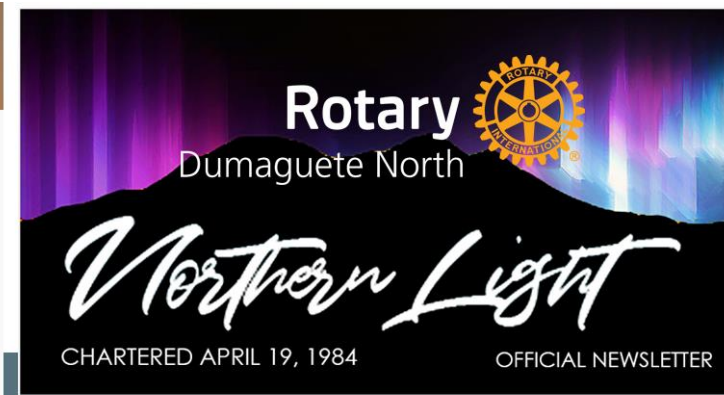

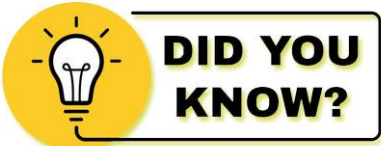

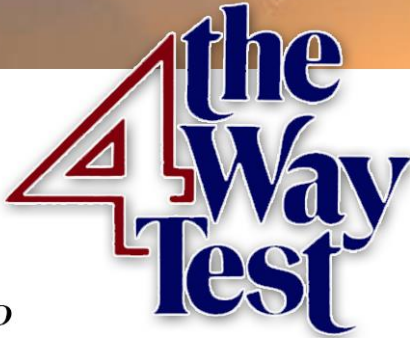

As all Rotarians should know, the Four-Way Test is the corner stone of Rotary; but do we know the history of the Four-Way test and how and why it was created. Much of the following information of the history of the Four-Way Test, can be found at <https://rotary5630.org/history-of-the-four-way-test/> which was prepared by Rotary District 5630 of Central & Western Nebraska.

The Four-Way Test was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 (who became Rotary International President in 1954-1955), when he was tasked with taking over a company, which distributed cookware and other household items, that was facing bankruptcy. Although the company was facing bankruptcy, it was still surviving thanks to a 6,100 USD loan.

In order to separate his company from the competitors Rotarian Taylor decided that is was the character, dependability and service mindedness of his employees that would set his company apart from the competition. Although, like many industries in the United States, there existed a code of ethics for their business, Rotarian Taylor desired something shorter and easier for his employees to apply during work.

Based on the motto “In right there is might” he came up with the four question that we all have memorized. What was novel about this code of ethics was that it was not a code that imposed or told his employees how to be or act, but rather set

up questions for his employees to make their own determination on what was right.

The company overhauled its advertisements to be more accurate by using less superlatives like “Better,” “Best,” “Greatest,” and “Finest,” in its advertisements which resulted in more public confidence in the company’s products. In addition, when they found opportunity to speak well of their competitor’s they did so, therefore, gaining confidence and friendship with them as well.

Eventually, because of the way the Four-Way Test was accepted and utilized by the employees with its clients, competitors, and suppliers, the once bankrupt company was able to pay all its previous debts, as well as the 6,100 USD loan, and eventually became a multi-million dollar company—all because of a change in company policy and mind set.

What is more impressive about the Four-Way Test is that it was code of ethics that was not inconsistent with various religions of his employees. Moreover, the employees brought this ethical mindset outside of the eight hour working day. It positively affected their home, social, and community life. Finally, 1943, the Board of Directors of Rotary International adopted the Four-Way Test and became a part of the Vocational Service ideal that has been published in various forms and in many languages by Rotary International.
