RCDN signs MOU with DepEd

09052025 - Thhe Rotary Club of Dumaguete North sealed a partnership with the Department of Edication through External Partnership Service. The partnership called, “Pathways to Purpose: A Rotary and DepEd Partnership Career Empowerment Program” is a collaborative career guidance initiative, designed to support senior high school students in making informed career decisions.

The partnership will be implemented at the Negros Oriental High School and the program will provide the students with an exposure to diverse career paths through mentorship, storytelling and interactive activities. Career assessments will also be conducted to help students identify their strengths, interests and potential career trajectories.

The program, which will run for nine (9) will follow monthly themes and weekly topics that are aligned with the DepEd Career Guidance Program (CGP) modules.



This partnership initiative is in line with Rotary’s programs through its community service endeavors that seeks to empower the youth by sharing real-world experiences, mentoring and facilitating access to career opportunities. Both Rotary and DepEd recognize the importance of career assessments as a foundational step in guiding students toward informed career choices, coupled with proper guidance through shared resources, expertise and volunteerism.



RCDN is joining the Rotary Club of Dumaguete, Rotary Club of Dumaguete East and Rotary Club of Dumaguete South in this step towards a brighter carerr opportunities the youth. These clubs belong to Are 1G of District 3860 led by Assistant Governor Renante Lim and District Governor Jong Fernandez.

Our country is confronted with several problems.

We have both economic and social problems. The Philippines is still an under developed country. And though we are an agricultural country, we have not attained the satisfactory output, and we are far behind from our neighboring countries. Sometime in the 1960’s, agriculture students from other countries studied at the University of the Philippines - Los Baños, Laguna. The irony is that we are importing rice from our neighboring countries now. Some experts say we do not adopt the appropriate technology. Although we are exporting agricultural products and other processed products – this is not enough to have a balanced trade.

In addition, a certain percentage of our labor force are either underemployed or unemployed. Some students are not able to enroll in college due financial reasons. The Rotary Clubs particularly the Rotary Club of Dumaguete North is doing its best though in

in its small way to somehow contribute to minimize these problems.

This Rotary Year, RCDN, with its program for the children, had contributed schools supplies and printer for the kinder students in Agan-an, Sibulan. We have also just signed a Memorandum of Agreement with the Department of Education, together with other stake holders on a career orientation program for graduating seniors of Negros Oriental High School.

RCDN has also been doing citronella information campaign and planting in the different elementary schools. We have donated books to some schools. Our club has had several projects in the past which included among others, legal missions, medical and dental mission,s cattle dispersal, provision of water tanks in some barangays. Currently the club is preparing to submit a project proposal of corn mill for the farmers in the hinter lands of Manjuyod, which hopefully will approved as a grant through the Rotary Foundation.
