Rotary International President Holger Knaack declared on 1 December six Rotary members to be RI directors for 2022-24.

The RI Bylaws provide that if the general secretary does not receive a duly proposed challenge to the selection of a zone's nominating committee for director by 1 December, the president shall declare the selection of the nominating committee to be the director-nominee from the zone.

As of 1 December, the general secretary received no proposal of additional candidates from Zones 3, 18, 22, 29, 32, and 34. Therefore, the following members are to be the directors-nominee from their respective zones for election at the 2021 RI convention in Taipei: Zone 3

Jeremy Hurst -- Rotary Club of Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands The general secretary received challenges to the Nominating Committee's selection in Zones 1B (Bangladesh, Indonesia, and Pakistan) and 14 (Italy). An electronic ballot is being prepared for clubs in this zone to select their candidate. The ballot will be live by 31 December and will run, per the RI Bylaws, until 1 March.

Educate your club

Use your Rotary club meetings to foster meaningful discussion about diversity and inclusion on one of the topics outlined in this blog post. This could include approaching a large business or organisation to share their experiences of creating harassment-free workplaces.

This kind of conversation is common in workplaces recognising not only the risks associated with failing to adequately address harassment, but the benefits of creating safe, respectful, and inclusive work environments.

You can also review Rotary's <u>Preventing and Addressing Harassment</u> course in the Learning Center (My Rotary log-in required).

Ultimately, creating a harassment-free zone at Rotary is about creating a culture of respect and inclusivity. While culture change can take time, it's worth it if we want to ensure the sustainability of our clubs by ensuring they attract and retain a diverse range of members.

3 ways to create a harassment-free zone at Rotary By Katey Halliday

We have no place for harassment in Rotary. People won't join or stay if they are exposed to harassment.

- 1 Rotary's policy on maintaining a harassment-free environment at meetings, events, and activities makes it clear that harassment will not be tolerated. It even stipulates that all Rotary leaders, including club presidents, shall be provided with annual training on Rotary International's policies on the topic.
- 2 But is it just up to leaders to ensure that Rotary is a harassment-free zone? Of course not. It takes each one of us to create and maintain a culture that does not condone, ignore, or excuse harassment.

3 Educate yourself

4 Harassment is broadly defined as any conduct, verbal or physical, that denigrates, insults, or offends a person or group based on any characteristic (age, ethnicity, race, colour, abilities, religion, socioeconomic status, culture, sex, sexual orientations, or gender identity). (Rotary Code of Policies 26.120)

- 5. There is nothing in this definition about **intention**. None of us are immune to unwittingly engaging in behaviour which could be viewed as harassment. The fact that it might have been 'just a joke' is no excuse.
- 6. It is not the job of victims of harassment to educate us, we must educate ourselves. The more aware we are about the diversity of the communities we serve, the less likely we are to inadvertently offend someone.

And if we do get called out, we must not get defensive, but reflect, learn and change our behaviour.

Educate others

When we hear or see something that is not OK, we must have the courage to do something about it. There are many ways to be an active bystander, but the key is to do something. Here are some ideas:

- o **Interrupt** the inappropriate conversation by changing the subject.
- o Call out offensive comments by drawing attention to it not being OK.
- o **Provide support** to someone who feels they have experienced harassment. Make sure they know they aren't alone or overreacting.
- o **Challenge the behaviour** of the person/group responsible but be sure to challenge the behaviour and not the person. ("you're a creep" vs "that joke you told was creepy" will prompt very different responses)
- Seek advice from someone you trust about what to do.
- Report the behaviour through the appropriate channels.
