

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Keep growing!



Rotary is a great equalizer. I recall how my curiosity about Rotary started. I was 24 years old, I was a TV newscaster here in Dumaguete, and the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South placed an advertisement to be aired in my newscast segment. In that ad, the Rotarians took turns asking the Four-Way Test. I didn't know of anyone who belonged to Rotary -- until that time.

One day, I got a call from THE Atty. Andy Andaya. He was then City legal officer. He was a humorous person, and would jokingly refer to his job as the HEGAL officer. He had a great talent at making people laugh. He turned out to be the president of RCDS! He asked me to give a talk about my profession, and invited me to join RDCS! I felt so honored that I readily said "Yes, Attorney!" He replied: "In Rotary, we call each other by our first names. Call me Andy."

When I showed up at the Club meeting the next week, I was surprised to see that I actually had many friends in Rotary: there was Ed Vergara, who owned the best photo studio in town; there was my neighbor Dr. Henry Sojor; there was our community tailor, Doming Rubia; Raul Dimalag, father of my classmate since grade school; and more!

I admit it seemed awkward that time to call Rotarians -- whom I would call "Sir" -- simply by their first names! But I eventually got the hang of it.

To the GenX and Millennial generation Rotarians, call every Rotarian by their first names. You will get the hang of it! Calling each other by our first names -- and let me quote Rotary here -- "regardless of our educational qualifications or social status fosters an amicable atmosphere without hierarchies related to personal achievement".

This is Rotary -- where one from every classification is invited to our Club because he is special in his field of expertise. Rotary is a great equalizer.

Rotary is Service. Not merely "service" but Service Above Self. This has been our motto the last 73 years. In Rotary, we are called to serve.

We have seven areas of focus. And each of you, dear Rotarians, has been assigned to at least one area of focus based on your special skills and talents. Our Rotarians belonging to the bench and bar will take care of Peace & Conflict-Prevention/ Resolution. Our medical doctors are assigned for Disease-Prevention & Treatment. Our water utilities experts and engineers will focus on Water & Sanitation. Our nutrition specialists will oversee our Maternal & Child Health project. Our education experts will engage in Basic Education & Literacy concerns. The businessmen in our Club will focus on Economic & Community Development project. While our agriculturists and Climate Change advocates will be at the forefront of our activities in the Environment.

Rotary is family. What makes Rotary different from all the other clubs and associations? Rotarians meet every week, sometimes more than once. And because of that, Rotarians are able to get to know each other better, to a point that some people regard us as a fraternity, where the bonds of brotherhood sometimes is beyond limits.

For this event alone, a number of our Rotarians, for example, gave more than what we asked for to make this induction a success -- not even expecting anything in return. I would like to thank Rtn. Dave Berba & Metro Dumaguete Water, PP Bimbo & Ann Rhanie Lagahit, PP Chiquiting Sagarbarria, PP Henry & Ann Lorna Liu, PP Allan Martinez & ONE MC, Ran Lim and VP Jeorex Chua. Thanks also to Rtn. Carlos Romarate for making us look good on social media. Some of them prefer to remain anonymous. Would anyone do that if he did not genuinely feel that he belongs in Rotary?

Let me also take this time to acknowledge the members of the Matiao and Uymatiao families



PROFILE OF DISTRICT GOVERNOR 3860

Our honored guest joined Rotary 22 years ago in 2001, and has since occupied various key positions.

After 15 years of active membership in the Rotary, our guest became an All-Star President during RY 2016-17. During her presidency, the Rotary Club of Downtown Davao was awarded the Most Outstanding Club, besting 98 clubs in the District.

Under her leadership, the Rotary Club of Downtown Davao also received three Rotary International citation awards: the first one involved their service project called Shelter for Battered Women; the second award was for the exemplary performance of their Rotaract Club; and the third citation was for her husband, fellow Rotarian Archie, who was recognized as one of the 50 Most Outstanding Spouses in the World.

After her presidency, the birth of a series of District positions followed: In 2017, our guest was appointed Assistant Governor of Area 2C, handling five clubs, while at the same time for the next two years, was chairperson for Mindanao for “Pink October”, the District’s breast cancer awareness program.

In that same year, she was appointed a member of the gala committee of The One Philippines, an international humanitarian award body. She was our representative to the Philippine Rotary Magazine in 2019; the District’s Endowment & Major Gifts sub-committee chair in 2020; the District Coordinator for the Rotary Presidential Conference 2021 Manila, and the Empowering Girls Initiative; and the District’s Promotion chairperson for the Rotary International Convention held in June last year in Houston, Texas, and the Rotary Institute held in December that same year in Abu Dhabi.

Passionately believing in the advocacy of The Rotary Foundation, our honored guest and Spouse Archie became active donors of the chartered Polio Plus Society, committing themselves to contribute each year to the program, “until the world has been declared free of the wild polio virus”; they have been named Endowment Fund Benefactors for including the Rotary Endowment Fund as beneficiary in their estate plans; and have been invited to the Bequest Society, reserved for those who have committed gifts to the Rotary Foundation of at least 10,000 US dollars or more.



More than those three prestigious recognitions, the Cocon-Gamboa Rotarian spouses are members of the elite Arch Klumph Society-Trustees Circle, named after PP Arch Klumph, who was the 6th president of Rotary International.

The Trustees Circle is composed of those who have donated to the Rotary Foundation at least 250,000 to half a million US dollars. The photo and biography of the Cocon-Gamboa Rotarian spouses as Arch Klumph Society-Trustees Circle is displayed right there in the gallery of the Rotary International headquarters in Evanston, Illinois.

Our Inducting Officer tonight was born and raised in Butuan City. She is happily married to IPP Archie Francisco Gamboa, with whom she has two children: Tym, married to Dr. Shey Ongchua, with grandson Aaron Travis; and Mariane, recently married to Alvin Mosquisa.

All throughout her life as a Rotarian and as a community leader, our special guest has always been guided by the Four-Way Test, constantly giving gratitude to Rotarians worldwide who have helped and molded her into what she has become today.

ABOUT THE RCDS PRESIDENT

Alex Rey de Vera Pal joined the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South in 1988, before my term as club president. He was then a bachelor at 25 years old, and the youngest Rotarian at that time. He was Dumaguete's only TV newscaster in those days that aired the news every night over PTV Channel 10.

His Rotary classification is in Communications Management, and his sponsor was PP Andy Andaya.

He married Ann Irma 33 years ago in December 1989, and when she moved here to Dumaguete from Manila, she also became active with Rtn. Alex in RCDS activities, while raising their toddlers in those years. Alex, however, moved to Cagayan de Oro in 1996, and had to leave our Club.

In 2000, Alex was chosen as one of four members from about a hundred applicants from all over District 3860 to the highly-coveted Rotary Group Study Exchange team. This is now called the Friendship Exchange, composed of young professionals sharing with and learning from their foreign counterparts best practices in their respective fields.

That year, our District exchanged the GSE team of Alex with Rotary District 5020 covering Washington State in the US and Vancouver Island in British Columbia, Canada.

Alex started his professional writing career as public information officer for Negros Oriental in 1986, before joining the government TV station, called the People's Television Network, under the Office of the President in Malacañang. At PTV, he was assigned to do special coverages in many parts of the country -- that was when we would catch this Dumaguete homegrown talent on national TV covering the national elections in Marawi, the Papal visit, the Olympic Games, the 100th Philippine Independence Day, the re-enactment of MacArthur's landing in Leyte, etc.

For more than 35 years now, Alex has been working as a journalist, with several of his stories getting published in the *Philippine Daily Inquirer* and the *Visayan*

Daily Star in Bacolod City, some of which won him awards and recognition.

In 1998, he was awarded Most Outstanding Environmental Journalist given by the Asia-Pacific Forum for Environmental Journalists. The following year, he was awarded a fellowship at the Metcalf Institute for Marine & Environmental Reporting at the University of Rhode Island in New England. The Rotary Club of Manila also awarded him for a story about Quasimodo, a sea turtle. In 2016, he was awarded as one of the 10 Outstanding Alumni in the 50-year history of the Silliman College of Mass Communication.

After that, our Incoming President was assigned at the PTV central office in Manila as troubleshooter for the Network General Manager, assigning him to simultaneously head three major offices: the Provincial Division, the Administrative Division, and the News Division, while also serving as chair of the Bids and Awards Committee. With his experience in running the major operations in government TV, the PTV Board soon appointed him as Network OIC for the transition period from President Aquino to President Duterte.

Like many Dumagueteños, our Incoming President opted to return to his hometown here during the pandemic. He now handles the Visayas operations of PTV, while producing every week the *Dumaguete MetroPost* – a brainchild of PP Chiquiting Sagarbarria 23 years ago – which has been adjudged the country's Best Edited Community Newspaper, among other national awards.

The managing editor of the *MetroPost* is his Ann Irma, herself a proud daughter of a Rotarian PP of Zamboanga City West. She earned a Masters in Environmental Studies from Brown University, and a Journalism degree from UP Diliman. She has been teaching journalism at Silliman the past 27 years, and also writes for the *Philippine Daily Inquirer*.

Rtn. Alex and Ann Irma have three children: Melissa Alexandra, a communications specialist based in Iloilo; Graciano Jose, a farmer in Toril, Davao; and Alexis Faye, an adjunct Piano instructor in Moline, Illinois.

We truly are a family. We move as one cohesive group in the service of our community. In our everyday lives, we also share our happy and sad moments with one another. We actually need this closeness, this selfless spirit to help us attain our goals for Rotary Year 2023-2024 as we Create Hope in the World.

Last month, Ann Irma and I had the good fortune of visiting the home of our founder Paul Harris and his Ann Jean in Chicago in Illinois. We found ourselves inside a modest three-bedroom house on a hill, overlooking a quiet road. Paul Harris did not own a car; he would walk to the train station near his house, and take a train to the city center. That home was where the lawyer Paul Harris, together with three of his friends -- a mining engineer, a coal broker, and a merchant tailor -- started to meet regularly to fellowship, and to “find solutions for their community”.

By Feb. 23, 1905, they officially called their group “Rotary” since their meetings “rotated from one member’s office to the next”.

Paul Harris probably never imagined that his movement to assist others would eventually grow to become one of the largest service organizations in the world.

From a small Chicago office where there were only four chairs for each of the four founding members, Rotary International has grown into 46,000 clubs, with 1.4 million Rotarians worldwide, including you and me.

This early, I commend PP Myles Bejar, PP Zachy Beltran in California, VP Rex Chua, Sec. Ashley Morelos, Treas. Jess Mascardo, Rtn. David Berba, Rtn. Mitch Morelos, and Ann Maisa Sagarbarria for committing to become Paul Harris Fellows this year.

This will be a challenging year not only because IPP Ely Bodo set the bar high for us, but also because Gov. Twinkle and District Trainer Archie have not stopped encouraging us, through constant messages in our GC, to become better Club officers.

I enjoin you to help the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South rise to the challenge to accomplish our Rotary goals.
