Protecting the Environment

IN LINE WITH one of latest projects (tree planting), Protecting the Environment is one of the Seven Areas of Focus for Rotary International’s focus for its humanitarian and service projects.

I may be missing some projects focusing on the environment but from what I can recall most of our projects deal with tree/mangrove planting and seaside cleanup activities. Therefore, I challenge our members to think of other projects, especially long-term sustainable projects that can be monitored for its effects.

Protecting the environment is crucial because human well-being, survival, and prosperity are entirely dependent on a healthy planet, which

provides us with clean air, water, and food, and supports our mental health, societies, and economies. A healthy environment ensures the availability of essential natural resources, prevents the worsening of climate change and natural disasters, maintains the biodiversity necessary for functioning ecosystems, and safeguards the health and livelihoods of current and future generations.

One service project involving the environment that we can consider doing, which is novel to what RCDN usually does for an environmentally focused area involves clean energy. Clean energy, also known as renewable energy, include solar, wind, hydroelectric, geothermal, and biomass energy, all derived from natural resources that replenish over time. These sources offer a low- or zero-carbon alternative to fossil fuels, significantly reducing the greenhouse gases and pollutants that contribute to climate change.

Probably, one of the most practical activities we can implement into a small based community in need is solar. We could canvass certain communities that are in need of access to electricity and develop its infrastructure to include an affordable solar system. This community could eventually be a community that RCDN “adopts” where we continue to do other projects outside of environmental concerns, and can continually monitor over time, where we have a long term connection with.
