Minutes of the Meeting on Aug. 9, 2023

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:35 a.m.

1) Sec. Ashley Morelos led the prayer, followed by the singing of the National Anthem, and the Rotary Hymn.

2) Rtn Mark Genove let the recitation of the Four-Way Test and the Object of Rotary.

3) PP Allan Martinez introduced the guests, Baby Rtn. Phillip Yao and Baby Rtn. Randy Quisil.

4) The Philippine National Police invited RCDS to participate in their outreach program in barangay Sabahan in Bais City, where we could interact with Indigenous People. This would be the next day, Thursday, Aug 10 at 9 am.

5) PP Ran Lim discussed about this year's Rotary *Create Hope* shirt design. The chosen supplier is PowerPrints which is based here in Dumaguete.

6) President's Time. Pres. Alex discussed the **activity with the Indigenous People on Aug. 10** at barangay Sab-ahan in Bais.

He also urged the members to join hands with Metro Dumaguete Water in implementing **Brigada Eskwela on Monday, Aug. 14 at Looc Elementary School**. The areas of focus are Basic Education & Literacy, headed by PP Henry Sojor; Water Sanitation & Hygiene led by Rtn. Dave Berba; and Disease Prevention & Treatment headed by PE Loloy Baylon.

He also announced about the RCDS Board meeting on Tuesday, Aug 15 over breakfast at the DCCCO Hotel.

Regarding the projects for the Sept 20 visit of DG Twinkle Gamboa at the Friendly Homes in Cadawinonan, Rtn. Mark Genove, representing the Maternal and Child Health Committee and the Community Service Committee reported that the City Nutrition Office is planning to hold an activity in the area on that day that will improve the health of the children and mothers.

Rtn. Jobert Koerkamp, the head of the environment committee, also talked about a bamboo planting activity along the slopes of the creek beside the Friendly Homes, in line with Worldwide Bamboo Month.

Other Committees were also encouraged to plan an activity that would benefit the community for that day.

Pres. Alex followed up on the plans for the **barrio fiesta lunch on Sept. 20. The committee is headed by VP Jeorex Chua, PE Loloy Baylon, PP Ran Lim. MINUTES OF MEETINGS

Minutes of the RCDS Board Meeting Aug. 15, 2023 @ DCCCO Hotel

Present: Pres. Alex Pal, PE Elmore Baylon, Sec. Ashley Morelos, Treas. Jessie Mascardo, Treas. Gilbert Fuentes, PP Henry Sojor; IPP Ely Bodo, PP Ran Lim.

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 a.m., with Treas. Jessie leading the prayer.

1. Pres. Alex raised the matter of the *Philippine Rotary Magazine*, where we need to pay some arrears.
RESOLVED: Remit RCDS dues to the *Philippine Rotary Magazine* using Club funds from RY 2022-23.
2. On Finances, Treas. Gilbert proposed to start soliciting pledges for the Sustained Assistance to New Officers (SANO) Fund, collectible within the first semester. The pledges will be the Club's counterpart to the contribution of P25,000 from the family of PP Susano "Sano" Sy, through Ann Teena Sy.
RESOLVED: Solicit for pledges from the RCDS members for the SANO Fund.

3. The Board noted how Club funds were being used in the past years to advance for the Rotary International registration of some club members who were unable, for whatever reason, to settle their semestral dues on time. This is not a good accounting practice, and could set a dangerous precedent in how we operate as a Club.

RESOLVED: Require the sponsors of Rotarians to remind their respective 'recruits' to comply with their obligations on time, to relieve the Club from having to advance payments for the members just so our Club is not suspended from RI for non-payment of dues.

RESOLVED FURTHER: Require henceforth new Rotarians to settle their Semestral Dues before induction into the Club.

4. The RI Day of Service for August on Mental Health Awareness, under the area of focus Disease Prevention & Treatment, is an Area-wide program. All four clubs in Area 3D will give 'care packages' to the 50 patients at the Philippine Mental Health Association- Rehabilitation Center in barangay Talay. Each 'care package' will contain underwears, toiletries, and slippers; some toiletries have been donated. Each Club has been assigned to raise at least P7,250. for the care packages.

RESOLVED: Conduct a fund-raising pledging session of at least P160.00 per Rotarian during the Aug. 16 Club meeting to raise at least P7,250. for the Area-wide program.

5. The Rotaract Club of Dumaguete is requesting for financial assistance for the visit of Rotaract District Officers, and for financial assistance in their *Brigada Eskwela* project.

RESOLVED: Donate *seedmoney* of P1,000 from Club funds for the Rotaract to use to make more money, like a bake sale or a plant sale or wash-your-car projects. We can use this small donation as an opportunity to teach the young Rotary volunteers to learn to generate their own funds through various creative ways.

6. With regard to the District Grant of \$1,000 (about P54,000) awarded during the term of IPP Ely Bodo, the District Grants Chair has given RCDS permission to use the grant on another project.
RESOLVED: Authorize IPP Ely Bodo sign the MOA between Silliman University, the PWD Association of Banilad, and RCDS to use the District grant for their candle-making project.
With no other matters to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 8:05 a.m.

First Names or Nicknames

From the earliest days of Rotary, members have referred to each other on a first-name basis.

Since personal acquaintanceship and friendship are cornerstones of Rotary, it was natural that many clubs adopted the practice of setting aside formal titles in conversations among members.

Rotarians who normally would be addressed as Doctor, Professor, Mister, the Honorable, or Sir are regularly called Joe, Bill, Charley, or Jerry by their fellow Rotarians.

The characteristic Rotary club name badge fosters the first-name custom.

In some Asian countries, the practice is to assign each new Rotarian a nickname. The nicknames are frequently a source of good-natured fun and fellowship.

But whether a Rotarian is addressed by a given first name or a nickname, the spirit of personal friendship is the initial step which opens doors to all other opportunities for service.

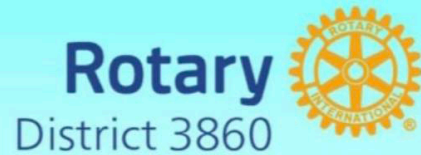

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris’ death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble

objective of furthering “understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations”.

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000- gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.




