When calamity strikes, Rotarians rise. In the aftermath of the devastating typhoon and earthquake that brought widespread damage to Canlaon City and several areas in Cebu, the Rotary Club of Dumaguete North (RCDN) reaffirmed what it truly means to live the spirit of Service Above Self.

The Rotary Club of Dumaguete North (RCDN) continues to embody the Rotary spirit through this year's theme, "UNITE FOR GOOD," as the club reached out to communities in Canlaon City and Cebu that were heavily affected by the recent typhoon and earthquake. In the wake of widespread destruction in Canlaon City, RCDN immediately mobilized its members, partners, and volunteers to deliver much-needed relief assistance. Family food packs, water, hygiene kits, and essential supplies were distributed to the affected barangays and evacuation centers. Cebu, who endured significant damage from the earthquake. This partnership allowed resources to be efficiently directed to Cebu's hardest-hit areas, reinforcing the belief that Rotary's impact is strongest when clubs and districts work together.

RCDN's efforts for Canlaon City and its collaboration with District 3860 for Cebu serve as powerful reminders that unity, compassion, and timely action can transform despair into resilience.
