### Matters discussed in the 2nd Club meeting

1. Assistant Gov. Mark Trayvilla, on his second Club Visit to RCDS, discussed the RCDS Club Goals for RY 2023-2024, and encouraged everyone to sign up or update their data at Rotary.org.
2. Pres. Alex discussed the preparations for the bloodletting drive for Sunday, July 16, headed by PE Loloy Baylon.
3. Rtn. David Berba talked about the training for the Vallehermoso waterworks engineers, which was rescheduled for July 24 upon the request of the trainees. This is partly funded by a Rotary District Grant amounting to US\$1,000.00
4. Rtn. Mitch Morelos shared his impressions about RC Boroko in Papua New Guinea, a small club yet with huge funding.
5. Pres. Alex raised the need to conceptualize a new design for our Club bannerette to conform to the Rotary branding guidelines.

Dues that clubs will pay to Rotary International **per member** for the next three years are set as follows;

2022-23: \$35.50 per half year

2023-24: \$37.50 per half year

2024-25: \$39.25 per half year

2025-26: \$41.00 per half year

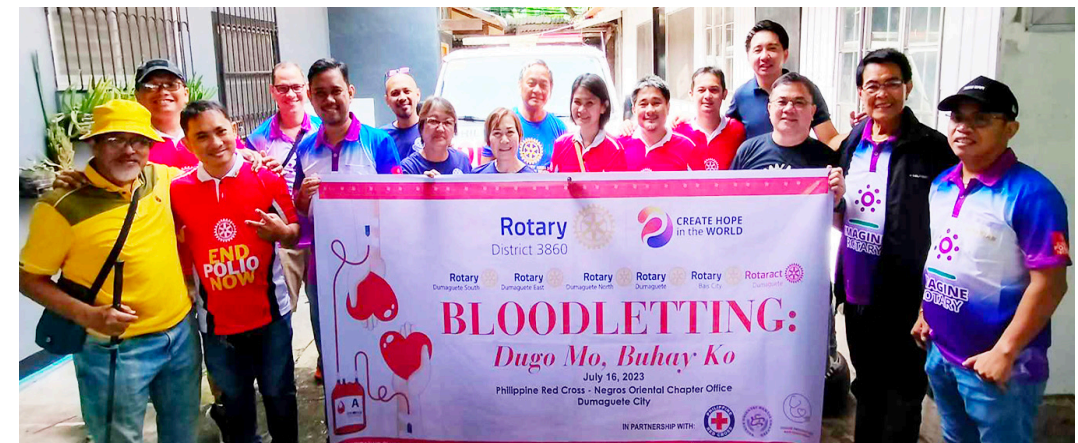

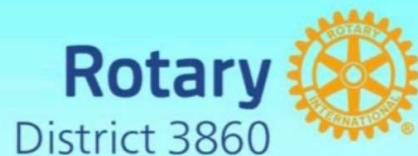




Rtn. Mitch Morelos receives a club bannerette from the President of the Rotary Club of Boroko, Papua New Guinea after attending their club meeting.

8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

### What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris’ death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble

objective of furthering “understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations”.

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000- gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.
