# Rotary International Selects Olayinka Hakeem Babalola As President For 2026-27

The Board of Directors of Rotary International have selected Olayinka Hakeem Babalola as President for 2026-27. His term will begin on July 1, 2026.

A member of the Rotary Club of Trans Amadi, Nigeria, President-Elect Yinka began his Rotary journey in 1988 as a Rotaractor. He joined the Rotary Club of Trans Amadi six years later. His leadership roles include serving as District Governor (2011-12), Rotary International Vice President (2019-20) and member of the Rotary International Board (2018-20).

He was also an active leader and participant in Rotary International committees such as the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee (2017-23) and the Nigeria National PolioPlus Committee (2013-present, adviser 2016-present).

This is a momentous occasion for both Rotary and Africa. President-Elect Yinka's commitment to service, his professional expertise, and his dedication to The Rotary Foundation make him a powerful voice for our global network. We're proud to support him on this incredible journey!

## Remembering and Celebrating African Leadership in Rotary

President-Elect Yinka will become the second African to serve as Rotary International President. The late Jonathan B. Majiyagbe served as Rotary International President in 2003-04 under the presidential theme Lend a Hand.



A lawyer by profession, Majiyagbe joined Rotary in 1967. He was a member of the Rotary Club of Abuja Metro and a past member of the Rotary Club of Kano. In addition to his term as Rotary International President, he served as a director, Rotary Foundation trustee, and trustee chair. He served on several committees, including the International PolioPlus Committee, the Nigeria PolioPlus Committee, and the Reach Out to Africa Committee.

Sam was a member of the Rotary Club of Kampala, Uganda for 38 years. Under his leadership, the number of clubs in Uganda swelled from nine to 89 over the course of 29 years.

# RCDN receives “Club Excellence Award”

The Rotary Club of Dumaguete North received the “Club Excellence Award” from Rotary International, for its achievements for the Rotary Year 2024-2025.

This citation was given in honor of the club’s performance during the Rotary Year Theme “The Magic of Rotary”, under Ri Preident Stephanie A. Urchick, and under the RCDN club leadership of IPP Rodelio Solon.

The Club Excellence awards, formerly the Rotary Citation awards recognize clubs that achieve specific goals throughout the year, such as increasing their membership, engaging members in sustainable service projects, giving to The Rotary Foundation, building awareness of Rotary in the

community, and having an up-to-date strategic plan. When clubs achieve these goals, they contribute to Rotary's overall health and culture for generations to come.

Every Rotary Year, club officers select at least 50% of the club goals in Rotary Club Central and achieves them with the club during the year. Such accomplishment should be reported in Rotary Club Central. The achievement of the goals must be reported in Rotary Club Central by 30 June at the end of the Rotary Year.

In order to qualify for such award, clubs must be in good financial standing, meaning they must pay both dues invoices and any balances in full within 60 days of receiving the invoice. Club must also show they have achieved at least 50% of the goals in Rotary Club Central. Even if clubs achieve these goals, they aren’t eligible if their achievement isn’t reported by 30 June in Rotary Club Central.
