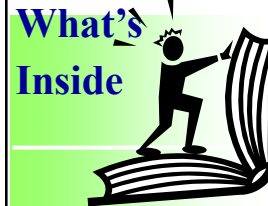

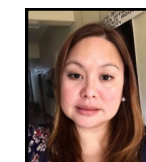

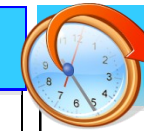

Shifting to online training

- **Assign courses** — Assign courses in the Learning Center to replace in-person training. Look at the list in the [course catalog](#) (PDF) to see what's available.
- **Consider an online-first approach** — Assign online courses or other materials before a virtual meeting. Then, in the meeting, participants can reinforce what they learned from the materials by role-playing scenarios, practicing skills in a workshop, or having small-group discussions.
- **Get Learning Center reports to monitor people's progress** — District trainers can take the [Access to Learning Center Reports course](#). After they complete it, our team will set up two weekly reports that are emailed directly to district trainers.

5. To avoid obstruction of the natural flow of the river;
6. To conduct establishment inventory along the Banica river, and likewise to make audit on the identified establishment of their compliance to environmental laws particularly as to what is required by RA 9275;
7. No canalization/diversion of the stream will be supported;
8. Various habitat zones should be delineated and suitable plant species for rehabilitation of these zones should be identified with specialist input;
9. Wetland filtration areas shall re-established between residential areas and the riparian areas;
10. Litter and/ or silt traps, culvert etc shall be checked regularly and cleaned by the recipient Barangay or LGU concerned as required;
11. The localized areas where invasive trees were removed shall be leveled and stabilized by compaction;
12. Re-vegetation of the entire river are as follows, Stabilizing of steep areas with geotextile to prevent erosion while grasses established;, Re-established indigenous hydrophytic grass clumps

and sedges.

FUNCTION OF THE OF GOVERNMENT AGENCY, NON GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION, PRIVATE SECTOR AND ACADEME;

DENR CENRO

1. Conduct inventory of all establishment, private including residential units along the easement of Banica river. Likewise, the result of the inventory will be prepared in matrix form with corresponding data. (Inventory forms will be prepared and discussed);
2. Identify riparian owners and recommends to the LGU for the appropriate action;
3. Implement together will on the easement policies;

DENR PENRO

1. To mandate the CENRO for the conduct of inventory of riparian owners along easement as well as the establishment along easement area;
2. Coordination meeting with LGU and other government agencies concerned as to the proposed plan for Banica river Rehabilitation;

ACTION PLAN FOR BANICA REHABILITATION

INTRODUCTION

Banica river is one of the major river in Dumaguete City and Valencia, the said river stretches from the hinterlands of Valencia to Dumaguete City. The purpose of the rehabilitation is to restore the water quality of the Banica river since long before the said river was already categorized as Class A in the upper stream particularly Apolong area and Class B in the lower portion starting from Palinpinon, Valencia down to Balugo/Cadawinonan Area.

To comply with RA 9275, The Department shall, in coordination with NWRB, Department of Health (DOH), Department of Agriculture (DA), governing board and other concerned government agencies and private sectors shall take such measures as may be necessary to upgrade the quality of such water in non-attainment areas to meet the standards under which it has been classified. Therefore, water quality of Banica river should be restore and maintain through strict implementation of government agencies policies covered.

RATIONALE

Rehabilitation will be conducted in collaboration with Non- Government Organization, concerned government agencies, LGU- Dumaguete, LGU- Valencia, Barangays along Banica river, DENR CENR, DENR PENRO, DENR EMB, Academe, and private sector. Banica river rehabilitation aspires to restore

the water quality as to before and to maintain the water quality based on criteria of the classification.

Stakeholders that directly or indirectly benefited the Banica river, will also be coordinated to take share in the rehabilitation. Likewise, privates firms and establishment along Banica river will be identify to take part on the rehabilitation as part of their corporate social responsibility. Each Participating groups will be given task to do their share in the rehabilitation.

Likewise,water quality monitoring, sampling and analysis will be undertaken by the Environmental Management Bureau.

In effect of the rehabilitation, Public information and education will be encourage participation of an informed and active public in water quality management and monitoring;

OBJECTIVES OF REHABILITATION

1. To rehabilitate areas distributed by recent construction works;
2. To rehabilitate erosion within the flood plain that has occurred over time
3. To remove alien invasive plants species growing in the floodplain;
4. To avoid altering the stream or influencing the current flood lines during restoration work- no infilling shall be allowed in the flood plain;
