RCDD), chartered on February 23, 1993, started as an all-women service club with 27 founding members from various professions and vocations. Its charter president, Evelyn Abellera-Magno, Ed.D., holds the distinction of being the first woman District Governor of Rotary International (RI) District 3860 in RY 2005-2006.

The whole Rotary world was then celebrating the 88th Foundation Anniversary of Rotary International, when RCDD became the 29,258th Rotary club all over the world, and the 79th club in District 3860.

RCDD truly showed that having women in Rotary makes Rotary better. And having women leading Rotary makes it more creative, innovative and dynamic. Because just on its first year, RCDD was already blazing the trail and raising the bar for Rotary clubs in the District, winning awards and recognitions year after year, either as Most Outstanding Club, President, Secretary, Club Bulletin, and/or other Service Awards, with the following as the most significant:

**RY 1993-1994:** RCDD was the only club in the District to get the RI Presidential Citation for "Balanced Club Achievement Award." It received four major awards on its first year, namely - most outstanding club, president, secretary and club bulletin in the District for category III (New clubs). Club President: CP Evelyn A. Magno.

**RY 1998-1999:** RCDD won the grand slam of all District major awards: "Most Outstanding Club, President, Secretary, and Club Bulletin (The Professionals)". Club President: Linda C. Tesoro

**RY 2011-2012:** RCDD was recognized as a one hundred (100%) percent Paul Harris Fellow Club. Club President: Enerie B. Aquino.

**RY 2016-2017:** RCDD President Roxanne C. Gamboa's spouse, Archie Francisco F. Gamboa, received the "Rotary International Rotarian Spouse Service Award." He was the only awardee from the Philippines during the year, and one of the 50 awardees all over the world.

RCDD was recognized as a Rotary International Significant Achievement Awardee. Club President: Rozanne C. Gamboa.

RY 2018-2019: PP Rozanne C. Gamboa and Spouse Archie F. Gamboa were recognized as the lone District awardees for "Rotarian Couple Polio Plus Achiever" and RCDD as a "Polio Fund Club Achiever." Club President: Josefa P. Ortiz.

Women's leadership in Rotary also significantly contributed to having Rotary community projects that are innovative and first-of-its-kind. Among the landmark projects initiated by RCDD which earned the recognition and appreciation of the Davao City local government are the following:

**Center for Hope** - a community center at the heart of Agdao district, which used to be known as the "killing fields of Davao."

It has a day-care center, a medical-dental clinic, a maternal health center, and training and livelihood center.

**Children's Mini-Library and Reading Center** at People's Park, Davao City

**Shelter for Abused Women and Children** at the Philippine National Police Regional Headquarters at Camp Mercialdo, Davao City

**Rotary School of Hope**, a community learning for the Children in Conflict with the Law at the Davao City Police Office (DCPO) compound

**Scholarship to Online Alternative Learning System (ALS)** for Children in Conflict with the Law and Out-of-School Youth in Davao City

**Furnishing the PNP XI Regional Hospital** with hospital beds and facilities at Camp Mercialdo, Davao City

**Promoting sanitation and access to water** by schoolchildren through the building of toilets and handwashing stations at various public elementary and secondary schools in Davao City

**Promoting access and mobility to Persons with Disability (PWD)** through wheelchair donations to patients in remote barangays in Davao City

**Annual Medical Mission** with medical, dental, pre-natal, and eye care serving indigent patients in poor communities

**Annual Pink October** for Breast Cancer Awareness, Health Forum, Breast Screening, Mammogram and Zumba Health Fitness

RCDD became a mixed club in RY 2018-2019, when it inducted its first two male members — PNP Chief Archie Francisco F. Gamboa and businessman Paulino B. Ko.

RCDD also has one of the most active Rotaract clubs in the District. And even before the proclamation of a Rotarian-Rotaract dual membership, RCDD has already inducted into its membership the Charter President of the RCDD Rotaract Club of Tecarro College Foundation, Inc., Alstair Rey L. Tecarro, Jr., in RY 2019-2020. Alstair served as the District Rotaract Representative in RY 2018-2019. He will soon be the Pilipinas Rotaract Multi-District Informational Organization Chairperson for RY 2023, the first for District 3860. Another pride of RCDD!

Another RCDD milestone is the selection of Past President/Past Asst.Governor Rozanne "Twinkle" C. Gamboa as the District Governor-Nominee Designate in RY 2020-2021, soon to be the District Governor come RY 2023-2024, the second woman District Governor from RCDD.

DGND Twinkle's spouse, Rtn. Archie Gamboa, will also make history as the first male President of RCDD in RY 2022-2023.

At present, RCDD has 33 members — 29 females and 4 males. The club meets every Wednesday noon at the Grand Men Seng Hotel, A. Pichon Street, Davao City. While the city is in quarantine because of the coronavirus pandemic, club meetings and activities are being held online.

With the leadership of RCDD's new club president, Police Major Andrea "Andeng" G. Dela Cerna, and her team of officers who mostly belong to the New Generation, the club expects more creative, innovative, and dynamic ways of planting the Rotary seeds of service in the new normal.
