SECRETARY'S REPORT

Minutes of the Meeting on Aug. 2, 2023

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:45 a.m.

- 1) The Secretary led the prayer, followed by the National Anthem, singing of the *Rotary Hymn*.
 - 2) Rtn. Jed Amor introduced the guests: Speaker for the day Former Labor Attache Ponciano Ligutom, Dumaguete City Chief of Police Lt. Col. Ronoel Fungo with his spouse Wendy Mae Duran-Fungo, Jim Jardiniano, Philipp Yao; Rotary Spouses VP Sasa Lim, Sec. Gen Martinez, and Pres. Irma Faith Pal. Another returning Rotarian, Geronimo "Gerry" Villegas, was also acknowledged.
 - 3) Breakfast was served, while the RCDS video of the District Song *Where Hope is Planted* was played.
 - 4) As sponsor, IPP Ely Bodo formally introduced Baby Rotarian Ronoel "Ron" Fungo. PP Andre Jacobo read the Charge to the New Member, while Pres Alex Pal administered the Oath of Membership of Ron Fungo as full-fledged RCDS member. Spouse Wendy pinned on her husband the Rotary Pin, while IPP Ely provided the new member with Constitution and By laws and history of the Club and information about Rotary. After which, Rtn. Ron Fungo, Dumaguete City chief of police, gave his acceptance remarks.

- The Rotarians agreed to go as a Club to the vigil service for PP Candelario "Boy" Gonzalez of RC Dumaguete that same evening at St. Peter Chapel in Bacong.
- PP Ran Lim surprised the Rotarians and Anns by treating us all to ice cream for dessert, in celebration of the Lims 14th wedding anniversary on Aug. 1st. Even Spouse Sasa was surprised.

There are more than 1.2 million Rotarians all over the world who are members of more than 35,000 Rotary Clubs located in more than 200 countries in all geographic areas.

The first women joined Rotary in 1987. Today, more than 196,000 women are members of Rotary International.

The Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarships are the world's largest, privately-funded scholarships.

The first Rotaract Club was formed in Charlotte, North Carolina in the US.

Rotarians in the US make up 28 percent of all Rotarians worldwide.

The country of Nauru has the least number of Rotarians of any country in the world, 11. Formerly known as Pleasant Island, Nauru is in Micronesia in the South Pacific. Its nearest neighbor is Banaba Island in Kiribati.

The Rotary emblem was printed on a commemorative stamp for the first time in 1931, at the time of the Vienna Convention.

Rotary became bilingual in 1916, when it organized a non-English-speaking club in Cuba.

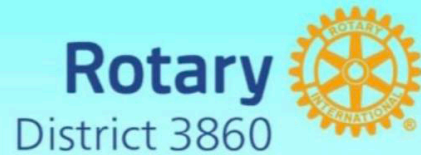

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris’ death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble

objective of furthering “understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations”.

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000- gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.

Love and Rotary in the time of CoViD

Last week on Aug. 1 and 2, our Vice President of the Rotary Anns **Elissa Ruth “Sasa” del Carmen-Lim** celebrated 14 years of being married to PP Renante Angelo “Ran” Lim. Yes, they held two successive wedding events in 2009: a Christian ceremony in Antulang Resort, and Catholic rites at the Bishop’s Palace. *Panigurado-ay!*

Well, the del Carmen-Lim love story is not typical to begin with. Sasa & Ran got acquainted with each other sometime in 2005 through his nieces, who were Teacher Sasa’s students at that time. Fast forward to December of 2008, Sasa & Ran met again, went on *breakfast* dates (because that was the only time of the day they could spare for each other, or maybe the Rotary breakfast meetings had already made such a profound impact on Ran’s life the past five years). Soon, the two decided to get married by August 2009 -- or after eight months of dating. Sasa does not recall of any wedding proposal. “Ran just said he will get mad if I don’t agree to his plans,” recalls Sasa. As a Psychology graduate, she was just thinking: “Oh boy, nobody wants Renante mad!”

Friends who are close to the couple are aware (and now we know!) that Sasa & Ran *don’t* share the same bedroom. “We usually go on separate cars, our activities are mostly independent of each other,” shares Sasa. And it works for them! No qualms, no issues between them. “Most of all, we are happy!” Sasa attests. She says she has been so used to Ran not always being around the home since their first year of their marriage because of his architectural/construction work that takes him around the country. “In fact, the longest Ran would stay home was a month -- and that was whenever I would give birth to each of our three kids.”

Then CoViD happened. Like everybody else, Sasa & Ran were locked down in their home. “We had no choice but to live with each other,” Sasa says. Getting used to seeing and dealing with each other around the house everyday, and adjusting to each other felt like it was just their first year as a married couple. “It was stressful being together 24/7. All the more Ran and I appreciated not sharing the same bed!” (Although we’re not sure now if she was joking.)

What Sasa greatly appreciates about Ran is that although he has been an active Rotarian the past 20 years, he never insisted that she get involved in his civic interests, like Rotary. “Rotary just recently came into my life in 2020 when, in the midst of the pandemic, Ran was elected president of RCDS,” Sasa remembers.



At that time, she thought she had no choice but to accept to lead the Anns “regardless of me not being involved in any prior Rotary activity”.

But leading RCDS during the mentally-challenging time of the pandemic went by quickly, and those two years have clearly worked wonders in strengthening their relationship as a couple. “We used to have different sets of friends, different interests, separate *lakaw*, but with Rotary, we were able to establish common friendships, share the same interest in serving others, and enjoying the same *laag* adventures,” the Bacolod-born Rotary Ann happily says.

In between her role as chief instructor at Eye Level Dumaguete Center (a supplementary program in Math and English) and at Play Company (a playgroup and kids center), Teacher Sasa says Rotary has given her and Ran the opportunity to truly work as a team, aspiring to achieve the same goal. “It gave the word ‘support’ a whole new meaning, and we were able to get through the pandemic with a stronger personal connection.”

Their kids have similarly developed an understanding of and love for Rotary. Their sons, Simon Eli and Ralf Elian, are set to be Rotarians themselves (give it 10 years?); while their princess, Amelia Elise, insists she would someday have to be married to a Rotarian -- so she can also be called ‘Ann’ like her mom.

“So I say, ‘Thank you, Rotary’ because here we are, still *happily married* after 14 years. ‘Happy’ *siya*, ‘married’ *ko!*,” Sasa teases.

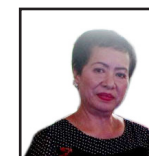
