- 6) Baby Rotarian Jim Karl Jardiniano was inducted as the Club's newest member.
- 7) PP Henry Sojor led another fun-filled Fine Moments.
- 8) Rtn. Ron Fungo, who agreed to become the chair of the Peace-Building & Conflict- Prevention area of focus, gave an update about the Peace and Order condition of Dumaguete City in the aftermath of the stabbing incident of an innocent civilian on Sept. 4. The event was captured on CCTV, and the video reached the Manila media and became viral online. Rtn. Ron assured the public that the incident was isolated, and that it was only because of social media that the incident was blown out of proportion.
- 8) Rtn. Bernard Louie Abangan, fresh from his trip abroad, turned over to Pres. Alex the bannerettes he had collected from various Rotary Clubs outside the country.
- 9) Scenarios on the Sept. 20 program were shared by the heads of the Areas of Focus teams; while Ann Ylang Jordan also shared the plan of the Anns, in coordination with Rtn. Aldrin Ramirez and Rtn. Carl Rabaca.
- 10) The President urged the members to pay the assessments in time for the September activities, and encouraged the members to join the choral practice at 5 p.m. that day.
- 11) The President also mentioned some highlights of the Area Committee meeting held last Sept. 5 (the Minutes of which are printed in this issue).

With no other matters to discuss, the meeting adjourned at 8:14 a.m.

"After a dinner with friends, an idea came to me: why does this great Chicago, Illinois not have a group of friends from different professions, without taking into account either their political opinions or their religion, with broad acceptance of the opinions of each?

Couldn't this friendship provide the basis for mutual assistance?

I did not immediately follow up on my sparkling idea; months, and even years passed. In the course of great events, a man who believes in what he is doing must walk alone for a certain time.

It was finally in February 1905 that I asked three young professionals -- Silvester Schiele, Gustavus Loehr, and Hiram Shorey -- to join me to present to them my project of 'mutual cooperation and simple friendship' as each of us had known it in our village.

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harriss Fellow is recognized for sorvice to the club and the companity.

A Paul Harriss Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community. The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International. Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations". In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.
