The schedule was filled with activities: a Medical Mission, an ACOM meeting attended by representatives from Cebu, Bohol, Siquijor, and Negros Oriental, and the much-anticipated Governor's Night.

Among these events, the Medical Mission stood out as the most significant. Dubbed AVF Surgery, it was led by Dr. Edwin Valencia and held at the Negros Oriental Hospital. The mission lasted for two days, beginning on the morning of September 19 and concluding in the evening of September 20.

It was the perfect embodiment of Service Above Self. I vividly recall leaving the hospital at 12:15 p.m., while the dedicated doctors and staff had not yet taken their lunch—choosing instead to prioritize their patients.

Thanks to the selfless leadership of Dr. Edwin Valencia and his team, twenty-four (24) indigent patients received life-changing surgery absolutely free of charge. Each patient saved approximately ₱80,000.00, a tremendous relief for their families.

Indeed, this mission reflected the very heart of Rotary service—transforming lives and bringing hope where it is needed most.

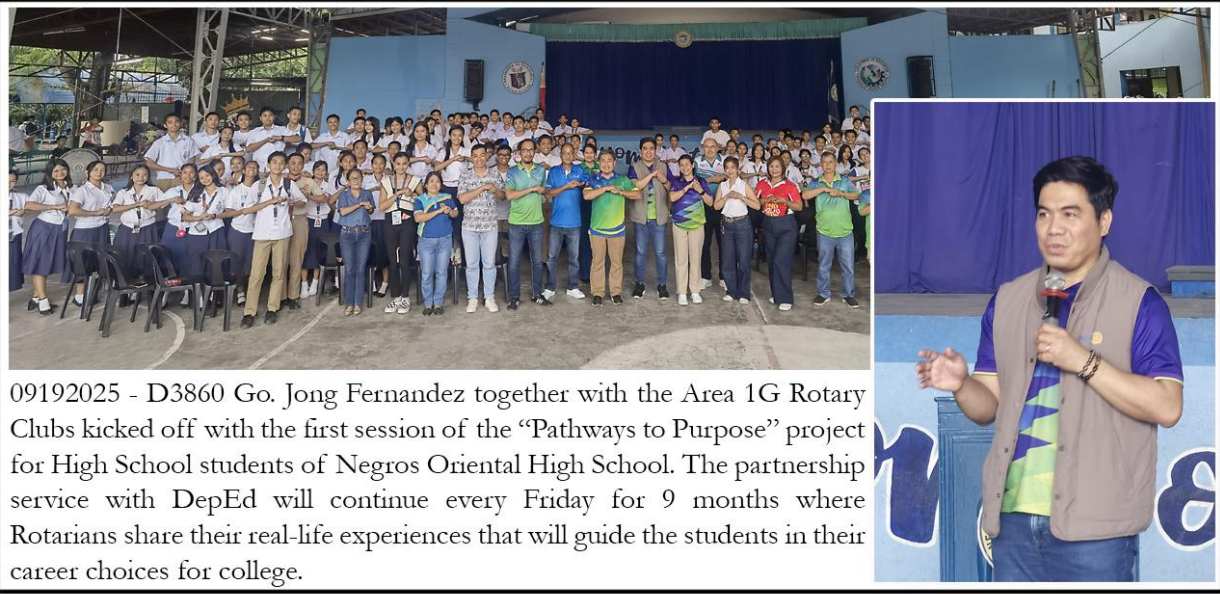
