An old carpenter once tried to cross a wooden bridge. Midway through, his left foot fell into a hole, causing him to stumble. He quickly stood up, gathered his tools, and began repairing the hole. A young man saw him and asked, “Why are you repairing the bridge when, at your age, you may never pass this way again?” The old man replied, “I may never pass this way again, but I am repairing this bridge so that those who come after me—such as you, young man—will not fall into the same hole.”

This simple yet powerful parable mirrors the mission behind the Rotary Club of Dumaguete North’s *OPLAN KINABUKASAN*, a career orientation program designed to guide graduating senior high school students, as they make critical decisions about their future paths.

Like the old carpenter, RCDN members have already crossed many of life’s bridges. They may never walk the same path as today’s

students again, but their commitment to service compels them to repair the road ahead, filling in the gaps of uncertainty, ignorance, and doubt that can cause students to stumble.

Through interactive, classroom-based sessions led by professionals, *OPLAN KINABUKASAN* aims to prevent young minds from falling into career pitfalls. It seeks to open their eyes to possibilities, nurture their dreams, and guide them toward wise, deliberate choices.

In truth, this is one of the most meaningful services we Rotarians can offer—requiring little expense, yet drawing from what we already have, what we already know, and what we have already achieved—all to ensure that others do not fall where we once did.

That is the heart of RCDN’s mission: to build bridges not for ourselves, but for those who come after.

ROTARY CODE OF CONDUCT

(The Rotary Code of Conduct (formerly known as the Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions) provides a framework for ethical behavior that all Rotarians can use, together with The FourWay Test, in their business and professional activities.)

- 1. Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behaviors and activities;
- 2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve in Rotary;
- 3. Conduct all of my personal, business, and professional affairs ethically, while encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example to others;
- 4. Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings;
- 5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society;
- 6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
- 7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians; and
- 8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
