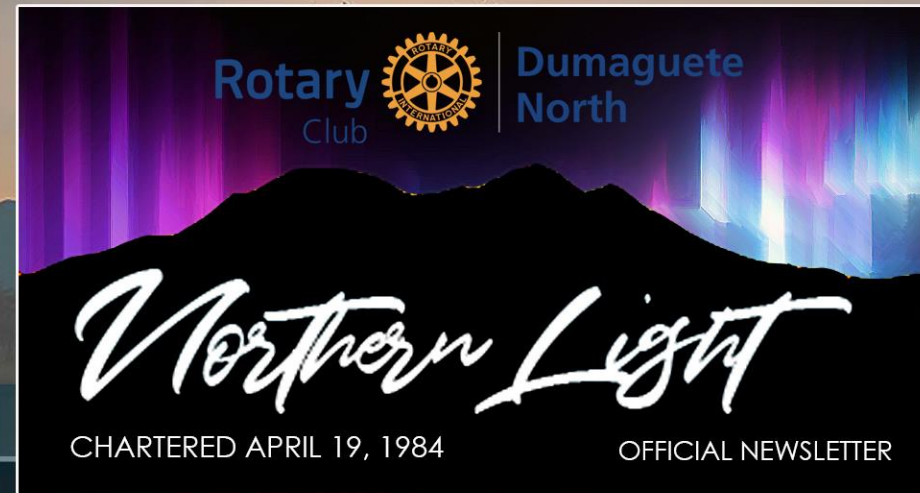

JUST THIS MORNING, on my way to the office, I passed over a young girl along Camanjac School, who was missing a right arm. And yet, when I glanced at her, she was smiling. It was then that I remembered a short story at her, she was smiling. It was then that I remembered a short story told by a friend of mine some time ago. The story goes like this:

"Because of a car accident, twelve-year old John lost the whole of his left. Because of this, John was devastated and became a recluse. He no longer wanted to interact with anybody. On his thirteenth birthday, a friend of his father who is a Judo martial arts coach tried to talk to John for the latter to join the Judo youth team. The Judo coach was such a smooth-talker and persuasive fellow that John was convinced, and John indeed joined the Judo team.

For the whole three months, the Judo coach taught only one Judo technique to John. For the upcoming National Judo Tournament, the Coach announced that John will be part of the team as a substitute. During the final team match, the main player of John's team was injured and he needs to be replaced. The coach called on John to replace their main player. Since the match was a tie, the next score is very crucial and will decide who will be the champion. The audience upon seeing John without his left arm, laughs at him. in vain.

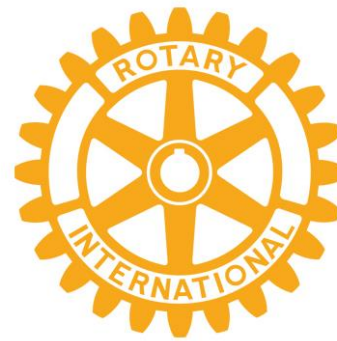
I'll observe service above self,
