THE PARABLE OF THE SOWER

(Revisited and "Rotarized")

The parable is familiar to everyone, I suppose. Jesus told a story of a farmer who went out sow seeds. Some seeds fell on rocky ground, others fell on barren soil, and others fell on fertile ground. The rains came and the sum came up, and the ones that fell on rocky ground died, those that fell on baren soil, grew but slowly withered and faded. For you know the rest of the parable. (Matthew 13:1-9).

One of this Rotary year's thrust is membership, membership.

We recruit more members, form satellite clubs, or maximum create a new club. We of course do this by sowing the seeds of Rotary to potential recruits. In the past we have recruited and inducted new members, trying to plant the seeds of Rotary in their hearts. And like the parable of the sower, some seeds grew but eventually wither and fade. Some seeds died even before they can grow. And I believe those that remain still active and bursting with enthusiasm are the ones that were planted and grew on fertile grounds.

For potential recruits, new members, and even for us who remained in Rotary all these years, one point of reflection would be this question: Why join Rotary? The answers may be varied: Some could not refuse the invitation of a close friend. Others joined because they were attracted by the fellowship, the camaraderie, (don't forget the parties), in the group. For some, it's a privilege (status symbol, maybe?) to be part of a prestigious group. For others, maybe because they want to establish or expand their connections in business or profession. Perhaps for

connections in business or profession. Perhaps for others, simply because they have nowhere else to go. The problem with these shallow motivations or intentions is that if such expectations are not met, or when tested with occasional conflicts, crisis, or trials within the group, the fragile membership quickly fades and dies. Indeed, seeds falling on barren soil or rocky ground.

But for those who grew the seeds of Rotary on fertile hearts, joining Rotary is a matter of commitment to render service above self, to be ambassadors of goodwill and friendship, to be advocates of truth and fairness, to be doers of acts that benefit all concerned.

To stretch the analogy a bit further, the quality of the Rotary seeds that we sow also matters. Orienting a new member or a potential recruit on the ways and hows of Rotary should go beyond mere words in brochures, pamphlets, or documents. Our deeds and our actions as Rotarian do speak louder. Let us strive to make people see the objects of Rotary in us, to witness the ideals of Rotary active in our daily lives. Let us be exemplars of good Rotarians. Good seeds landing on fertile soil – the magic formula to increase our fold.

Can we bring our lost (or inactive) members back? It depends, I think. The quality of the seed and the fertility of the soil are matters to consider. We shall continue to sow the good seeds of Rotary on fertile ground, never losing sight of the raison de

etre' of our club – the very reason why we exist.


Larry A. Lunsford selected to be 2027-28 RI President
