SECRETARY'S REPORT

Minutes of Jan. 17 meeting:

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:35 a.m.

- 1) Rtn. Randy Quisil led the invocation.
- 2) After the Pambansang Awit and the Rotary Hymn, Rtn. Jake Cayang recited the Four-Way Test.
- 3) PE Loloy Baylon introduced the guests that morning: Robert Duran, a merchant marine who alternately spends two months in Germany and two months in the Philippines; and Matthew Green, a retired psychiatrist from Australia. Rtn. Jun Arnaiz, a Provincial Board Member of Negros Oriental, arrived later on.
- 4) Rtn. Erp Bustamante led the Rotarians in singing a Beatles song *Obladi Oblada*.
- 5) PP Greg Uymatiao was the Fine Master that day.
- 6) **President's Time.** Pres. Alex Pal announced that a proposal for the Korean Rotary grant is being finalized, and will be fine-tuned.
- 7) He also announced that Metro Dumaguete Water is inviting the RCDS to join their **tree planting activity on Saturday, Jan. 27 in Lunga, Valencia.** As agreed, we will assemble at Chin Loong by 6 a.m. We can buy breakfast at Jollibee, and proceed to the Lunga barangay hall by 6:30 am. We are having the tree planting early in the morning so we can be done by 9 a.m.
- 8) For Rotary Week, we will have two activities which will be joined by all Rotary Clubs in Area 3D: the **Medical Mission and other services for Sunday, Feb. 18 for residents of Dobdob, Valencia;** and a **tree planting on Saturday, Feb. 24 in barangay Linogan, Tanjay, followed by a joint fellowship at Victoria's Mountain View.**
- 9) For the Feb. 18 Medical Mission, PE Loloy suggested that RCDS can buy reading glasses for distribution to the beneficiaries after their eye consultations.
- 10) He also suggested for RCDS to provide free haircuts for the men in Dobdob. Sec. Ashley said he will look for barbers to whom we can pay P1,000 for the morning activity.
- 11) PP Allan Martinez will coordinate with particular Rotarians who have 4WD vehicles who could help transport our fellow Rotarians to Dobdob.
- 12) **The RCDS Rotary Anns have offered to help the Club during the career orientation activity that will also be held during Rotary Week in February. They will also help prepare a program with the theme *Empowering Girls*.**
- 13) Pres. Alex reminded the Rotarians to start making plans to attend the District Convention in Davao, which will be held from May 3-5. Registration between now and Feb. 29 is P6,000 for Rotarians and P5,000 for the Spouses.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 am.

Rotary Factoids

A brief history of Rotary

The world’s first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, was formed on 23 February 1905 by Paul P. Harris, an attorney who wished to recapture in a professional club the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth.

The name “Rotary” derived from the early practice of *rotating meetings among members’ offices*. Rotary’s popularity spread throughout the US in the decade that followed; clubs were chartered from San Francisco to New York. By 1921, Rotary clubs had been formed on six continents, and the organization adopted the name Rotary International a year later.

As Rotary grew, its mission expanded beyond serving the professional and social interests of club members. Rotarians began pooling their resources, and contributing their talents to help serve communities in need. The organization’s dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its principal motto: *Service above Self*.

Rotary also later embraced a code of ethics, called *The 4-Way Test*, that has since been translated into hundreds of languages.

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations".

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.
