# Natural Farming System and Rotary's Advocacy

In the past, Filipino farmers sustained their livelihood through the use of organic fertilizers. By preparing compost pits filled with animal manure and biodegradable wastes, they were able to nourish the soil naturally. Harvests were abundant, and farming costs were manageable.

When foreign colonizers introduced chemical fertilizers, pesticides, and herbicides, farm yields initially increased. However, over time, the soil became acidic, requiring farmers to buy more chemicals and spend more just to maintain production. Worse, scientific studies later confirmed that chemical-based farming practices are harmful to human health, animals, and the environment.

Recognizing these negative impacts, cause-oriented groups began to promote the Natural Farming System (NFS), a sustainable and eco-friendly technology from Korea now adopted across Asia. NFS uses indigenous and locally available materials to produce fertilizers, soil and seed conditioners, and herbal solutions through fermentation. These inputs

provide the essential Nitrogen (N), Phosphorus (P), and Potassium (K) needed by plants, and can also be used safely for animals.

For Rotary, this advocacy directly aligns with its Areas of Focus, particularly:

- Supporting the Environment – by reducing chemical use, restoring soil health, and promoting sustainable agriculture.
- Disease Prevention and Treatment – by protecting communities from the harmful effects of toxic farm chemicals.
- Community Economic Development – by lowering production costs for farmers, improving their livelihood, and empowering them to use local resources.
- Maternal and Child Health – by ensuring safer, chemical-free food for families and future generations.

Through projects, partnerships, and training, Rotary Clubs can champion Natural Farming Systems in local communities. By doing so, we uphold our mission of “Service Above Self”, helping farmers achieve food security, sustainable livelihood, and a healthier environment for all.
