As Rotarians, what is really the significance of this test in our daily lives?

The Rotary Club's Four-Way Test is a SET OF ETHICAL PRINCIPLES that guide the actions and decisions of Rotarians all over the globe. It holds significant importance within our club and constitutes the minimum required standard to ASSESS the ethical implications of one's thoughts, words, and actions.

Moreover, the significance of the Four-Way Test lies in its role in promoting ETHICAL BEHAVIOR, INTEGRITY, AND GOODWILL among Rotary members and in their interactions with others. It serves as a MORAL COMPASS, helping Rotarians make decisions that are not only legal and fair but also morally right. By applying this test, Rotary aims to foster a CULTURE OF ETHICAL LEADERSHIP and SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY, ultimately contributing to the betterment of individuals and communities around the world.

Finally, as your servant-leader, allow me to emphasize to all my esteemed Brothers in Rotary the need to FAITHFULLY OBSERVE the Four-Way Test and not to take it for granted. Full compliance thereof is a very difficult personal struggle. A choice towards perfection. That is our ultimate goal. However, no one is perfect. Everyone commits a mistake not only once, twice, thrice but many times. Yet, let it be our extreme sacrifice as a Rotarian and on the belief that we are competent to fully discharge, to the best of our abilities, all the responsibilities and obligations as club members of Dumaguete North. ROTARY TRIVIA

"Meet my Rotary Ann!" How did this come about???

Wives of Rotarians around the world originally (and sometimes still) were called 'Rotary Anns.' But, with the spread of feminism and an increasingly negative attitude against the all-male movement, 'Rotary Ann' became a demeaning term. In some cases it became a divisive term as well; as Rotary Anns formed auxiliary groups that did not include all Rotary wives in a club—those who worked or were otherwise not able to attend—, the wives became 'My wife' versus 'My Rotary Ann!' Such introductions were most uncomfortable for many of the women.

However, 'Rotary Ann' has an interesting beginning, and when first coined was a term of endearment.

The year was 1914 when San Francisco Rotarians boarded a special train to attend the Rotary convention held in Houston. It had not yet become customary for wives to accompany their husbands to Rotary conventions—but on that trip there was one woman, the wife of San Francisco Club President Henry Brunner, Ann. Mrs. Ann Brunner was introduced as the Rotarian's Ann. This title soon became "Rotary Ann." One of the Rotarians wrote a "Rotary Ann" chant. By the time the train arrived in Houston, some passengers had composed a song about 'Rotary Ann!' The carnival atmosphere was heightened when the group lifted Ann Brunner on their shoulders and marched around the station singing their ditty. Another wife was also named Ann and she, too, was lifted into the air! The California group proclaimed that from then on all ladies shall be known as 'Rotary Anns!' The word Rotary Ann can be heard on a rare occasion, and now you know where it came from.

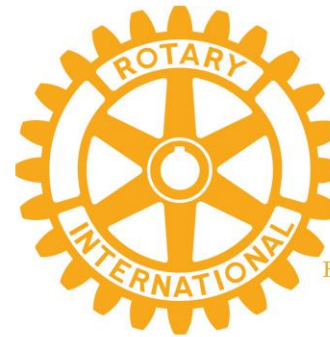
