SECRETARY'S REPORT

a chance to pay their last respects to Rtn. Eddy Vergara during his funeral service and cremation.

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:30 a.m. 1) Sec. Ashlev Morelos led the Invocation, which was followed by the singing of the Philippine National Anthem. For some reason, the AV recording of *The Rotary Hymn* could not be found so everyone sang it acapella.

2) Rtn. Mark Genove introduced the week's guest speaker, Ms.

Delia Serion, the Dumaguete City Nutrition action officer.
3) Then breakfast was served. By 7:10, PP Boy Diputado led the fellowship singing with You are the Sunshine of My Life.

4) Then as the guest speaker was preparing to give her message, SAA Edo Adriano went around the Rotarians for the Fine Moments.

5) Ms. Delia Serion, the Dumaguete City Nutrition action officer, spoke about the nutrition situation in the Philippines. She said the incidences of 'stunting' have reached an alarming level, resulting in Filipinos being the second shortest people in the ASEAN. No, it has nothing to do with genetics either; but a result of a micro-nutrient deficiency which can be remedied by a sustained feeding program.

Malnutrition is a big problem in Dumaguete, Ms. Serion said, because a) most establishments are not compliant with the Magna Carta for women; b) the mandated lactation stations in the workplace intended for breastfeeding mothers are being converted into storerooms; and c) women employees are not entitled to more than two months of maternity leave that could encourage breastfeeding of newborn babies.

There have been countries that have dramatically reduced stunting. In the Philippines, the province of Quezon is the pilot province for the country's nutrition program, and is now what the City Nutrition Office wants to implement in Dumaguete, particularly in barangay Cadawinonan, which has also been chosen as pilot area.

6) After her talk, Ms. Serion and Pres. Alex Pal, in behalf of RCDS, signed an MOA to be partners in developing the nutritional needs of the residents of Friendly Homes.

7) President's Time. Pres. Alex requested the younger Rotarians, and also Charter members -- who have witnessed Governor's Visits the past 46 years since in 1977 -- to evaluate the Club's preparation and implementation of plans for DG Twinkle Gamboa's visit on Sept.

PP Henry Sojor said that on a scale of Poor, Fair, Successful. and Very Successful, he would rate RCDS as "Very Successful", which was also shared by long-time Treas. Tona Matiao. PP Junny Dumalag said RCDS was "very prepared" to host the DG, resulting in a "successful activity". For his part, PP Boy Diputado attributed the Club's "successful hosting" to the "good leadership, coupled with the full cooperation of all Rotarians", and encouraged everyone to share a round of applause. Rtn.Bernard Abangan said our hosting of the DG was "not only very satisfactory but a very exciting event", of which Sec. Ashley shared the same opinion. Congratulations to all

RCDS members and Anns! Pres. Alex then encouraged the Rotarians and Anns to participate in the Rotary activities scheduled for the week: a medical mission for senior citizens in barangay Cadawinonan on Oct. 5; a mangrove planting activity in Ajong, Sibulan on Oct. 7; and the Breast Cancer Awareness Run on Oct. 8 at 5a.m.

There being no other matters to discuss, the meeting adjourned at 8:04 a.m.

For the over-40 members of the PWD community, our project of a candle-making machine, funded by a Rotary District Grant, is the answer to their prayers for a better livelihood, as this will make them produce four times the number of candles for the same amount of time.

I'm inviting you all to see the contraption right after our meeting this morning. We will go to barangay Banilad where we can observe them at work. Today is also the day they start producing candles for All Saints' Day and All Soul's Day, about two weeks from now. What great timing!

This Community Economic Development project was awarded to RCDS by the District during the term of IPP Ely Bodo. Now we, and the PWD Association of Banilad, Dumaguete City benefit from the tireless efforts of our Club officers of RI Year 2022-23.

Our partner group, the Nutritionists & Dietitians Association of the Philippines-Negros Oriental Chapter, through the Dumaguete City Nutrition office, headed by Action Officer Delia Serion, is again inviting us to another opportunity to be of service to the community, by way of providing eye check-ups and reading glasses to Barangay Nutrition Scholars from four provinces -- Negros Oriental, Bohol, Siguijor and Cebu.

These scholars will converge here in Dumaguete on Thursday, Nov. 9 for their BNS Congress at the Pantawan.

Our Disease-Prevention & Treatment area of focus team, led by PE Lolov **Baylon**, is again eager to be of service to our community, and he would definitely need our support once more for this activity. **Surely, the** team has able members for this Nov. 9 event: PP Jone Amante, Rtn. Jed Amor, and PP Joe Chiu and their Anns.

Those who have joined us in our previous activities have reported that they thoroughly enjoyed spending time with our beneficiaries. So once again, I encourage you all to join us in this activity. Your presence -- including the support of your Anns -- means a lot for RCDS because it projects that indeed, we are a strong club.

Last week, we laid to rest the remains of our friend and fellow Rotarian, Eddy Vergara. He had been a member of our club for over 30 years. Surely,

he loved RCDS, and that's why he was always around all those years.

After Rtn. Eddy's cremation last week, Ann Vinia Vergara wrote a message of thanks, which I'd like to share with all of us:

My dear friends and families -- During this challenging time, our hearts are heavy with grief but we are comforted by the outpouring of love and support from families and friends. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all those who offered their prayers, sent flowers, mass cards, and gave financial support. Thank you is not enough. But deep within our hearts, we are forever grateful. Thank you all.

We also went through three other activities since our last club meeting. The first was our participation in the Elderly Filipinos Week celebration last October 5, where we again gave out eyeglasses. The response was overwhelming, in that we ran out of eyeglasses that were for senior citizens. The people who went to the activity at the Calindagan covered court saw us in our T-shirts and our club banner. I heard comments like, "ah, mao diay ni ang Rotary!" For them, it was their first time to see Rotarians in action.

Then, on Saturday, we participated in the mangrove planting activity of the Alliance of Mangrove Planters in Oriental Negros. The activity was sponsored by the alumni of the Ship for Southeast Asian Youth Program, which sends young people from southeast Asian countries on a cruise around the southeast Asian countries so they would get to know more about our region. Again, the RCDS was the only Rotary Club to join over 300 volunteers from government agencies, non-government agencies, socio-civic clubs, private corporations and the academe. We again had a fun time!

The following day, we joined the Breast Cancer Awareness run sponsored by our mother club, the Rotary Club of Dumaguete. It was a very successful event in that it logged the biggest-ever number of participants. Rotary Factoids

The Sponsor of a New Member

The Bylaws of Rotary International clearly outline the procedure for a prospective member to be invited for Rotary club membership. The "Proposer" is the key person in the growth and advancement of Rotary. Without a Sponsor, an individual will never have the opportunity to become a Rotarian.

The task of the Proposer should not end merely by submitting a name to the Club Secretary or to the head of the Membership Committee. Rotary has not established formal responsibilities for Proposers/Sponsors, however, by custom and tradition, these procedures are recommended in many clubs. The Sponsor should:

- 1. Invite a prospective member to several meetings prior to proposing the individual for membership.
- 2. Accompany the prospective new member to one or more orientation/informational meetings.
 - 3. Introduce the new member to other Club members each week for the first month.
- 4. Invite the new member to accompany the Sponsor to neighboring Clubs for the first make-up meeting, to learn the process, and observe the spirit of fellowship.
- 5. Ask the new member and spouse to accompany the Sponsor to the club's social activities, dinners, or other special occasions.
 - 6. Urge the new member and spouse to attend the District Conference with the Sponsor.
- 7. Serve as a "special friend" to assure that the new member becomes an active Rotarian. When the proposer follows these guidelines. Rotary becomes stronger with each new

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

efforts around the world.

A Paul Harriss Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations". In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain

popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world. the world.
