SECRETARY'S REPORT

Jan Ashley "Ashley" E. Morelos



Minutes of Dec. 6 meeting:

- Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:30 a.m.
- 1) Rtn. JunRex Bungabong led the invocation.
 - 2) After the Pambansang Awit and the Rotary Hymn, Sec. Ashley led the recitation of the Four-Way Test.
 - 3) Our singing superstar, PP Boy Diputado, led the Rotarians in singing *Roll Out Rotarians*.
 - 4) Sec. Ashley was also the Fine Master, who fined everyone without exception.
 - 5) **President's Time.** Pres. Alex Pal thanked everyone for the successful celebration of the 46 years of active involvement of RCDS in the community. **He especially thanked Rtn. Aldrin Ramirez & Ann Alma for heading the planning of the Christmas Luau** and the surprise number; our 27 Charter members for their vision 46 years ago; and more specifically, **PP Jun Amor, PP Raul Dumalag, Rtn. Wilkie Matiao, PP Willes Matiao, Rtn. Tona Matiao, Rtn. Wilson Matiao, PP Henry Sojor, PP Greg Uymatiao Jr., and PP Boy Youman Uymatiao.** He also expressed gratitude to **Ann Teena Sy who continues to support RCDS**, in memory of Charter member PP Sano Sy.
 - 6) The President reminded the Rotarians of the election of officers scheduled on Dec. 13, to support PE Loloy Baylon during his presidency beginning June 2024.
 - 7) He also reminded about the gift giving-activity on Saturday, Dec. 16 at Friendly Homes in Cadawinonan. Pres. Alex said it would be nice to bring along our kids/grandchildren to help distribute our gifts to each of the 30 families there. From there, he said we will proceed to Victoria's Mountain View in Tanjay for our fellowship activity.
 - 8) For our activities during the Rotary Week celebration in February, Pres. Alex raised the possibility of having Youth Officials from our public and private schools to be "Boy/Girl City Mayor" or "Boy/Girl Provincial Governor" or "Boy/Girl City Councilors" for a week but PP Henry Sojor, who heads the Basic Education & Literacy area of focus team, said the youth already have representation through the Sangguniang Kabataan; so it might be better if we can instead involve the SK in our RCDS activities.
 - 9) As we were relatively a small group on Dec. 6 (with 13 Rotarians in attendance), everyone listened attentively to PP Greg Uymatiao who responded to a curious question from Rtn. Junrex: "What is the TMF?" Rtn. Junrex said the new Rotarians are not so well-versed about the various foundations of the RCDS, and how they could individually fit in and be of service. In a nutshell, PP Greg explained: The TMF is a non-government organization formally incorporated by the RCDS in 1988 in response to the need for NGOs to carry out national government programs during the presidency of Corazon Aquino. As stated in the TMF charter, all members of RCDS are then members of the TMF. The TMF was able to build 42 school buildings during the Aquino administration, and complete other projects in partnership with other international agencies. PP Greg also noted that the government's attitude toward NGOs has changed through the years since the late 80s, in that it is thinking of how NGOs can give money to the government.
 - 10) PP Henry Sojor shared about the case of some NGOs in Negros Oriental which were red-tagged by the military, giving

RCDS PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Finding Gordon McNally



I had another opportunity to learn more about Rotary International, make new Rotarian friends from around the Philippines and Asia, and improve existing friendships during the Rotary Learning Institute in Kaohsiung, Taiwan.

Ann Irma and I arrived at Taoyuan Airport in Taipei about 9 pm Wednesday, and took the high speed rail (their bullet train) to Kaohsiung, some 352 kilometers away. True to its name, traveling at over 300 kilometers per hour, the train took only a little over an hour to get there.

There were many conventions going on during those four days. There was the Governors-Elect Training Seminar (GETS), which DGE Caroline "Caycay" Lee-Andrade and her "classmates" from all 10 Rotary Districts in the Philippines attended. There were also courses for District Governor Nominees and District Trainors.

The conference I signed up for, the Rotary Learning Institute, started on Friday after the GETS, so Ann Irma and I had a free day, and were able to explore Kaohsiung during our first day there, mostly sampling their food delicacies. The New Taiwan dollar is almost two times the value of our peso.

The Philippines was the second largest delegation in that conference, next only to host Taiwan.

Aside from our current RI President Gordon McNally, in attendance were past RI President Mark Maloney (2019-2020) and Past RI President Gary Huang (2014-2015). Also aside from our very own DG Twinkle Gamboa representing the Philippines, present were DGs from other Philippine Rotary Districts, PDGs, DGEs, DGNs, some presidents, PPs, and President-Elect.

The first day of the convention was exciting as everything was a new experience. You couldn't miss Pres. McNally because he is a tall fellow who was always hounded by Rotarians wanting to get a selfie with him. Everywhere he looked, there was someone holding a cellphone

waiting to take that shot -- that he seemed to be in a daze. As I still had a few more days in Kaohsiung, I told myself I will have that photo with Pres. Gordon on another day.

The following day, the spouses went on a tour of Kaohsiung so there were fewer people at the conference. I was looking around for Rotary clubs I could swap banners with. I found the lady Rotarians of the Rotary Club of Taipei Dazhi, and gave them our club bannerette, and they promised to send us one of theirs.

As the day went on, I still could not find a second Club to swap bannerettes with. I was about to leave the hall until I thought, "Why not give this bannerette to Pres. McNally himself?" So I waited for a break in the program where the RI President himself stood up to stretch his legs.

I approached him, waving our RCDS bannerette, and asked if I could give it to him in behalf of our Club.

Our incoming District Sec. Jonathan Tse was already taking a video as I approached our RI President, who was only too happy to receive a club bannerette. And the RI President was also amazed to know that RCDS is the earliest club to meet in the entire world! "Do you still go to sleep?" he jokingly asked.

Not missing a beat, I also asked Pres. Gordon if I could record him greeting the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South. He was only too delighted to do it, and the rest is history -- we are the only Rotary Club throughout the world to get a specialized greeting from the Rotary International President!

I just wished that my lapel microphone worked so that the sound would have been much better.

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.
 A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.
 The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.
 Upon Paul Harris’ death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering “understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations”.
 In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.
 Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.
 The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.

Rotary Factoids

These are my takeaways from the lectures given during the Rotary Learning Institute:

DG Hung Wei, RI District 5170, said a Rotarian is an invisible person who makes a difference in other people's lives. Be a happy person. People don't want to deal with unhappy people. Be a Rotarian for life. Mental health is still a stigma so we should do something to address it. She shared the story of her daughter who took her life due to depression 20 years ago. She said what motivated her to share her experience was the story shared by Pres. Gordon McNally about his own brother, who took his own life at 52 years of age due to depression.

DG Hung said if you ever lose a loved one, they want you to be happy so you have to live a doubly happy life, and carry their happiness into the future.

She quoted a line that said we only die once, but we continue to live every day

Past RI Pres Mark Daniel Maloney talked of the work of the Rotary Foundation. Rotary is supporting efforts to create the vaccine that will rid the world of Malaria, and that we are very close to achieving that.

Dr. Yen-Hsu Tsen of the National Sun Yat Sen University talked of Dengue. He said cases of dengue have registered a 50-fold increase in the past 50 years. There are usually no symptoms as Dengue is 80 percent asymptomatic. Climate change is also responsible for the spread of dengue fever, and that mosquitoes like to live near houses and water areas. He recommends the elimination of breeding sites, such as our 4 o'clock habit here in the Philippines where we look for pools of stagnant water, and drain them so that the mosquitoes are not able to hatch their eggs there. He also called for public education, behavioral changes, and biological control. There are two Dengue vaccines. One is the controversial Dengvaxia made by Sanofi in 2015, which is only effective for children aged between 9-16 who should have been previously infected with dengue, and who live in areas where dengue is common. The second vaccine is Qdenga made by Japanese pharma Takeda, which was approved in Europe in December 2022. This appears to be a better vaccine because this is made for people between 6-45 years old, and is designed for people who have not been previously infected by Dengue. One shot of the vaccine lasts 5-6 years. There is now a third vaccine that is undergoing clinical trials and may be released to the public soon. (*More information next issue*)

11) Rtn. Junrex said there is a need then for the Club to raise money for its activities because it appears that we do not have standby funds, compelling us to contribute *each time* we have a project.

12) Rtn. Nonoy Ligutom stepped up to volunteer to look into our funding sources. He said he noted “so much money” now from the coconut fund, and encouraged the Club to explore/negotiate with the Philippine Coconut Authority. (Rtn. Nonoy was a COCOFED scholar during his student days, and might be able to initiate exploratory talks with the people managing the Coconut Fund and with other funding sources.

Pres. Alex Pal adjourned the meeting at 8:00.
