## SECRETARY'S REPORT

### Minutes of Sept. 13 meeting

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:35 a.m.

1) The Secretary led the invocation, the Philippine National Anthem was sung, followed by the Rotary Hymn.

2) With PE Loloy Baylon as the master of ceremonies, Rtn. Mark Genove led the reading of the Four-Way Test while the guests were introduced by PP Henry Sojor.

3) Over breakfast, the Rotarians listened to the AV of *Where Hope is Planted*, that documented our shoe donation activity to usher in the Rotary New Year back in July.

4) After breakfast was the Fellowship Singing led by PP Junny Dumalag. He chose the song *Sing a Song* by the Carpenters.

4) PP Henry Sojor led the Fine Moments, highlighting the achievements of Rotarians, and imposing fines for achieving much.

5) Treas. Jessie Mascardo updated the Club on the status of our funds, as he continued to encourage everyone to complete their payments for the Create Hope t-shirt, the barrio fiesta lunch, and the Governor's Night.

6) IPP Ely Bodo urged everyone to complete the Membership Survey which aims to collect the sentiments of Club members about the status of the Club. He noted that the Club had 47 members during the leadership of PP Andre Jacobo (2018-19), and has since gone down to 31, after several members had to be delisted due to non-payment of dues.

He said the number of RCDS members further decreased to 29 during the time of Pres. Ran Lim (2020-22) due to the pandemic. He said RCDS managed to survive, even as other clubs had to be dissolved because of declining membership.

He reported that his term as president (2022-2023) began with 33 members, and ended with 43.

As of September this month, the RCDS roster of membership has reached 49 members, an addition of six new/returning members in the last three months since the new Rotary year started in July.

7) The membership survey, IPP Ely said, is in line with Rotary International's Impact, Reach, Engage and Adapt.

7) **President's Time.** Pres. Alex updated the Club of the plans for the District Governor's visit on Sept. 20. A lot of things need to be done, such as the physical cleanup of the TMF/RCDS Farm, Friendly Homes, and the barrio fiesta lunch.

There was also an update on the activity shirts, as well as the rehearsal times for the RCDS presentation for the Governor's Night.

8) Pres. Alex also thanked the Rotary Anns for giving their full support to the preparations for the visit of the District Governor.

With no other matters to discuss, the meeting adjourned at 8:14.

In behalf of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South, I take immense pride in welcoming our guests -- District Governor Rozanne "Twinkle" Cocon-Gambo, her spouse and District Learning Facilitator Archie Gamboa, and Chief-of-Staff Philip Estocada.

This is their second visit to our Club as we also had the singular honor in June of having them as our guests during our Induction & Turn-over ceremony.

The visit of the District Governor is one of the highlights of any Rotary Club's existence. Somewhere in this *Spinning Wheel* is an article describing the role of the District Governor and the importance of club visits that she selflessly makes.

Rotary has changed over the years. We did not have social media back in the 90s, so each Rotary Club had to rely on the Governor's visit to see how they fared in relation to the District Goals.

Today, one can see how a particular Rotary Club is doing by accessing the District website. Such information can be useful, or it can be a source of stress, especially if your club is trailing the other clubs.

As a background, the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South had established through the years two foundations: the Rtn. Martin "Ting" Matiao (TMF) Foundation, and the Rtn. Rajan Dulamal Rotary Operation: Share-a-Smile (ROSAS) Foundation.

Our signature program beginning this year is the adoption of 'Friendly Homes' located in barangay Cadawinonan. This area gives RCDS an opportunity to serve the community holistically, wherein our creative forms of assistance cover each of Rotary's seven areas of focus:

### Peace-building & Conflict-Prevention

1) Distributed empty drums to identified Indigenous Peoples in Sabahan, Bais City where they can store potable water. IP communities are considered a high-risk population for recruitment by communist rebels, and needs government attention, and assistance for their social needs from private groups like Rotary.

2. Anti-Drug Seminar to residents at Friendly Homes.

3. Anti-Crime Seminar to residents at Friendly Homes.



### Disease Prevention & Treatment

1. District-wide Bloodletting Activity; produced 5,400 ml. of life-saving blood pool;

2. *Brigada Eskwela*

3. District-wide Mental Health Awareness activity

4. Medical Mission at Friendly Homes

5. Run-Walk to End Polio



### Water, Sanitation & Hygiene

1. Donated empty barrels to IP communities in Bais that they can use as water containers

## Rotary Factoids

### The District Governor

The Rotary District Governor performs a very significant function in the world of Rotary. She/he is the single **officer of Rotary International** in a geographic area called a Rotary District, which usually includes about 45 Rotary clubs.

The district governors, who have been extensively trained at the worldwide International Assembly, provide the **"quality control"** for the 27,000 Rotary clubs of the world. They are responsible for **maintaining high performance** within the clubs of their District.

The District Governor, who must make an official visit to each club in the District, is never regarded as an inspector general. Rather, she/he visits the Clubs as a **helpful and friendly adviser to the Club officers**, as a **useful counselor** to further the Object of Rotary among the Clubs of the District, and as a **catalyst to help strengthen the programs** of Rotary.

The District Governor is a **highly-experienced Rotarian** who generously devotes a year to the **volunteer task of leadership**. The Governor has a **wealth of knowledge about current Rotary programs, purposes, policies, and goals**, and is a person of **recognized high standing** in her/his profession, community, and Rotary Club.

The Governor supervises the organization of new clubs, and strengthens existing ones. She/he performs a host of specific duties to assure that the quality of Rotary does not falter in the District, and is **responsible to promote and implement all programs and activities of the Rotary International President and the RI Board of Directors**. The Governor plans and directs a District Conference, and other special events.

## THE ROTARY CLUB OF DUMAGUETE SOUTH

### The Beginning of Service

Depending on where one is in the world, Dec. 7 is often filled with fond memories of people of this generation. It was on this day in 1941 that the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor which led to the declaration of war by the United States.

But for people in the Philippines, particularly in Dumaguete City, Dec. 7 is marked with fondness because 46 years ago, a second Rotary Club was born to serve the needs of Dumaguete, Negros Oriental, and Siquijor.

Like the Christmas story, the history of the **Rotary Club of Dumaguete South** is one story that is told and retold to make everyone remember the sacrifices and achievements of the Club in its 46-year history.

It started with the vision of two men -- Rtn. Martin "Ting" Matiao and PP Andres "Andy" Ricardo -- of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete. Both Rotarians loved Rotary so much that they would not want to miss a single meeting.

For each absence, they would take pains to make-up just to maintain their record as "100 percenters". But at that time, there was only one Rotary Club in Negros Oriental. To make-up for any absence from a meeting, Rtn. Ting and PP Andy had to go to Rotary Clubs in other cities, even taking a plane to Ozamiz City one time.

Realizing that they might not be able to sustain with this costly endeavor, they decided on the next best thing: form a new Rotary Club.

In 1977, Rtn. Ting and Rtn. Andy began the recruitment of leaders in the community to comprise what would soon become the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South.

The main thrust of RCDS was to become a civic club that would encourage and foster the ideals of genuine service among its members, and to demonstrate these in their personal, business, and community lives.

Calling for respected, responsible, upright citizens who were genuinely willing to serve their community, the search was fruitful. Soon, 27 men were tapped to comprise the new club. Among the 27 leaders, Rtn. Willes Matiao was elected Charter President, and served for two terms.

By Dec. 7, 1977, the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South got its Charter approval from Rotary International. It was officially presented to the community on Feb. 12, 1978 by PDG George Royeca and PDGR Quintin "King" Doromal from Dumaguete.

Barely six months into its infancy, the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South began to live up to its

motto of service for the community. Alongside the Rotary Club of Dumaguete, the new Club spearheaded the preparations and hosting of the 4th District Assembly held at the Silliman University Luce Auditorium. And along with the other clubs in Negros Oriental, the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South hosted the 8th District Assembly at the SU Main Library.

Continuing its thrust for the betterment of the community, the baby Club that time helped to construct a portion of the Talay Rehabilitation Center, now called the Negros Oriental Psychiatric Extension Clinic.

The Club also built an outpost for the Philippine Constabulary/Integrated National Police, now the Philippine National Police, at the junction of the south national highway and Romero Road to Valencia.

That was only the beginning.

In 1986, the dedication and hard work that Rotary Club Dumaguete South demonstrates to be of service to the less-privileged communities started to gain more recognition from the public. The Club was awarded Most Outstanding Club of District 386 (now District 3860), and the No. 1 Club in the District (Most Improved Capita) Award in 1995.

The leaders of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South were also awarded for their exemplary service and dedication. PP Youman "Boy" Uymatiao, PP Patrick "Bebot" Chua, PP Antonio "Tony" Paalan, PP Raul Villanueva, PP Zachary "Zachy" Beltran, PP Apolonio "Boy" Diputado, PP Raul Dumalag, and PP Danilo "Danny" Olegario were honored with Most Outstanding Club President Awards, to say nothing of PP-GGR Alex "Jun" Amor Jr., who was given the Exemplary District Officer Award in 1991. PP Dominador "Junny" Dumalag was given the Special Distinction Award as chairperson of PETS/DISTAS '88.

The RCDS has been around the last 46 years, and its commitment to the community continues unabated. These Rotarians do not work for awards, honor, nor distinction. They work because they are part of the Rotary Club and its ideals; a club that calls for service, dedication, and hard work from all its members, all for the good of a community that needs all the help it can get.

Service was what started it; service is what keeps it going; and service will always be the main goal of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South. **(Alex Rey Pal)**

## THE RTN. TING MATIAO FOUNDATION (TMF)

The year was 1982. Five years after the Charter of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South, an extension arm to implement sustainable service to the community was conceptualized by then-Pres. Sebellon "Bill" Wale. Then the head of the Silliman University Extension Office, Pres. Bill thought that an extension program can be replicated by the RCDS in the form of a Foundation.

The idea was fully accepted by the members and contributions for seed funding came pouring in. Birthdays and Anniversaries were the usual occasion for Rotarians to contribute monies to the Foundation.

Soon enough, the Foundation started to award scholarships to deserving students, funded by the interest savings of the seed money.

The Rotarians' involvement in various community projects caught the attention of the Negros Oriental provincial government, that RCDS members were invited to get involved in the planning and implementation of activities of the Province.

PP Bill Wale and PP Dominador "Junny" Dumalag Jr. were heavily involved with the Economic Development Management System (EDMS) program of the Province, and PP Alex Amor Jr. with the Provincial Agriculturist's Office Fisheries Council. PP Gregorio "Greg" Uymatiao Jr. was also involved with the People's Economic Council (PEC).

True to its mandate of 'People Power', the new Philippine administration of President Corazon Aquino called on NGOs in the country to help rebuild the new government. One of the programs of President Aquino then was the construction of school buildings through its Presidential Social Fund. NGOs with good track record were needed to implement such projects.

That time, the province of Negros Oriental was made a recipient of the construction project of some 35 school buildings but unfortunately, there weren't any legitimate and capable NGOs to assume such undertaking. Thus, the vibrant Gov. Emilio Macias II challenged RCDS Rotarians to take on the responsibility, or risk losing the allocation for the Province.

The offer was tempting, challenging, noble, but very risky to the pockets of the Rotarians. Who would dare undertake the school building construction -- mostly in the hinterlands -- and pay only half the price of the usual government budget?

The Foundation, with seed money of P90,000, was eventually registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission through the efforts of PP Honorato "Andy" Andaya, as a non-profit, non-stock, self-sustaining organization. It was then officially named the Rtn. Martin "Ting" Matiao Foundation, Inc. (TMF) in honor of Rtn. Ting Matiao who pioneered the organization of the RCDS.

The TMF not only completed the 35 units of school buildings in the City of Dumaguete and the Province of Negros Oriental, it also built 12 more units of school buildings in Siquijor Province across the sea.

The following year, another 22 units were turned over to the Province of Negros Oriental by the Presidential Management Staff.

In line with TMF's primary purpose to initiate and help implement socio-economic programs, the Foundation ventured into micro-financing for micro- and small business enterprises to help them upgrade their businesses to ensure better income for them and their families.

The TMF has been the implementing arm of the programs of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South, acts as a channel of aid during calamities, and helps promote health services in various communities around the Province and beyond. (PP Greg Uymatiao Jr.)

### What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering “understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations”.

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.

## PROFILE OF DISTRICT GOVERNOR 3860

Our honored guest, **District Governor Rozanne “Twinkle” Cocon-Gamboa**, joined Rotary 22 years ago in 2001, and has since occupied various key positions.

After 15 years of active membership in the Rotary, DG Twinkle became an All-Star President during RY 2016-17. During her presidency, the Rotary Club of Downtown Davao was awarded the Most Outstanding Club, besting 98 clubs in the District.

Under her leadership, the Rotary Club of Downtown Davao also received three Rotary International citation awards: the first one involved their service project called Shelter for Battered Women; the second award was for the exemplary performance of their Rotaract Club; and the third citation was for her Spouse, District Learning Facilitator Archie Gamboa, who was recognized as one of the 50 Most Outstanding Spouses in the World.

After her presidency, the birth of a series of District positions followed: In 2017, she was appointed Assistant Governor of Area 2C, handling five clubs, while at the same time for the next two years, was chairperson for Mindanao for “Pink October”, the District’s breast cancer awareness program.

In that same year, DG Twinkle was appointed a member of the gala committee of The One Philippines, an international humanitarian award body. She was our representative to the *Philippine Rotary Magazine* in 2019; the District’s Endowment & Major Gifts sub-committee chair in 2020; the District Coordinator for the Rotary Presidential Conference 2021 Manila, and the Empowering Girls Initiative; and the District’s Promotion chairperson for the Rotary International Convention held in June last year in Houston, Texas, and the Rotary Institute held in December that same year in Abu Dhabi.

Passionately believing in the advocacy of The Rotary Foundation, DG Twinkle and Spouse Archie became active donors of the chartered Polio Plus Society, committing themselves to contribute each year to the program, “until the world has been declared free of the wild polio virus”. They have been named Endowment Fund Benefactors for including the Rotary Endowment Fund as beneficiary in their estate plans; and have been invited to the Bequest Society, reserved



for those who have committed gifts to the Rotary Foundation of at least US\$10,000 or more.

More than those three prestigious recognitions, the Cocon-Gamboa Rotarian couple are members of the elite Arch Klumph Society-Trustees Circle, named after PP Arch Klumph, who was the 6th president of Rotary International.

The Trustees Circle is composed of those who have donated to the Rotary Foundation at least US\$250,000 to half a million US dollars. The photo and biography of the Cocon-Gamboa Rotarian spouses as Arch Klumph Society-Trustees Circle is displayed in the gallery of the Rotary International headquarters in Evanston, Illinois.

Our District Governor was born and raised in Butuan City. She is happily married to IPP Archie Francisco Gamboa, with whom she has two children: Tym, married to Dr. Shey Ongchua, with grandson Aaron Travis; and Mariane, married to Alvin Mosquisa.

All throughout her life as a Rotarian and as a community leader, DG Twinkle has always been guided by the Four-Way Test, constantly giving gratitude to Rotarians worldwide who have helped and molded her into what she has become today.

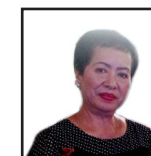
