SECRETARY'S REPORT

Minutes of the Meeting on Aug. 16, 2023

Pres. Alex called the meeting to order at 6:40 a.m.

1.) Sec. Ashley led the prayer, followed by the National Anthem, Rotary Hymn, then breakfast was served.

2) PP Henry Sojor introduced the guests, including the Anns who joined our breakfast to welcome Marianne, wife of Baby Rtn. Epoy Yao. He also especially welcomed Ann PP Teena Sy, wife of PP Sano Sy, who has continued to support RCDS even after his demise.

3) Rtn. Philip "Epoy" Yao was inducted into RCDS, courtesy of the sponsorship of Rtn. Mars Sy; Charge to the new member by IPP Ely Bodo who is also director for Membership; Oath of membership administered by Pres. Alex, and the pinning of the Rotary pin by new Ann Marianne "Yan" Sy-Yao. The Rotary Anns also welcomed new Ann Marianne. Then new Rtn. Epoy gave his Response where he also paid tribute to his father-in-law, Rtn. Mars Sy, who had convinced him on the benefits of joining RCDS.

4) PP Ran Lim was the Fine Master. Before he began, Rtn. Ran said he had been a Rotarian the past 20 years but it was the first time he was assigned to do the Fine Moments.

5) President's Time. Pres. Alex first acknowledged the significant presence of Ann PP Valentina "Teena" Sy, and thanked the Sy family for their continued financial assistance to RCDS through the Sustained Assistance for New Officers (SANO) Fund.

Ann Teena told the Rotarians she was happy that the Sy family are given the opportunity to fulfill the wishes of PP Sano through RCDS.

Pres. Alex also updated the Club about the Pink October Fun Run, an activity of a group called the Breast Cancer Awareness-Dumaguete, whose leaders are members of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete. Since there is a certain amount of financial sponsorships and manpower required of RCDS, and it does not appear to be a Rotary Area-wide activity per se, we need to seek clarification from AG Mark Trayvilla, who said he will call for a special ACom meeting this week.

We were also reminded about our timely payment of semestral dues. Starting this new year, we are requiring the sponsors of baby Rotarians to remind their respective 'recruits' to comply with the payment of their semestral dues before their induction.

The RCDS Board has authorized IPP Ely Bodo to sign the MOA between Silliman University, the PWD Association of Banilad and RCDS to use the District grant of \$1,000 (about P54,000) for their candle-making project.

For the RI Day of Service on Mental Health Awareness (under the area of focus of Disease Prevention & Treatment), we will be giving 'care packages' to 50 patients at the PMHA Rehab Center (now called the NOPH Extension Psychiatric Ward) in Talay. Each of us needs to pay at last P160. per Rotarian to raise P7,250 per Club for the care packages.

Other matters:

Everyone is requested to submit their T-shirt sizes to PP Ran Lim who is coordinating with PowerPrints to make our shirts.

We also need to produce our RCDS bannerette so that our traveling Rotarians can exchange banners with other Rotary clubs where they make-up around the country or abroad.

With no other matters to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 am.

Ashley Morelos and PE Elmore Baylon appeared, and suddenly there were three of us Southerners! Then IPP Ely Bodo & Ann IPP Rose also joined us for the activity.

The head of the Psychiatric Ward, Vivian Uy Castor, was teary-eyed in her response, as she was recounting that in her 30 years of working there, Rotary has been a "very big help in their operations". Various Rotary Clubs have donated buildings, equipment, and other necessities to ensure their continued operation. She also said the Rotary Club of Dumaguete has been faithfully providing for their breakfast. Even the facility nurse, Potpot Paras, said that in his almost one year in working at the facility, he has seen the active participation of Rotary in support of their operations.

MINUTES OF MEETINGS

Minutes of the Special ACom Meeting Aug. 21, 2023 @ DCCCO Hotel

Present: AG Mark Trayvilla, AG Rey Lyndon Lawas, RCD Sec. Ethel Basolina, RCDN Pres. Joseph Tumacole, RCDN Sec. Greg Konke, RCDS Pres. Alex Pal, RCDS PE Elmore Baylon, RCDS Sec. Ashley Morelos, RCDE Pres. Chiq Fabillar, RCDE Sec Jeff Titong, Rotaract Pres Mark Lanaria, Rotaract Sec. Laden Siquis,

The meeting started at 3:15 pm with AG Mark Trayvilla saying this is a special meeting to discuss two items: The Oct. 8 Pink October Fun Run to promote breast cancer awareness and the District Governor's Night.

1. **Pink October Fun Run.** Rtn. Nonette Ligutom, lead person in the planning of the Pink October Fun Run, gave an overview of the planned activity.

2. She said the BCA is a group promoting Breast Cancer Awareness and 99 percent of the group's members are also Rotarians belonging to the RCD.

3. The BCA has been doing this activity every year as a breast cancer awareness program of the RCD.

4. The BCA is independent but has no legal personality, that's why it co-signs with Rotary in undertaking this event.

5. The four Rotary Clubs of Zone 3D will do their share of soliciting funds and producing registered runners for the Pink October Fun Run. Target amount to be raised is P500,000.

6. In addition to getting sponsorships and registering about 50 runners, each Club will also sell tickets to the runners that will qualify them for the raffle draw.

7. Each club has specific assignments for the activity. For RCDS:

- solicitation letters, registrations forms
- race marshals (PNP and HPG; TMO)
- water stations (thru Nature Spring)
- registration of 50 runners; sell tickets
- Start/Finish arch, canopies (Globe Telecom)

f) media promotion (thru *MetroPost*)

8. The funds collected for this activity from solicitations and registration fees will be divided among the four clubs. But the clubs are asked

that the monies be donated to breast cancer patients who have been identified by the BCA group.

9. Rtn. Nonette also presented a sample of the waiver that will be signed by the participants.

10. AG Mark Trayvilla noted that the BCA has made the plans for this activity without the involvement of Rotarians from the other clubs, and that this does not bind the clubs to support the activity.

He said it appears, based on the logos displayed in the letters, that this is an activity of "BCA in coordination with Rotary". He said if this is to be a Rotary District 3D activity, the only logo appearing on top should be that of "Rotary and nothing else".

11. Sec. Jeff Titong said there is a need to distinguish between BCA and Rotary. Rotary should take the lead, in accordance with the Rotary branding guidelines.

12. Sec. Greg Konke suggested that perhaps this activity can be introduced as "A Rotary District 3D activity for the benefit of the BCA".

13. AG Mark reminded the Club Presidents that all Rotary clubs are required to have an activity on breast cancer awareness in October, and that the clubs may decide to support this breast cancer awareness fun run, or have their own activity.

14. AG Mark called on all Clubs to decide whether they will join this activity, and make this a District activity, or have their own activity for breast cancer awareness. He said their official answer should be soon, to allow the BCA organizers to proceed with their plans.

District Governor's Night will be held on Sept. 22 at Brooke's Place.

1. Rotarians and spouses will be assessed P550 per pax, excluding the cost for lights & sounds, which has yet to be finalized.

2. The cost for lights & sounds will be divided by five. The four clubs of Dumaguete will each shoulder 1/5th of the total cost; Area 3E clubs, covering Bais, Tolong, and Siquijor, will each shoulder 1/3rd of 1/5th of the total cost.

3. The theme for the Governor's Night is *Sparkle with Twinkle*.

With both agenda discussed, the meeting was adjourned at 5:00 p.m.

What is a Rotary club?

How do you describe the organization called "Rotary"? There are so many characteristics of a Rotary club, as well as the activities of a million Rotarians. There are the features of service, internationality, fellowship, classifications of each vocation, development of goodwill and world understanding, the emphasis of high ethical standards, concern for other people and many more descriptive qualities.

In 1976, the Rotary International Board of Directors was interested creating a concise definition of the fundamental aspects of Rotary. They turned to the three men who were then serving on Rotary's Public Relations Committee, and requested that a one-sentence definition of Rotary be prepared. After numerous drafts, the Committee presented a definition which has been used ever since in various Rotary publications: **"Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world."** Those 31 words are worth remembering when someone asks you what a Rotary club is.

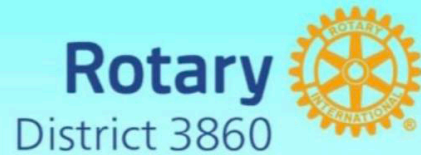

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris’ death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble

objective of furthering “understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations”.

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000- gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.
