In group decision-making, the ideal is unanimity. Everyone agrees on a particular act, plan, or course of action. Everyone agrees that a thing is good, or that an act is the right thing to do. Everyone acts as a single entity, one mind, one purpose, one body.

But sometimes the group is not unanimous.

Even in the most trivial matters, some go to great lengths arguing what clothes/uniform to wear, what dance to practice, what song to sing, what menu to prepare, how much to contribute, and the like. Some simply cannot agree unanimously. Not even in close-knit groups such as in family reunions, fraternities, sororities, guilds, and yes, even among the now-popular pickleball teams, *di ba? Hehe, apil ko ba.*

History tells us that the lack of unanimity gave birth to the majority rule, followed by the finer rules of parliamentary procedure. The rules became a matter of necessity if only to make a group decision. The rule of the majority has been with us since the birth of democracy in this country, in principle at least.

But the problem with majority rule is that there is minority resentment. Those in the minority are the hardest to mobilize on the majority decision because probably they cling on to the thought that their ideas are much better or their proposed actions are more prudent. And the most challenging part of leadership is to mobilize the minority in group activities. And to do this, I believe persuasion is preferred rather than plain imposition.

This Rotary Year we are called upon to “Unite for Good”. So how do we contend with the minority, in order for them to unite with the majority in cases when we really have to “divide the house”?

Allow me to share a few thoughts. To my mind, certain values and qualities are essentially needed in order to rally those in the minority to unite for good with the

majority and for the majority to effectively persuade the former. Let me name a few.

Humility – sometimes can also be such a lonely word, aside from honesty. Some tend to be arrogant, believing only in his or her own ideas and competencies, and refusing to listen to others. Some think they are infallible, that they allow no room for error or mistake. Such individuals tend to impose their will on others which often cause the eventual disintegration and break-up of the group.

Prudence is the ability to act with reason, caution, and circumspection. Foresight and critical thinking are essential to arrive at quality decisions. In doing so, reckless and irresponsible decisions are avoided.

Kindness & Respect – Voltaire said “Let us disagree, but let us not become disagreeable.” We can disagree politely, correct an error, dispel a misconception, or enlighten the misinformed - in the most diplomatic & friendly manner without humiliating or offending the other needlessly. “Speak your truth quietly but clearly, and listen to others, for even the dull and the ignorant – they too have their story”, according to Desiderata. , We should never lose sight of kindness and respect for one another.

Basic values indeed, with which I believe we can achieve unanimity more often in all that we do as a club, resorting only to “divide the house” when absolutely necessary.

If all of us strive to possess and practice these values and ideals not only in all our club activities but also in our daily lives, we will truly be a strong and vibrant club. And only then can we truly “*Unite for Good!*”

What is polio?

Polio, or poliomyelitis, is a paralyzing and potentially deadly infectious disease that most commonly affects children under the age of 5. The virus spreads from person to person, typically through contaminated water. It can then attack the nervous system.

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.

Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. But it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year.

Lecturers will be RCDN professionals from various fields, each sharing their experiences and expertise. Each session will run for one hour and a half, providing both information and inspiration to participants. The first venue for this program will be Ahong, Sibulan High School.

Both programs seek to empower students with the knowledge, confidence, and motivation to make wise choices for their future. Let us all extend our support to these noble and impactful initiatives that embody Rotary's spirit of Service Above Self.
