Minutes of Jan. 3, 2024 meeting:

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:37 a.m.

1) Sec. Ashley Morelos led the invocation. After the Pambansang Awit and the Rotary Hymn, he read the Four-Way Test.

2) There were no guests for PP Boy Diputado to introduce so Rtn. Erp Bustamante led the Rotarians in singing *Love is a Many Splendored Thing*, one of PP Ely Escorial's favorite songs.

Rotary Factoids

One of the areas of focus of Rotary is mental health. Dr. Ya Chun Feng of National Sun Yat Sen University talked of mental health during the recent Rotary Learning Institute in Taiwan. He said 970 million people, or roughly one out of eight persons in the world have mental disorder. That got me thinking that in our Club, using that ratio, we should have at least five Rotarians who have mental disorder (God forbid!). Mental disorder has been identified as the 7th cause of morbidity in the world. It manifests itself in many ways – depression (which is the highest at 3.8 percent, bipolar syndrome, anxiety, schizophrenia and ADHD. Mental disorder come from several factors: genetic, neurobiological, socio-cultural factorssddd Along with the mental health issue is the lost economic productivity loss of a loved o, and the stigma of being mentally sick. The sad fact is that 71 percent of people with psychosis worldwide do not receive mental health services. Stigma is one area that needs to be addressed, What can we do as Rotarians? Dr. Ya recommends that we create a supportive environment, Increase awareness and realities understanding and empathy and anti stigma programs, He recommends that we increase awareness and realities, increase understanding and empathy and anti stigma programs

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations".

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.

RCDS ANNS' CORNER

Counting their blessings

Ann Tita Quimno-Dumalag was born on Jan. 31, 1950 in Oroquieta, Misamis Occidental. Her father, a District supervisor of the Department of Education, and her mother, a public health nurse, were both dedicated to their professions in government.

She graduated from Stella Maris High School, and earned her BS Nursing from Silliman University in 1971; and passed the Nurses Licensure Exam on the same year. In September that year, Ann Tita started her professional nurse journey at the SU Medical Center as staff nurse in the Medical and Surgical departments. By 1972, however, she was asked to be a Clinical Instructor in her Alma Mater. No choice, she thought, because SUCN Dean Roble was also the SUMC director of Nursing Service.

By March 1973, she decided to resign from Silliman, go home to Oroquieta, and wait for her documents for immigrant status for Canada where her brother is based. A day before she left Dumaguete, her former Nursing teacher, Dr. Daisy Magtolis-Dumalag, arranged that Tita first watch the movie *Ben* (popularized by the soundtrack *Ben* by Michael Jackson) with a certain 'Junny Dumalag, former student senator of the SU Student Government'. Tita was thinking that time, "Sorry, I don't know of him even if he was a campus leader....But how could I refuse my former teacher?" So off they went to watch the movie at Ever Theater.

What caught Ann Tita off guard was the next day over dinner at Al Mars Restaurant (the former Don Atilano) just before the send-off to the pier: Rtn. Junny proposed marriage! "I was thinking, amay, gi-short cut ang courtship!"

Tita was 23; Junny was 34. But Rtn. Junny was persistent. When Rtn. Junny eventually got to ask for Ann Tita's hand from her father in Misamis, they received their blessings but were advised to wait for two years. (Long story short, Tita did not send back her application to the Canadian Embassy, and decided instead to stay with Junny.)

Being the dutiful daughter, Ann Tita also heeded her parents' request to work in their Province, so she sought employment as CI at Medina College in Ozamiz City -- working until after their marriage on April 10, 1976 (or six days after his birthday). Rtn. Junny, a mechanical engineer already that time, was invited to work at the Oroquieta municipal government (his first employment ever) and head its City Planning & Development Office, and became the alter-ego of the town mayor.

By 1978, they decided to move back to Dumaguete during their pregnancy with their second child. They lived with Junny's parents, RCDS Charter Member Doming & Consolacion. "It was not that easy to be immersed in a three-generation household, which later became four, but my parents-in-law were kind, generous, and fair, and treated me like their own daughter," Ann Tita recalls.

In 1980, Junny was invited to join RCDS. Tita became president of the Anns in 1982 during the

presidency of PP Joe Nakao; Rtn. Junny became RCDS president in 1987.

They also became active with the Brotherhood of Christian Businessmen & Professionals. Ann Tita became actively involved with the SUCN Alumni Association over the years; and also with the Psi Beta Chapter of Sigma Theta Tau International. In 1981, Ann Tita was invited once again as CI and part-time professor in the undergraduate and graduate programs at SUCN, where she served for the next 33 years until her retirement 10 years ago. She obtained her MA in Nursing (major in Medical-Surgical Nursing) in 1997. During the pandemic, she worked in the Masters program (Adult Health) until 2022. Before she officially retired, Ann Tita was appointed OIC Dean.

To this day, students remember Ann Tita as *stricta*. "I always reminded my students that we are dealing with human lives, and that any error may mean the life of our patients!"

"At 21 until I retired officially in 2014, my life revolved around my work, and my little family." In their retirement years, she said they are blessed to have their own home designed and constructed by their son Gail Raul, a licensed civil engineer, and an Architecture graduate. Their daughter Dianne Angela Vidal earned a Business Administration degree, a Masters in Psychology, and is now a registered nurse in Texas. They are blessed with son Ezra who learned to read at age three.

Now, Ann Tita at 73, and PP Junny at 84, just want to continue counting their blessings: their accomplished children, the opportunity to serve in their respective professions, their travels abroad, their home called Casa Consolacion, Doming's Lodging House (for 40 bedspacers), and of course, serving others through the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South.

Raising a happy family, doing good business

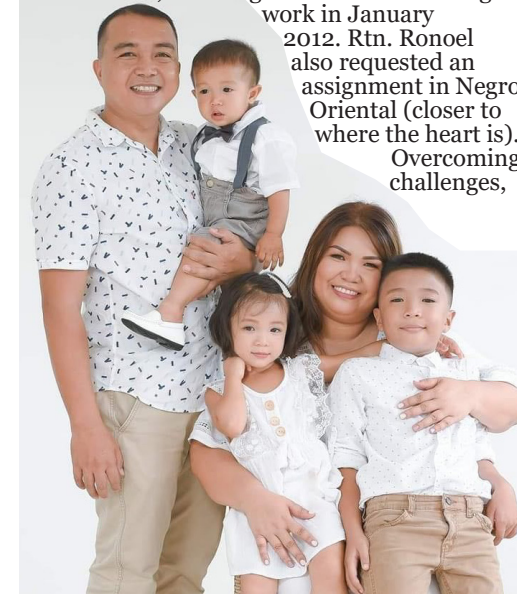

She earned her Bachelor of Nursing from St. Paul University-Dumaguete in March 2007, and passed the licensure board exam three months later. Ann Wendy lost no time in working as a volunteer-nurse at Negros Oriental Provincial Hospital, then later, joined Holy Child Hospital, specializing in the Operating Room, after training.

In April 2010, Wendy met face-to-face her textmate, Ronoel Fungo -- then the commander of the 1st Maneuver Company of the 6th Regional Mobile Group based in Murcia, Negros Occidental -- sparking a long-distance relationship.

Along with their business interests, Ann Wendy & Rtn. Ronoel continued to embrace the responsibilities of parenthood, having welcomed Joaquin in 2013, Maiah in 2018, and Lucas in 2020 amid the pandemic.

Despite the challenges, the couple launched Botica San Lucas in barangay Daro, with the unwavering support from family and friends.
