## SECRETARY'S REPORT

### Minutes of Oct. 18 meeting

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:30 a.m.

- 1) Rtn Jed Amor led the Invocation, followed by the national anthem and rotary hymn.
- 2) PE Elmore led the recitation of The Four Way Test and the Object of Rotary.
- 3) PP Boy Diputado led the fellowship singing.
- 4) PP Henry Sojour led the fine moments wherein everybody was fined for their accomplishments the past week.
- 5) **President's Time.** Pres. Alex announced that after our regular meeting will be the formal turnover of the candle-making machine to the PWD Association of Banilad, Dumaguete City, which is our project spearheaded by the Community Economic Development area of focus team, headed by Rtn. Aming Jordan. This project was funded by a Rotary District Grant during the term of IPP Ely Bodo in RI Year 2022-23.
- 6) Pres. Alex announced what transpired during the Oct. 11 meeting of the Area Committee (ACom), chief of which is the End Polio Campaign. Every club is encouraged to have their own activity and PP Allan will take charge of our Ride to End Polio.
- 7) The Assistant Governor also presented the financial report during the District Governor's Night during the ACom meeting.
- 8) Regarding our proposed activities at Friendly Homes:
  - a) The plan on Water, Sanitation & Hygiene area of focus, headed by Rtn. Dave Berba, is being studied further;
  - b) The Maternal & Child Health area of focus, led by PN Niño Viking, informed us that the NOPH Pediatric Department head will be back next week, and can be invited to speak to our Club about our partnership.
  - c) For Disease-Prevention & -Treatment area of focus, led by PE Loloy Baylon, the City Nutrition Office Action Officer Delia Serion had reported to us that they are still profiling the residents of Friendly Homes. She revealed that the reports of her field workers said many residents have since moved out because they could not pay the monthly installment, and have resettled along the creek.
  - d) On the construction of the houses, led by the Community Economic Development area of focus headed by PN Aming Jordan, it was suggested that Rtn. Aldrin Ramirez might be able to help us expedite the permitting documents from the City Planning & Development Office and the City Engineer's Office as he is very familiar with the process.
- 9) Pres. Alex suggested that inasmuch as we already have a profile of the residents of Friendly Homes, we might be able to plan something for them for Christmas. We can discuss this in our Board meeting on Nov.7.
- 10) The President reiterated our attendance during the **Foundation Night on Nov. 18 in Davao City, Dec. 8-10 in Taiwan for the Zone Institute; May 3-5 in Davao for the DisCon** where we have all been invited to do a repeat performance; and on **May 25-29 in Singapore for the RI Convention.**
- 11) For other matters, visiting Rotarian PP Mark Higgins (2005-06) was given some time to share with the Club some of his thoughts, having been gone for some time. He said that since he retired, he goes back and forth to the UK. And while he's here, he wants to attend more Rotary meetings and that it's good to be back.

With no other matter to discuss, Pres Alex adjourned the meeting at 7:45 am.

### Creating hope



As PP Henry Sojour had said, "The tear is the most expensive liquid on earth; it is composed of one percent water and 99 percent feelings."

In Rotary, we can say this is so true especially for people whose lives we have touched.

Last week, we turned over a candle-making machine to the PWD Association of Barangay Banilad. The machine allows them to increase their productivity by more than four times for the same effort.

With me during the turnover rites were Rtn. Epo Yao representing the Community Economic Development area of focus, PE Loloy Baylon, Sec. Ashley Morelos, Treas. Gilbert Fuentes, PP Boy Diputado, PP Henry Sojour, and baby Rotarian Nonoy Ligutom.

We were joined by Dr. Mirabelle Encoy and Prof. Leonidas Cañete of the Silliman University College of Business Administration, our partner in this outreach activity designed to improve the economic condition of persons with disabilities.

I explained to the PWD Association that this project is funded by a District Grant from Rotary International through our District 3860.

The vice president of the PWD Association, Novelita Christina Umbac, was asked to give a response. Then she started to cry.

I was thinking how happy they must be to be able to express their emotions only through

tears, as words seemed inadequate to tell us how grateful they are to Rotary, and to Silliman CBA who linked up with them to help them improve their lives.

*What you will get from Rotary will be in proportion to what you can give to Rotary. We hear this every time we induct a new Rotarian.*

For this particular candle-making machine project, it did not demand our personal money or talent. It only required our time, our physical presence. Those of us who were able to participate in the turnover were really blessed to witness such a rare expression of gratitude.

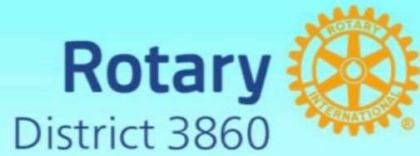
And this is what keeps us going in Rotary -- that we are able to improve lives, and best of all, *Create Hope in the World.*

## Rotary Factoids

### Four Avenues of Service

The term "Four Avenues of Service" is frequently used in Rotary literature and information. The "Avenues" refer to the four elements of the Object of Rotary: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service, and International Service.

Although the Avenues of Service are not found in any formal part of the constitutional documents of Rotary, the concept has been accepted as a means to describe the primary areas of Rotary activity.

- "Club Service" involves all of the activities necessary for Rotarians to perform to make their club function successfully.
- "Vocational Service" is a description of the opportunity each Rotarian has to represent the dignity and utility of one's vocation to the other members of the club.
- "Community Service" pertains to those activities which Rotarians undertake to improve the quality of life in their community. It frequently involves assistance to youth, the aged, handicapped and others who look to Rotary as a source of hope for a better life.
- "International Service" describes the many programs and activities which Rotarians undertake to advance international understanding, goodwill and peace. Its projects are designed to meet humanitarian needs of people in many lands.

When a Rotarian understands and travels down the "Four Avenues of Service," the **Object of Rotary** takes on even greater meaning.

### What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering “understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations”.

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.

### Farmers-for-a-Cause

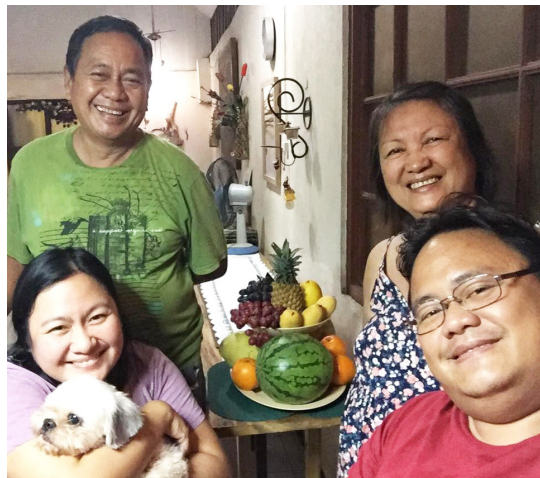
**Gloria Emily Salinas-Amor** is Ann PP Boots, for short. When her husband Alex J. Amor Jr. joined the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South as one of the Charter members on Dec. 7, 1977, Boots automatically became one of the active pioneering members of RCDS Rotary Anns.

Ann Boots and Past President and Past Assistant Governor Alex are engaged in the manufacture of organic fertilizer. They use earthworms to produce vermicaste as organic fertilizer. They also produce beneficial microorganisms that can be used in enhancing the use of nutrients from the soil to the plants, and which can aid in reducing odor in pets, backyards, as well as industrial poultry and piggery.

As a spouse of a Rotarian, Ann Boots has served as Secretary of RCDS Anns for two terms during the Rotary years 1977-1979. Then she was elected President of RCDS Anns in the Rotary year 1986-1987.

As active Rotarians the past 46 years, one can imagine how ingrained the Four-Way Test and the Object of Rotary have been in their lives. Indeed, Rotary has become a way of life for the Amor family.

Their 'Rotary Babies', Dr. Avelex S. Amor



and Apple Kristine S. Amor, have themselves experienced and participated in almost all Rotary activities as they were growing up in the 80s. Doc Avelex, the esteemed 'Doctor to the Barrios', eventually joined RCDS in 2003.

Apple Kristine is now pursuing her PhD in Environmental Science at the University of the Philippines-Diliman.

## RCDS ANNS AUDITOR'S REPORT

Greetings Fellow Rotary Anns. I hope all is well with you and your family.

I'd like to share with you the key points discussed during our first Rotary Ann meeting held on July 21, 2023 at Max's Paseo Perdices, specifically concerning our ROTARY ANNS FUND:

1. Current Balance: As of July 21, 2023, our fund balance stands at P18,113.85

2. Pandemic Year Contributions: It's worth noting that during the challenging pandemic years, only four Rotary Anns made contributions covering RY 2020-2023. The contributions from that year have already been allocated as previous years' contributions.

3. Inclusive Membership: It's essential to emphasize that all spouses of Rotarians, whether actively engaged or inactive, are regarded as Rotary Anns.

4. Fund Utilization: The Rotary Ann Fund is intended to cover various expenses arising from Rotary activities, including, but not limited to, decorations, tokens, talent/trainer's fees, and other associated overhead costs. Additionally, it can support other initiatives as agreed upon by the Rotary Anns.

5. Annual Contribution: The standard annual contribution for each Rotary Ann remains at P500.00

6. Fund Custodians: Treasurer Ann Vinia Vergara and Assistant Treasurer Ann Alma Ramirez are entrusted with the responsibility of securely managing the fund.

7. Payment Convenience: For your convenience, we now accept Gcash transfers through Auditor Ann Ann June Cayang, which will be subsequently remitted in cash to Treasurer Ann Vinia Vergara.

### IDENTIFIED WEAKNESSES IN THE ROTARY ANNS FUND

1. Collection Efforts: Historically, our collection efforts have been somewhat lax, leading to uneven participation.

2. Underutilized Funds: Funds from previous Rotary Years have not been fully utilized for relevant expenses, often relying on the financial contributions of a select few active individuals.

3. Communication Gap: The importance and purpose of the Fund have not been adequately disseminated, contributing to a lack of awareness.

### PROPOSED ACTIONS TO ADDRESS THESE WEAKNESSES:

1. Streamlined Collection: Going forward, the primary responsibility for fund collection will rest with the Treasurer and the President. The Auditor will provide oversight and support to ensure accountability.

2. Transparency: Meeting minutes, including details related to the Rotary Ann Fund, will be included in the *Spinning Wheel*, albeit on select occasions. This will help create awareness, primarily among our Rotarians.

3. Optimizing Fund Utilization. We will endeavor to utilize the Rotary Ann Fund as the primary source for overhead expenses related to all Rotarian activities and events. This approach aims to fulfill the Fund's intended purpose, and encourage active participation in Rotary Ann meetings.

In closing, I urge all Rotary Anns to rally together, and help us strengthen the foundation of our Rotary Anns Fund. By addressing these weaknesses and promoting transparency and inclusivity, let's embark on a journey to transform our collective impact, and ensure the success of our Rotarian activities for Rotary Year 2023-2024 and beyond. This Fund is a critical lifeline for our community, ensuring that we can provide the necessary resources.
